Imagine Peace Barriers Project Report Interface Incidents

Anti-social behaviour, sectarian incidents and tension at the interface, Cliftonpark Avenue and the Girdwood Community Hub has continued into 2024.

Homes and cars being attacked. In one incident a mother was at home with her disabled child when their front windows were smashed in. This was a very frightening incident for this woman and young children.

Report it, sort it.

There has been a sharp rise in the level of illegal dumping taking place throughout the Cliftonville Road area.

Over the last few months residents have been contacting Cliftonville Community Regeneration Forum to report illegal dumping throughout the area.

Residents are having to live beside piles of rubbish, discarded by people who have no regard for the upkeep of the area or the effect dumping on such large scales will have on their neighbours and wider community.

Depending on where the rubbish is, there are different

agencies you need to contact in order to report rubbish to be removed.

In order to find out who to report to, you must know who owns the land with the dumping on it. Is it a Social Landlord? Belfast City Council? Private property?

Congratulations to everyone involved in the official launch day of New Ground Coffee shop based in Girdwood Community Hub.

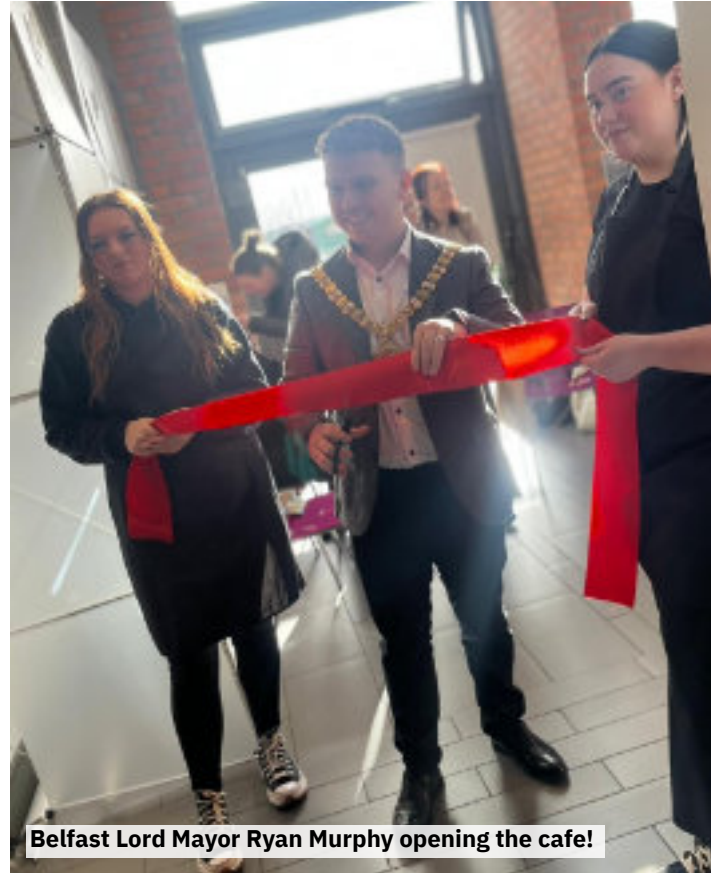
The project is part of the youth programme at Cliftonville Community Regeneration Forum (CCRF). The coffee shop is operated by local young people who have taken part in a long journey from creating the initial concept and building a business plan to ongoing training in first aid, food hygiene and barista training.

New Ground opened their pop-up cafe in Girdwood in December and celebrated their official opening Thursday 29th February 2024. Fiona

Hamilton from CCRF praised the young people who came up with the idea.

Fiona said: "The concept came about two years ago when our young people got together and came up with the idea of opening a coffee facility at Girdwood. Without our key funders, it would not have been possible. These include Belfast City Council, Department for Communities, The Executive Office, GLL, NI Water and Children in Need to name a few. It will not only deter young people away from the interface but they will gain real life experience, skills and confidence from working in the coffee shop".

Cliftonville Community Centre is based in Manor Street and offers a variety of services for the local area.

We run a Carers and Tots' every Tuesday & Thursday from 10-12. This service is for children aged 0-3 years.

Children are provided with quality play opportunities in a safe and stimulating environment. There are many activities which promote the child's holistic development and discussions for parents that support parents/carers to gain knowledge and awareness of the importance

of play and being the child's first educator.

The Afterschool and Youth projects deliver various programmes using a strength-based approach to help build resilience within young people; create a space to become a valued member of our community and provides services which enables and empowers young people to gain skills and values that will have a positive impact on the local community.

We have confidence in our interventions and provide enabling relationships which are person-centred and

modelled in principled leadership; resulting in quality impacts for our children and young people.

Women's Group

The Centre's Women's Group meet every Friday morning from 10-12. The group's focus is to empower members to reach their full potential, provide a social environment to gain personal growth and raise awareness of what they want to achieve, not only as individuals but as a group and for the wider community.

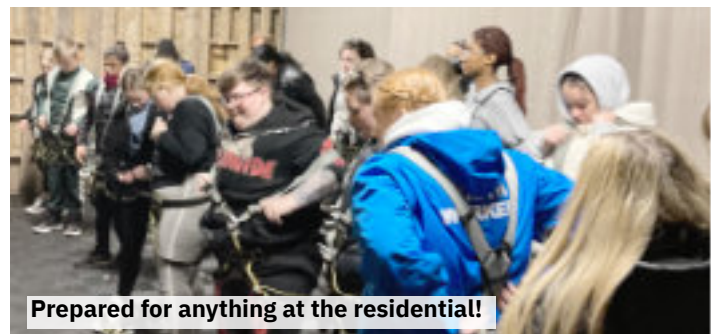
Young people not put off by rainy residential

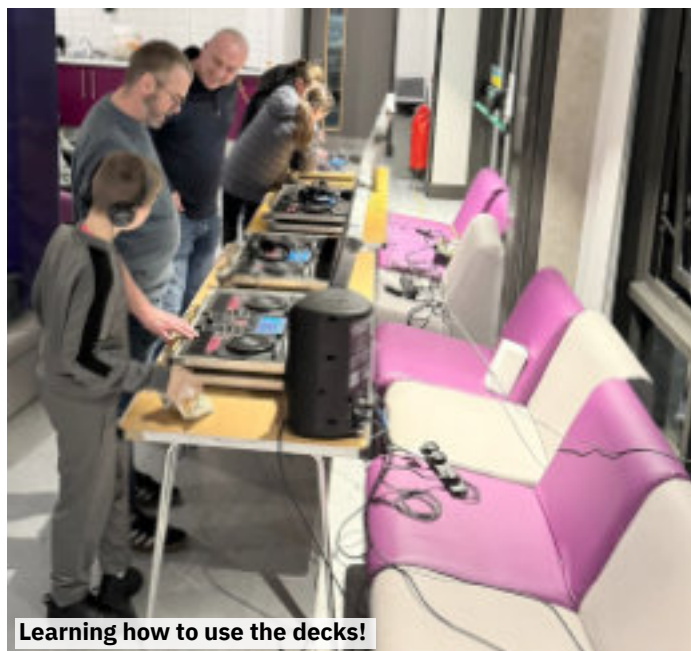
Digital Media Project

Project update

- Cliftonville Community Regeneration purchased the Cliftonpark Avenue site in 2017.
- The site has full planning approval
- A full Outline Business Case has been completed
- We have secured £1.45million funding from Belfast City Council's Neighbourhood Regeneration Fund.

Poverty Indicators

- The area is the **No.1** most deprived ward in NI
- **57%** of children live in poverty
- **53%** of residents have Low or No qualifications
- **44%** of the working population are economically inactive
- **11.6%** of the working population unemployed

Cliftonville Community Regeneration Forum has secured £1.45 million to build the Cliftonville Community Enterprise to act as a catalyst for the regeneration of this area.

The funding from Belfast City Council's Neighbourhood Regeneration Fund will see the building of a 8,000 square feet social enterprise on Cliftonpark Avenue with a 2-story childcare facility and 8

workspace units.

This Centre aims to provide employment and training opportunities for local people and to support them into employment and business.

This will help to create a pathway for residents into employment through child care jobs and through a process of learning, making, and selling.

Cliftonville Community Forum has worked to deliver this project for a number of

years.

Along with our community development work, peace building work and youth work we always knew that this area needed more support to help people into training and employment.

We have always provided training to increase people's skills and have helped many people secure employment.

This new centre will give us a purpose built facility where we can do this on a larger

scale. When the new centre is up and running it will create 30 jobs on the site as well as other jobs through training.

We will engage with three groups of people in the local community: i) long term unemployed males, ii) women living in poverty and iii) young people from disadvantaged families.

“My name is Erin and I am a single mother to a little boy and girl. With only 11 months between my kids, my sole focus over the last few years has been being a mum.

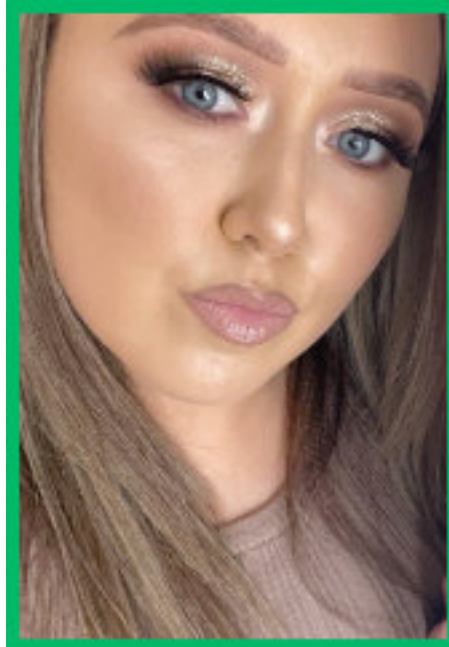
