





## **RUSSELL STONE PRODUCTS**

We are now entering the winter season and in certain regions in our country they will experience extreme freeze and thaw conditions. Hopefully, our 2022 winter is milder then in the past. We felt this was a good time to talk about our stones durability and how it has withstood countless winter conditions in its history.

The quarry that Russell Stone operates has been in existence since the early 1800's. It has been operated by various owners and at times inactive, but one thing is certain the stone from the quarry has a longevity that last hundreds of years. The first picture is from the Presbyterian Church in Clearfield that was constructed in 1869




The entrance to the church and the sign datelining its construction. The church is 150 years old, still in service and the stone still looks to be in remarkable condition.



The Rockville bridge in Harrisburg was constructed and completed in 1902 by the Pennsylvania railroad. It took 800 workers 2 years to build. It is constructed

of approximately 220,000 tons of Bloom Run and Roaring Run Sandstone . The bridge is standing in a minimum of 20 feet of water and has withstood freeze and thaw conditions for over 100 years and is still active today.



On a daily basis sometimes there are up to 10 trains that cross and utilize the bridge. As of today no rehab has ever been done to the structure in regard to the stone.






The Clearfield County jail was erected in 1822. It is still standing today and was recently purchased to be the home of a new distillery. It has been part of the Clearfield community for almost 200 years.




The emblem shows the date of the construction of the jail.

The Methodist Church in Curwensville was constructed between 1860 and 1893. Pennsylvania is known for its freezing and thawing conditions. This church is over 126 years old and is still active and a big part of the local community.
