
Thus, our 3-year Strategic Plan for 2021-2024 stands on 4 strategic pillars:

Inviting Children Into Reading...


To become readers, children must be invited into reading with inclusive literacy materials, ones that welcome, celebrate, intrigue, and comfort all children. Books, in particular, must serve as "windows, mirrors, and sliding glass doors" for children to see themselves, to see others different from themselves, and to recognize that they have access to the paths they want in life.

Yet we know that children's books published in the U.S. have never been inclusive of all our young readers.




