

FAVOR AUTOMOBILE ROAD VIA DE LUZ

DE LUZ, Oct. 22.—C. D. Hagerman and other public spirited citizens of this community north and west of Oceanside, are in the field for the construction of an automobile road between Murietta, Riverside county and Oceanside by the way of De Luz, thereby creating another roadway between San Diego and Riverside counties. A meeting for the consideration of the good roads problem, with particular reference to this section of the county, has been called for the school house at De Luz, Sunday, Oct. 28, and to which a cordial invitation is extended. It will be a basket picnic affair, with the people of De Luz as hosts.

The matter of securing an automobile road between Murietta and Oceanside via De Luz was first brought to the attention of the Chamber of Commerce of Northern San Diego County at the meeting of the directors in Oceanside September 3, being presented by Mr. Hagerman. It was again taken up by the directors at the meeting in Ramona October 20, when resolutions favoring the project were adopted.

Referring to the enterprise Mr. Hagerman says: "There is no question but that this road would add greatly to the auto travel to and from San Diego county and thereby benefit all either directly or indirectly, and that it should be opened up as soon as the finances of the county will permit. We want to get it under way at once by having the necessary preliminary work done.

"I am a firm believer in good roads everywhere, and especially automobile roads, which will attract and stimulate tourist travel by automobile. Travelers by automobile for pleasure spend money and ultimately invest in some locality in this part of the country. By attracting and holding this class is the very quickest way of building up the country, as I look at it, and I know that such work is one of the main objects of the Chamber of Commerce of Northern San Diego County."

Word from Riverside county is to the effect that the supervisors, at their last meeting, appointed viewers to look over the proposition and report upon its practicability and cost.
