

#### GOD AND RUBIK'S CUBE



As a child of the 80's I had a lot of fun with a puzzle named Rubik's Cube, and have been humbled by its mystery. It is a lot more complicated than it appears, and it can be used to demonstrate some profound truths about God.

From the cube a person can gain a little insight into the length of eternity. Because of its six colors and 54 small

squares, mathematicians have calculated that there are over forty-three quintillion (actually 43,252,003,274,489,865,000) different patterns that can be arranged on one cube. WOW!!!

Think about that. Suppose that you could arrange a thousand patterns every second on your cube, and that you could continue at this rate without stopping for anything. Even with 30 million seconds in a year, it would take a thousand million years to see them all. That's a long time to spend in Heaven or hell!

Because of this, from the cube, a person can appreciate how ridiculous it is to assume that the universe came into being by chance. Would you believe that a guy named Erno Rubik was walking by a plastic factory in Hungary one day when a great chemical explosion hurled out this unique little cube with all the colors matching on each side? No way.

So, even if we don't solve the cube, we can at least appreciate these two lessons. First, the cube is the work of an intelligent creator. Second, the universe is the work of our God. As an interesting side note. In 2010, it was proven that the Rubik's Cube can be solved in 20 moves from any scrambled position. This formula is known as "God's Algorithm," Hum!


