#### **Pastor's Reflection**

September is upon us, and with September comes new beginnings. For children, it is a new year of school. For many, it means a new job or assignment. For others, it means the restart of programs, or volunteer activities. Summer means taking a break and with September comes business as usual. Or so we have been trained. What if we were to re-envision the end of Summer. Homecoming Sunday is so seared into our brains that it becomes almost rote. Preparing for the luncheon, for the start of Sunday School, and more committee meetings. What if instead we were to see Homecoming Sunday as the lines that lead back home. As just one way we as a church continually come to God in our work, worship, and fellowship marked as a body of believers called to love and nurture others. How do we as a church embody our coming back to God?

In Revelation 7:9, John writes of his continued vision, "After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people, and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches I their hands." For the Apostle John, Homecoming is a very serious, and large event. This is not just one church or one people group or one nation. This is a diverse gathering of all those who proclaim God's Salvation. Their attire signifies that their task is pure. Their palm

To make Homecoming truly an event where we encounter and follow the lines God has placed before us that lead back home.

Now that we have the greater vision in mind, that Homecoming is larger, more inclusive, more genuine, and deeper in God's love and grace that we can ever know in this lifetime, we accept the task of living it out in this lifetime. Our Homecoming might not seem grand in comparison, but in God's eyes, it is both pleasing and good. As we worship in joy and adoration. As we work to help others and bring hope to the hopeless. As we fellowship in understanding and love. What we must do now is live out practical ways of Homecoming in our personal and communal lives.

The words from the Apostle Paul in Romans 12:9-13 (NRSV) give us practical habits to participate in, lines if you will that lead us back home. "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers."

While practicing all of these seems overwhelming, picking a few to work on and to get better at can become a start for all of us as we enter sincerely back into our church and into the family that we find ourselves in that we weren't born into but adopted into by God. Practice love, or hope, or perseverance. Help others who need your help. As we celebrate Homecoming, do what you can to bring joy in times of joy and patient presence in times of disorder. May God be with us as we, First Presbyterian Church of Rockaway, enter this season of Homecoming, eyes on the eternal kingdom. Amen.

Many thanks to the guys (Ken, Rich, Larry and Ryon) for completing a huge project that adds to the beauty of our historic building!




