Homes for Horses Ready for Adoption Meet "Ebony"



Her registered name is Robin's Ebony Angel.

She stands 14.2hh and she is a pure black horse, not one hair of white on her anywhere.

Ebony will require an **advanced rider and some in-depth retraining.**

Ebony has had thirty days with our trainer. She responded well, but there is far to go. This horse needs a rider who understands that she has been abused in the past and will be patient with her needs until she grows to trust her owner completely. Two of our teen rehabilitation riders were on her last night with absolutely no problems.

Residents of Kansas and surrounding states are being cautioned about a contagious viral disease that affects horses and livestock and can sometimes affect humans.

Legislative Update

On June 18, 2014, the National Forest System Trails Stewardship Act (H.R. 4886), was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Cynthia Lummis (R-WY) and Tim Walz (D-MN). The bill, would go a long way toward addressing the trail maintenance backlog on our national forests.

If enacted as currently written, HR 4886 would:

- Direct the U.S. Forest Service to develop a strategy to more effectively utilize volunteers and partners to assist in maintaining national forest trails;
- Provide outfitters and guides the ability to pay permit fees in trail maintenance activities instead of dollars;
- Address the liability issue that hampers volunteer and partner trail maintenance activity in some national forests; and
- Prioritize specific areas for trail maintenance within national forests.

Take Action!

Please call or write your member of Congress in the House of Representatives to express your support for HR 4886. As a result of widespread bipartisan interest, the bill could sail through the House of Representatives if no controversial provisions or requests for new appropriations are added.

Go to this website to find contact information for your member of Congress. In your own words, tell your representative that you support HR 4866, the National Forest System Trails Stewardship Act. Tell them of your passion for, and commitment to, keeping national forest trails open and enjoyed by horsemen and others. Lastly, please ask them to consider co-sponsoring HR 4886

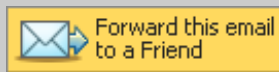

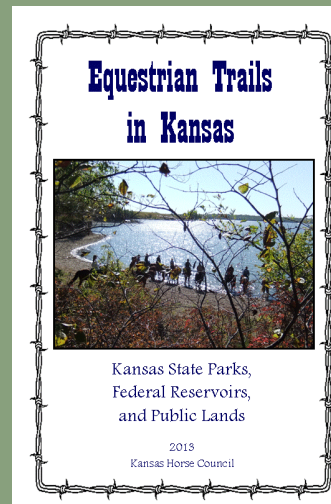
