Α	What is "clearing?	"CLEARING" as defined in our Grading Ordinance is the removal or destruction of natural vegetation by any means, including brushing and grubbing.	Section 87.803(5), County Grading Ordinance http://www.sdcounty.ca.gov/dpw/land/)
В	How much can I clear on my property?	If the land is outside of the existing County Multiple Species Conservation Program (MSCP) which covers the southwestern portion of the County, up to 5 acres can be cleared without a permit when associated with an existing dwelling. If the land is within the existing MSCP, residential land (developed or vacant) up to 5 acres in size that is outside the Pre-Approved Mitigation Area (PAMA) can be cleared without a permit. Residential land (developed or vacant) up to 2 acres in size that is inside PAMA can be cleared without a permit. Clearing in excess of these limits is allowed with an approved Administrative Brushing and Clearing Permit from Department of Planning and Land Use (DPLU). С	Regardless to "B" above, can I clear brush around structures on my property for fire protection without a permit?	Yes. You may clear up to 100' from any improvement on your property as defined under Section 68.402 of the County Weed Abatement Ordinance without a permit. Depending upon fuel loads and topography, the Local Fire District may require additional clearing. This additional clearing does not require a permit so long as you have a letter from the Local Fire District specifying the amount of additional clearing required. D	Can I clear for fire protection within an existing open space easement without a permit?	Yes, in conformance with "C" above. Clearing for anything other than fire is typically prohibited; consult your open space easement language for clearing specifications. E	Can I remove habitat or natural vegetation that was burned in the wildfires and/or reseed/plant within open space areas burned in the wildfires?	Yes, in conformance with A through C above. Wildfires are a natural part of the ecosystem and removal of any ash or debris may also remove important seeds or roots that are needed in order for the natural area to restore itself. Natural vegetation is best for erosion control. As such, burnt vegetation not specified in A thorough C should remain untouched. F	Can I clear natural habitat for new agricultural land without a permit?	Yes, as long as it is in conformance with A above. Furthermore, clearing in excess of these limits is allowed with an approved Administrative Brushing and Clearing Permit from Department of Planning and Land Use (DPLU). Please contact the DPLU Zoning Information Counter, at (858) 565-5981 and ask to speak to the Department Agricultural Liaison. F	Can I grade my site as part of my clearing efforts without a permit?	Only minor grading is allowed without a grading permit; Please review the Section 87.206 of the County Grading Ordinance for grading limitations. Grading in excess of these limits is allowed with an approved Grading Permit. ^{2,3}	Section 87.206, Grading Ordinance http://www.sdcounty.ca.gov/dpw/land/)
