Size is limited to 40" square.

Show Update—Only 4 months to go!

Hard to believe, but it's only 4 months until our Annual Quilt Show and Vendor Mall on May 10 and 11, 2024.

Here's the latest:

- Our gorgeous Opportunity Quilt, "Bluebird's Welcome," is ready and tickets are available for our members to sell. Please remember that our by-laws ask each member to sell at least \$20 worth of tickets (or you can buy them yourself.) This is the annual major fundraiser for the guild that pays for speakers and expenses throughout the year so it's very important that everyone help. Be sure to point out to people that it's completely hand quilted, pretty rare now a days! Susan Allers will have a sign up sheet at the February meeting for people to take it around to the local guilds. Please volunteer and help her sell a record number of tickets!
- Kathy Glenn has had to step back from her position as Publicity Chair (thank you so much for volunteering, Kathy!) but Rebecca Davidson is taking over. Joette Fredricksen has volunteered to assist her. They should have bookmarks available at the February Meeting. The 2024 San Diego Cruisin' Quilters Shop Hop is March 15-23rd. Please volunteer to take some bookmarks to each of our local Quilt Shops and don't forget Rosie's Calico Cupboard; they usually don't participate directly in the Shop Hop. Remember, publicity is the job of EVERY member, Rebecca and Joette just coordinate the major issues. If you've got any ideas for publicity, please contact one of them. Also, if you have a contact at any local Assisted Living center, please drop off some bookmarks/posters and talk to them to see if they'd like to bring a group of their residents over, they are probably in our main demographic for quilt interest!
- The rubber thresh hold ramps have arrived. These will be used to make the 2 classrooms we use on the North side of the church handicapped accessible, so now all the show spaces can be easily entered by our physically handicapped guests.
- An entry in the show from every guild member is our goal for this year's show!! Remember, the only criteria is that you meet the size limits in your category and that you've <u>never shown your entry in a CVQG show</u>. It does NOT have to have been completed in the last 12 months and it's OK if you have entered it in other shows, just not ours.
- For all of our new members, we'd like to see your creations, too! We want to present everything from beginners to blue prize winners so that our audience sees the full gamut of quilting creations. Be sure to mark the square on the entry form if you are entering a show for the first time. You will be entered into a drawing as a special prize!
- Please don't forget to make items for the Boutique and to search your sewing room for things to put in the Sew and Craft Booth. You can either sell your item for 85% of what you price it for (the remaining 15% goes to the guild) or you can DONATE your item so ALL of the sale price goes to the guild. See the Sew and Craft Booth and Boutique articles for more info.

That's all for now. Hope you are all madly quilting your entries and items for the Boutique!

2024 CVQG QUILT SHOW

Categories for the 2024 Quilt Show

- 1. Large Quilt (longest side over 70 ")
- 2. Medium Quilt (longest side 40 to 70 ")
 - 3. Small Quilt (longest side under 40")

4. Challenge (longest side under 40") - Hand Embroidery as a main element is this year's challenge

5. Soft Creations (*see description, below)

6. Youth (maker 14 years or younger, longest side under 40")

These are the same categories as we had last year . The number of categories and size restrictions are primarily dictated by:

- 1. Sizes of available display space
- 2. Quilt rack availability
- 3. Felt backing numbers and sizes
- 4. Number of entries historically in each class
- 5. Hoffman Challenge hanging requirements
- 6. Space for our guild booths and displays (Admission Desk, Opportunity Quilt, Basket Raffle, Boutique, Sew and Craft, etc.)
- 7. Spaces for the vendors

So, what class does my entry belong in?

- If your item is primarily flat (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE LONGEST SIDE .
- If your entry is NOT flat, it goes in the Soft Creations Category. Soft Creations includes wearables, hats pillows, totes, jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, book covers, whatever. If we can't put a sleeve on it to hang from a quilt rack, it goes into this category.
- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Class . This year's challenge is hand embroidery as the main features of your entry. (Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS)!
- Youth Class entries are <u>MADE</u> by people 14 years or younger. Please indicate maker and age on your entry form. Longest side cannot exceed 40 inches.
- If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved but this takes up valuable time during our busiest period just before the show. Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class!

Let's prevent the most common errors :

- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Category and are limited to 40 inches on the longest side.
- You must include the name and AGE of the maker of entries in the Youth Class.
- Measure the LONGEST side of your piece to determine the class.

Directions for Submitting Entries in CVQG Show

Electronic submissions are preferred.

- a. Please complete your entry form(s) on your computer, save a copy and then attach it to an e-mail to the Registrar. <u>Include title of entry in Subject line</u>.
- b. OR, print the form and type or LEGIBLY PRINT your information on it.
- c. E-mail your entry forms to Shawnie Meeks: <u>1ibmom@att.net</u>.
- If you need to mail the forms, send to: Shawnie Meeks, 837 12th St., Imperial Beach, 91932-2303.
- e. Shawnie's phone number is (619) 249-2371. Please, no calls before 9 am or after 8 pm!!
- Double check that your entry meets the class requirements was the longest side what was measured to identify which category your entry will be in?
- Entries in all classes (except Soft Creations) MUST HAVE A SLEEVE. Put Table Runner Sleeves on the SHORTEST side! All entries must be completely finished.
- Delivering your quilt on Take in Day

 FOLD your quilt, RIGHT SIDE OUT, with top right corner of the entry as it will be displayed on top.
 - b. Bring your entries to Bayview Orthodox Presbyterian Church, 505 E. Naples St, CV, 91911, on Wed, May, between 10 and 3 pm. If you need to arrange another drop off time/place, you MUST contact Jeri Nolfi-Brown or Joy Schlarb to arrange it.

Picking up your quilt after the show

- c. Entries must be picked up Saturday, May 11th , between 3:30 and 4:30 PM.
- d. If physically able, plan to help with Take Down BEFORE you pick up your quilts.
- 4. Non-guild members are not eligible for awards. Honorable Mention may be given.
- Insurance is the sole responsibility of the entrant. CVQG assumes no liability for the quilts. CVQG will take every precaution to protect your items. Hostesses are on the premises throughout the duration of the show.

What class does my entry belong in?

1.If your item is primarily flat (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE LONGEST SIDE. It doesn't matter if this is a top or side measurement - the LONGEST side determines your category.

2.If your entry is NOT flat, it goes in the new Soft Creations Category. This includes wearables, hats, pillows, totes, jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, book covers, whatever.

3.CVQG 2024 Challenge is a piece featuring a focus on some type of hand embroidery. The Challenge Class (Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS)!

4.Youth Class entries are MADE by people 14 years or younger. Please indicate maker and age in your description. Longest side cannot exceed 40 inches.

5.If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved. Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class!
