VOLUNTEER CORNER

Trail Care Day — October 7, 2023

In October, Pinchot Park held its annual collaborative trail improvement work day with **Keystone Trails Association**, **Mason-Dixon Trail System**, and **Friends of Pinchot State Park**. This year, the group of 12 volunteers and 3 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (**DCNR**) staff members focused on the Beaver Creek Trail/Mason-Dixon Trail section located between Boat Mooring #1 and Squire Gratz Road.

Activities included trimming back much overgrown, hiker-traffic-impeding vegetation, reinforcing the high traffic trail bed sections as well as the trailhead parking area with gravel, and repairing multiple sections of wooden boardwalks that traverse particularly wet sections of trail. A small footbridge was also repaired to improve hiker safety.

Sustainability Project

The Quaker Race Sustainability Project is underway! Construction at Quaker Race Day Use Area began this past summer and will continue into 2024. The project accomplishments to date include completion of a new roof on the concession building and the planting of trees and rain gardens for lake shoreline erosion control. The final phase, installation of new, solar canopies over the parking areas and installation of underground

electrical lines will resume this spring.



8-hour work days!


