

DE LUZ MEN MEET TO CONFER ON HIGHWAY

Urge That It Could Be Built at
Small Expense With
Little Trouble.

SUBMIT PLANS FOR ROUTE

Chamber of Commerce Mem-
bers Regard Enterprise
Favorably.

Escondido, Oct. 28.—Nine of the fifteen directors of the chamber of commerce were present Friday evening at a special meeting of the board to confer with representatives of the people of De Luz, who wish to secure the construction of the state highway through De Luz, a prosperous valley in the Oceanside country, which terminates near the De Luz station on the Fallbrook branch of the Santa Fe railway.

The De Luz people favor the construction of a highway from the northern boundary of the county, a point near Elsinore, thence southward, west of Fallbrook, to De Luz, a settlement down the De Luz valley, and thence across the country to a connection with the county highway at or near Bonsal, on the San Luis Rey river. Bonsal would be the connecting point with the county highway, which now passes out of the county at Rainbow, and the route of which is being changed to pass through Fallbrook. This route in the past has lain to the east of Fallbrook.

The people of De Luz urge that a highway could be built through their section at small expense and that it would open up a large area of important country, besides being the most direct route for a trunk highway through the state.

The directors of the chamber listened with interest to these claims and commended the people for their enterprise and, as the result of the conference, a committee of three was appointed to visit De Luz for the purpose of investigating the proposition in behalf of the chamber. The committee consisted of two of the directors, W. L. Ramey, vice president; J. N. Turrentine, and the secretary, J. H. Heath. The trip will probably be made in the coming week.

The De Luz people who journeyed to Escondido to urge the claims of the section were Mrs. W. M. Regan, J. E. Grode, J. Regan and H. Orvis.

It is said that claims of the De Luz people have the indorsement of Supervisor Westfall of the fifth supervisory district.

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
