You Don't Meme It!

What is a "meme"? It is defined as "a unit of cultural information spread by imitation. The term meme (from the Greekmimema, meaning "imitated") was introduced in 1976 by British evolutionary biologist Richard Dawkins in his work The Selfish Gene." For most of us it is known as a humorous image, video, piece of text, etc., that is copied and spread rapidly by social media users. Because most of my social media friends are "believers", I see many memes that have spiritual connotations. These memes may contain a bit of scripture or a feel good proverb or saying and at first glance seem to be comforting and inspiring. However, many times, a closer examination of many of these memes may reveal an error, falsehood or a lie when compared to the inspired scriptures. Just because something sounds good and gives us a warm and fuzzy feeling doesn't make it right. Remember, man's wisdom, no matter how good it sounds is not God's wisdom (Isaiah 55:9; Philippians 3:17-19).

John wrote, "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world." (1 John 4:1). It is our responsibility to take care that we don't spread false doctrine on our social media accounts and cautiously consider the memes that we share. We must be vigilant and aware of the influence we may have on others who may not be as familiar with the scriptures.



April 8 is the solar eclipse day. A total solar eclipse happens when the Moon passes between the Sun and



Earth completely blocking the face of the Sun. The sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk. For us on April 8, 2024 the solar eclipse will be around 12:44-3:20 with 95% blockage around 2:03.

Some people wonder if this is what occurred when Jesus was on the cross Matt. 27:45 "Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour." I think we often want to explain how things happen in the bible, rather than believing God just made it happen. The time would have been noon to 3PM. Putting God Before You

"I have set the Lord always before me; Because He is at my right hand I shall not be moved" (Psalms 16:8).

A powerful lesson we learn from this text is if we put God before us we will not be moved or shaken. If God is first in our decisions, thoughts, and actions then our way will be secure. Notice how this is such a practical lesson.

If God comes first in my decisions, then I will want to seek His will. I will ask, "What does God say about this matter?" I must strive to only do what God tells me (Luke 6:46; Matt. 7:21; Jer. 37:17). To put God first in my decisions I must know His Word. Jesus said the truth would make us free (John 8:32; John 17:17). Paul encouraged us to study God's word to be approved by Him (2 Tim. 2:15). How does someone put God before himself in every day decisions if he does not know God's will? He cannot. Therefore, it is imperative for me to study God's Word so that I can make godly decisions.

If I am going to put God before me, I must put His will into my thoughts. Paul taught us to bring every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ (2 Cor. 10:3-5). Christians must think on godly and upright things (Phil. 4:6-8). The only way we can put God into our thoughts is to put His righteousness into our minds. The Psalmists said, "Your Word I have hidden in my heart that I might not sin against You" (Psalm 119:10-12). In every situation we should ask, "How would the Lord want me to think?"

When we truly put God into our decisions and thoughts then we can have safety. The Psalmists proclaimed, "He is at my right hand I shall not be moved" (Psalm 16:8). The only way we can proclaim the same today is if God is at our right hand in everything we do. Have you put God before *you*? If you are not a Christian, we would encourage you to obey the gospel. To become a Christian you must Hear God's word (Rom. 10:17), believe in Jesus as God's Son (John 8:24), repent of past sins (Luke 13:3), confess Jesus as the Son of God (Rom. 10:10), and be baptized for the remission of your sins (Acts 2:38). May God help each of us to put Him before us!
