DUES

This coming year, you will see no increase in dues! Dues will remain at \$141.00 per month.

Please remember that dues are due on the 1st of each month. We give you a grace period through the 10th before late fees are assessed. So please pay on time!

Make sure your house number appears somewhere on the check so that Joan will know which house to credit the payment to. You may drop your check or money order in the drop box, mail it in, give it to Joan, sign up for Automatic Draft or you can also pay using a credit card on our website.

If you have signed up for automatic draft and you sell your home, please send Joan a request in writing, either by email or a written request sent to the office. She must have your request in writing in order to discontinue your automatic draft. This also applies when changing banks or changing your bank account.

TRASH

We are still having problems with people not putting their trash cans away and putting out loose bags of trash. When that happens, it makes the whole neighborhood look bad. When putting out trash, please make sure you are not putting it in someone's parking place or in someone's yard. Promptly return your trash can on Monday evenings.

WINTER IS COMING!

Just a few safety notes...

The holiday season is approaching and so are thieves. Be sure and lock your doors to your house and keep your gates locked to your back patio. Please lock your car doors and take anything of value into your house. There are thieves prowling various neighborhoods all over Shreveport/Bossier looking for things to steal. Even pets are a target for a thief to steal and sell. Don't allow yourself to become a victim...keep your doors and windows locked, cars locked and anything of value well hidden.

Louisiana has some bitter temperatures at times. So please, insulate your water faucets and disconnect and drain your water hoses. Faucet insulators may be found at Lowe's or Home Depot. They slip over your outside faucet to protect it in freezing weather. If you don't insulate them, then you may end up with a broken pipe and a huge plumbing bill.

To keep from slipping on icy sidewalks, please stock in boxes of salt before cold weather sets in. Salt can be used to melt any ice clinging to your walkways. This will help prevent injuries from slipping and falling.

Before lighting a fire in your fireplace, please call a Chimney Sweep or fireplace specialist to clean and check your fireplace. Fires often start from dirty or unrepaired fireplaces.

If the weather gets icy and bad, please stay safe by staying off the roads and staying home unless it is an emergency.
