

WHO WILL BE DE LUZ-ER?

Two Women Against a Town

DE LUZ — Two Clicks have shattered the quiet of this remote mountain village.

They are Mrs. Alma F. Click, 93, and her daughter, Miss Veria Click, 73.

The two self-reliant women have the normally peaceful village in an uproar. Lines are being drawn for a court battle.

The De Luz School District has sued the mother and daughter for \$100 damages and accused them of trespass.

A hearing will be held April 17 in the school

against which they are accused of trespassing.

Superior Court Judge Clarence H a r d e n ordered the hearing held in the school when the mother and daughter said their age and health prevents travel to the San Diego County Courthouse.

The school district wants the pair to stop using the school grounds as an entry to their property. The Clicks contend they are tax-paying owners and have a right to use the school property.

The school board said the women leave the

gates open, permitting campers and picnickers to use and abuse the grounds.

A school spokesman said the district granted the Clicks a 15-by-53-foot easement in 1932 to use a strip of school property that abuts the Click's property.

"They refused to keep it cleared or to use it," the school representative said.

According to Veria Click, the school ground is the only access to the Click home.

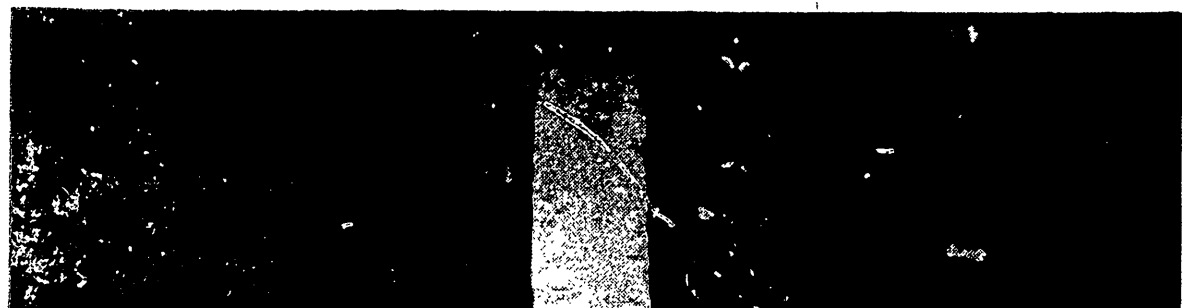

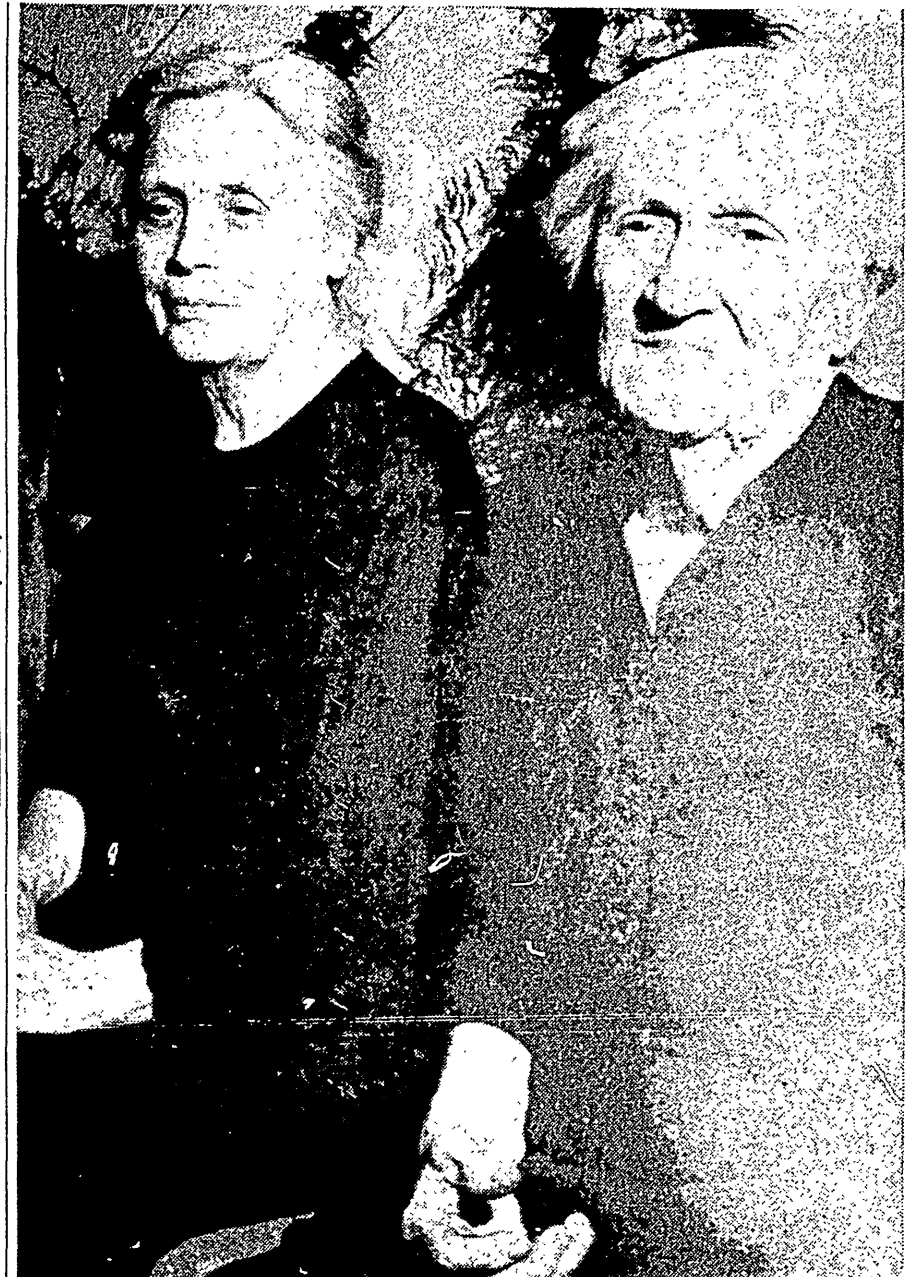
