McDonough County Real Estate Tax Bills

The McDonough County Real Estate Tax Bills were all mailed on Wednesday, May 1, 2024. If you have not received your tax bill in approximately 10 days, please contact the McDonough County Treasurer's Office (309) 833-2032 and we can make arrangements to mail a duplicate tax bill. If you have an address change, please contact the McDonough County Supervisor of Assessments Office (309) 833-5305 and update that record.

The due dates for the real estate tax bills for 2023 payable in 2024 is Friday, June 7, 2024 for the first installment and Friday, September 6, 2024 for the second installment.

You may pay your real estate tax bill at most of the banks in McDonough County through the date of the second installment. You must take your tax bill with the attached tax stubs with you to pay at the bank. You may also pay in person at the McDonough County Treasurer's Office, by mail, the silver drop-box located on the sidewalk on the southside of the Courthouse (tax stub with check in sealed envelope), or online payments with a credit/debit card on the county website: mcg.mcdonough. il.us and choose the County Treasurer and read and follow the directions. Please note that payments made after 4pm at the dropbox are on the next business day.
