### Generosity

Are you a giver or taker? In his book "Give and Take: Why Helping Others Drives Success," Adam Grant, a University of Pennsylvania Wharton School of Management professor, describes three key mindsets of people in the workplace.

Grant's research found that there are some that act like "takers" at work. Their behaviors are more selfish and include actions like blaming others, using more "I" and "me" words than their co-workers, focusing on individual achievement, and working with a negative and entitled attitude. His research also showed that "givers" thrive when working within a group or team setting. They look for ways to help others and are more giving with their time and energy. This helps create a positive environment where everyone thrives. The third group are the "matchers." This group reciprocates how they are treated. Matchers follow the norm of the culture that is created by the other two groups. They act like givers when with givers and takers when with takers.

This study highlights how powerful a culture can be and how behaviors can create momentum toward or away from a positive culture in the home, work, and even in the Church. Paul said it best when he said in 2 Corinthians 9:6-8, "<sup>6</sup> The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Feach one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work."

This holiday season as we both give and receive, let us not lose sight of the importance of generosity in our lives that surpasses the holiday season. Create a culture of generosity that will positively impact the lives of others for Christ as well as your own.





# What I Love About Being a Christian

I love being a child of the King! Why?

First, Christians have a family. God designed the physical family in the paradise of Eden (cf. Genesis 2:7; 18). Most of us enjoy that blessing from God. In the New Testament, God gave us a second family—relationships with other church members. If our physical family fails us, especially, God has given us the substitute of a family in Christ (cf. Mark 10:29–30). Christians love to sing of this truth:

We're part of the family, that's been born again, Part of the family, whose love knows no end, For Jesus has saved us, and made us His own, Now we're part of the family that's on its way home!

Second, Christians have a function. Our foremost purpose in life is to bring glory to our Father (cf. Matthew 5:16; 1 Peter 2:12). Therefore, our aim is to do "in word or deed" all we do by the authority of Jesus Christ (cf. Colossians 3:17; Acts 4:7–10). Our speech (Colossians 4:6), attitudes (Philippians 2:1–5), clothing (1 Timothy 2:9 –10; 1 Peter 3:3–4), and daily work (Colossians 3:22) should reflect Jesus (1 Peter 2:21; 1 John 2:6).

Third, Christians have a future. Those in Christ have a wonderful future no matter what their situation today. God's Book affirms that the Christian's future is bright (Luke 10:20; 1 Peter 1:1–9; Romans 6:22). Truly, I know not what tomorrow holds, but I know who holds tomorrow!
