DUES

Your dues are due on the 1st of each month and late after the 10th. On the 11th, late fees will be accessed. Please get your dues in on time. Make sure the address you are paying dues for is written on the front of your check, money order or on your PayPal payment so that Joan can credit it to the correct account.

FERAL CATS

We are still participating in the Trap, Neuter and Release program. With the help of Sheri's TNR we have trapped over 20 cats and had them fixed and their rabies shots given before releasing them back. The plan is that the colony will eventually die out in 3 to 4 years. We have taken in the kittens and socialized and vetted them before placing them for adoption through Shreveport Animal Rescue and Petco. We also want to thank all the residents that have donated money and time to this endeavor.

Feral cats are great at keeping the mice population down and killing snakes. You will recognize the already fixed kitties by their ears. The tip of their left ear was removed when they were fixed so it would make for easy recognition.

Please keep your pets in your house. There are so many dangers outside. We have coyotes in the area who see your sweet baby as a meal and evil people looking to steal pets either to sell for drugs or to use in dog fighting. We are also located next to two busy streets. So love your babies enough to keep them safe by keeping them indoors.

If you are a dog owner, you cannot turn your babies loose to roam the neighborhood. They must be on a leash and you MUST clean up after them. There are Pet Stations in various places in the subdivision, with plans to add more. Be aware that there are fines by both the City and Cobblestone for anyone caught violating these laws.

You may request a FREE trash can by calling the City Sanitation Department. Their number is 673-6300. The City will deliver it to your home. Please put your house number on it so if it gets lost, it will find its way back to you.

IRRIGATION

Due to the high cost of water and the extensive repairs to our existing irrigation system, we will not be able to turn the sprinkler system back on again this year. We really need a new system, however, it is cost prohibitive at this time. We are aware that some homeowners have irrigation in their backyards and around their flowerbeds. We must ask that you set your private system for no more than 3 days a week for no more than 15 to 20 minutes per session. Anyone using a hose and sprinkler will also need to go by the same rules. There will be \$100 fine levied if you overwater and we find water from your system running in the road or into your neighbor's yard.

TRASH

We are still having trouble with trash. PLEASE take your trash out to the closest curb on Sunday evenings for pick up by the City on Monday, then retrieve your empty trash can on Monday evenings. Accumulated trash causes varmints and also attracts coyotes into Cobblestone. Also, clean up your patio areas so it will cut down on snakes, rodents, skunks, and other unwanted pest. Your neighbors will appreciate it!

BOOK EXCHANGE

Do you have books that you need to get rid of? Need a new book to read? Please donate the books you have already read to the Cobblestone office. When you drop them off, you may pick up a book you would like to read. Joan is trying to start a book exchange program for our residents. If you have more books than you can comfortably carry to the office and want to donate them, let Joan know and she will make arrangements to pick them up. She will even accept magazines!
