State education law requires that a school must have an average daily attendance of at least five students in order to remain open.

The De Luz School has the smallest number of pupils in San Diego County.

Three families—the Bow-

ers, the McManuses and the Brains, contributed the enrollees. The children, ages 6 to 10, are in the first to fifth grades. The Bowerses are twins Carolyn and Marilyn, 9, and Kathy, 8. The McManuses are Erin, 6, Daniel, 8, and Jim, 10. The Brains are Dorothy, 6, and Riley, 10.

De Luz and Spencer Valley have the only one-school districts in the county, the county education department revealed.
