If you do not have a mailbox key, go to the Post Office on E. 70th and take proof that you live there, such as a lease or a recorded deed, and for \$25 they can change the lock on your mailbox and issue you new keys.

Please put your house number on it so if it gets lost, it will find its way back to you. The City has a fee for a second trash can delivered to the same address.
