

french doors. The second floor contains an oriel window (3 sided) situated above the entrance. This window unit is highlighted with diamond-shaped panes. The right bay (second floor) contains a paired double-hung window. The remaining windows are single, double-hung windows with eight-over-one lights. These windows are highlighted with a brick soldier course belt course that outlines cornice and gables. The center gable is decorated with a stone parapet at peak. A gabled dormer pierces through the front slope near the middle right bay. A chimney is located on east facade at ridge.


Early directory listings show that Russell A. Conzelman (c 1895 - ?) worked for the State Department as a rodman (1913), worked for a sign company as a draftsman (1914-15), and at City Hall (1916-17). From 1918-21, he was listed as a civil engineer for various companies. He was listed as an architect during the period between 1920-1931. During the 1930's and 1940's, Conzelman worked for an auto rim lock company and the FHA until after the war, when he then resumed his architectural career for several years. Conzelman is credited with at least three houses in University Hills: 7301 Teasdale (1929), 7348 Kingsbury (1931) and 7356 Teasdale (1931), all executed in the popular Tudor Revival Style.

The second floor contains a three-sectional casement window (leaded square panes) with transoms. The right bay contains a large street-facing gable decorated with half-timbering (with brick infill) at gable end. The first floor contains a two-sectional casement window with transoms and sidelights. The second floor contains a three-sectional casement window with transoms (leaded square panes). A chimney is located on west facade on front slope.

The second story windows contain four double-hung windows (with nine-over-nine lights). The right bay (second story) contains a paired double-hung window with nine-over-nine lights. A chimney bisects the front facade between the right and middle bays. A one-story, hipped roof wing is positioned on the east facade. The casement windows form a band around this bay. Additions on the west facade forms an L-shaped plan.


Glasgow was also residing at this address. Roy S. was an instructor at Washington University. The fifth and current owners, Melvin B. and Kathy Kirstein were residing at this address by 1953. Melvin was a physician, with offices located at 950 Francis Place according to directories.

This house was speculatively built by the Howard Godwin Realty Company who developed over a half-dozen properties in University Hills. This realty company acted as both the architect and the contractor. Examples of their work are 501 Overhill (1929), 7229 Kingsbury (1929), 7233 Kingsbury (1929), 7251 Kingsbury (1929), 7217 Teasdale (1926), 421 Midvale (1929), and 427 Midvale (1929).





Nolte & Nauman was an architectural firm consisting of Edward F. Nolte (1870-1944) and Fred Nauman. This firm designed more houses in University Hills than any other. Nolte opened his own office in 1896. He designed medium-sized houses, flats, and apartments during his earlier years including five houses in Parkview in partnership with Preston Bradshaw. Fred Nauman, who had previously worked as Nolte's draftsman, joined the firm as a partner around 1913. continued in this partnership for twenty years. Nolte continued to practice alone until 1941. In University Hills, this firm primarily designed medium-sized dwellings (with high concentrations on Midvale, Warren and Purdue) which were commissioned by various real estate and investment companies. The larger houses that this firm designed in partnership with the George Bergfeld Real Estate Company (who commissioned Nolte & Nauman quite often) are 7260 Creveling (1926), 7281 Greenway (1927), 7257 Greenway (1928), 7228 Greenway (1930), 7272 Greenway (1927). Examples of their partnership can be seen in many of the middle-to-upper-class neighborhoods in the St. Louis Area.





was a teacher at the Central Institute for the Deaf in St. Louis. The fifth owners, Jacques and Susan J. Robinson, were residing at this address by 1979. Jacques was an executive manager for American Investments.

Little is known about the architect T. L. Johnson, although he

designed many of the larger houses in University Hills. Johnson was listed as an architect as early as 1917 in county directories. He was building commissioner of University City during the period of 1919-1921. His home and office was at 6925 Columbia, in University Heights No. 1. On the whole, Johnson acted as the architect as well as the contractor for his projects. He was commissioned by Cyrus Willmore Crane, developer of University Hills to design his home at 7228 Creveling (1925) and John Higginbotham (7275 Kingsbury), one of the three original trustees, who was also vice-president of the Cyrus Willmore Crane Organization, Inc., one of the largest land developer firms at that time. Many of Johnson's designs were executed in the English Tudor style, which perhaps set the prevalent trend of this private subdivision.


