HURLEY RESENTS CULVERT REQUEST

Tells Johnson to Mind Own Business After Getting Stuck in River Crossings.

The written suggestion of James Hervey Johnson, county assessor, that the county board of supervisors install three or four large culverts where a county road crosses the Santa Margarita river which runs into the De Luz area, yesterday drew a sharp reply from Tom Hurley, chairman of the board of representatives of the fifth district in which the crossing is located.

Johnson said he was stuck in mid-stream twice recently, while crossing and recrossing the stream, because mud had settled on the rock and cement.

"There seems to have been a misunderstanding by the road foreman and the supervisor in charge that the cost of building such a crossing would be excessive," wrote Johnson.

"I move that a letter be written to Johnson telling him that the supervisor of the fifth district is perfectly willing and able to put in the culverts when funds are available," said Hurley; "and that if he would take as good care of his office as he does of my district we wouldn't have so many difficulties."
