If you're a city dweller, take an excursion out into the country on a cloudless, smogless night; look up and see millions of shiny stars, remembering that each star has its own planets with creatures that were created to subsist and operate under laws formulated for their own unique planet.



But the Creator also made a planet called Earth in our Galaxy especially for "Friendship". [Colossians 1:15-19].
