THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP

I once read a sermon called "Time in the Trenches" by Jeff Strite. In that sermon he shared a story about a young man who'd just been called up to go to Iraq. The problem was the young soldier didn't want to go. He said that he hadn't joined the army to go to fight in a war. He'd joined because of the benefits: the pay, the insurance, the college tuition through the G.I. Bill, etc.

What's wrong with that kind of thinking? Well, first the primary function of the military is to prepare soldiers for war. You've got to know that if you sign up! I'm sure it's somewhere in the job description. Armies do NOT exist to pass out benefits (those are perks). Armies exist to deal with conflicts, to defend their people, to fight the enemy, and hopefully to contend against evil, but there are people who join up hoping for a free ride. That kind of mentality undermines the military of any nation.

That same kind of mentality can also undermine the church. Too often believers sign up for the benefits. They expect Jesus to "be there" for them, but they don't expect to "be there" for Him. That's the issue Jesus is addressing in Matthew 16. He is explaining to His disciples that they're part of His army. He has called them to war, and there's a decision to be made. Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it." Matthew 16:24-25

A Special Welcome to our Guests!


We are glad to have you visiting with us today! You are welcome here. We know you have a choice of where to worship, and you chose to be with us today — thank you.





Jesus Loves Me

Around 1860, Anna B. Warner penned the following words that were later extended and set to music by William B. Bradbury and continue to be sung around the world:

Jesus loves me—this I know, / For the Bible tells me so:

Little ones to him belong— / They are weak, but he is strong.

Yes, Jesus loves me, / Yes, Jesus loves me, Yes, Jesus loves me, / The Bible tells me so.

While often considered a children's Bible School song, these words are nevertheless profound. When Karl Barth (1886–1968), the famous Swiss theologian, visited the United States in 1962 and lectured at Princeton Theological Seminary and the University of Chicago, he was asked to summarize all the millions of words he had written. He is reported to have thought for a moment and then replied, "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so."

God's love for sinful humanity is the Bible's theme. At the heart of the gospel is God's gift of Jesus Christ to all the world as the atoning sacrifice for sin. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). The tremendous truth expressed here in what has often been called the Golden Text of the Bible is reiterated throughout the pages of the New Testament. Consider the following:

"God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).
