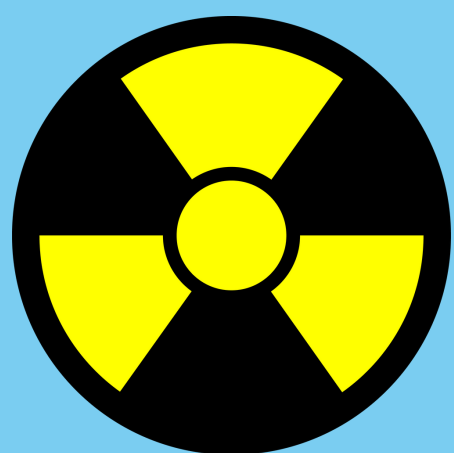

NUCLEAR DISASTERS

We talked this month about nuclear disasters and the way to respond in such an event. It is important to get inside, stay inside and monitor the news for updates. EVACUATION READINESS

Many disasters may necessitate your evacuation. The best way to be prepared for this is to have a bag ready to go - a go-bag. This bag should include food, medication and supplies to get you through at least 72 hours. It should also include your important documents - birth certificates, marriage licenses, house deeds, insurance documents, etc...



BEE STINGS

Bee (and other insect) stings are common in the summertime. Knowing what to do can help you or your family heal more quickly. They are also very common allergies. Knowing how to respond appropriately can mean the difference between life or death.
