#### MORE ABOUT SEED SAVING

SEEDS TO COLLECT IN FALL: cosmos, marigold, morning glory, zinnia, garlic chive, basil, dill Remove extraneous plant material so that seeds will dry well. Always store seeds in envelopes or paper bags. Label should include flower color and variety name (if known), average height, year collected. Keep seeds dry and cool. Most seeds are viable for about 2-5 years, but some herbs, onions, and chives may be viable for only 1 year after harvest.
