

FERTILE DE LUZ LANDS TO BE MADE ACCESSIBLE

Attractive Section Handicapped for Years by Lack of Transportation Facilities, Working Hard for New Highway; Chamber Officials Participate in Mass Meeting.

DE LUZ, Nov. 17.—Handicapped for twenty-five years, when the first of its fertile lands was opened up to settlement, through lack of adequate transportation facilities, De Luz, twenty miles north of Oceanside, is encouraged to believe that it is on the eve of obtaining relief by the beginning of work which will result in the construction of a good dirt automobile road through the beautiful canyon from the Riverside county system of paved roads at Murietta to the state highway at Oceanside, a distance of about thirty-four miles.

As the result of a mass meeting held in the schoolhouse at De Luz, presided over by C. D. Hagerman, and with Miss Chatterson, teacher of the school, as secretary, participated in by four of the officials of the Chamber of Commerce of Northern San Diego county—Directors M. W. Spencer of Oceanside, Thomas Hurley of Bonsall and James T. Van Rensselaer of Fallbrook, and by Secretary J. H. Heath of Escondido, Supervisor G. F. Westfall has agreed to devote \$1000 of the present year's road funds of the fifth district in the preliminary work incident to the opening of a temporary road from De Luz south to a connection with the county road running through a portion of the Santa Margarita ranch.

Will Open Many Acres

The pledge is made with the understanding that rights-of-way for the permanent road are secured and that the people of De Luz

lend a hand in the matter of a generous amount of co-operative work.

It is proposed that the new section of road down the canyon shall pass along the west side for several miles, thence across the mesa to a connection with the county's \$50,000 bridge over the Santa Margarita river at Chappo, and from there over the private road maintained by the owners of the Santa Margarita ranch to a connection with the state highway a mile above the city of Oceanside, and with the county highway running through the ranch to a connection with the Oceanside-Bonsall road near the San Luis Rey mission.

The proposed road will give the people of De Luz Santa Fe Railway connection near the Santa Margarita ranch house, outlets at Murietta and Oceanside and is expected to result in the opening of many acres of desirable agricultural and horticultural property. It will also afford easy access to the famous De Luz hot springs, and the establishment of a health and camping resort which will redound to the credit of San Diego county.

O'Neill to Assist

Riverside county has already built a section of the road and its supervisors have appointed viewers to act with the county surveyor of that county in locating the route for the remainder. For the portion of the road in San Diego county De Luz will formally ask the supervisors for the appointment of L. J. Garnsey, postmaster, and D. Tiffany, viewers, to assist County Surveyor George Butler in surveying and other work.

Jerome O'Neil, one of the owners of the Santa Margarita ranch, through many acres of which the proposed road will pass, has signified his willingness to assist the people of De Luz in solving their road problem, and assurances of important support have been received from many sources.

The good roads mass meeting at De Luz followed the serving of an elaborate basket picnic lunch under the shade trees of the schoolhouse grounds, by the women of De Luz.
