

Further Description of Important Features The foundation is of reinforced concrete, and the exterior stone walls are of variegated gray, cream, pink and dark red stone, brought from six different quarries, at St. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau, Missouri and Boulder and Lyons, Colorado, mixed with local St. Louis limestone and bedford trim. The gable slate roof is a graded thick slate in warm green and purple tones.</p>		<p>Photo</p>
<p>43. History and Significance In 1924 this church purchased three lots for \$17,000 from the Cyrus C. Wilmore Organization, Inc., who were the developers of University Hills. This was the fourth site of this church and the first and oldest protestant church founded in St. Louis. The first building was located at Fourth Street and Washington. This church was occupied from 1825-1855. The second site was located at Fourteenth Street and Locust Street, and was occupied until 1888. The third building was located at Washington Boulevard and Sarah Street, occupied from 1888-1927.</p>
