PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Before I can turn the page on the month of April, I need to acknowledge all the patience and effort that has gone into creating a really top-notch You-Tube broadcasting and worship service. And, I believe it will just keep getting smoother. A year from now we very well might look back and say how did we do it without the screen? Or, look at how little paper we use! That is my prayer. In the meantime, there are those who still aren't really sure they like it or not. That's fair. Your thoughts are always welcome. Speak to Pastor Bonnie or Dave Z, Donna, Connie, Cindy or Cheryl.

Personally, I have spent a good deal of time discovering the ins and outs of copyright law as it pertains to use of other people's ownership over YouTube. While we have a license for most music, even that needs to be credited to be safe. Youtube has strict rules as to what music it allows in videos. This is based on the world-wide availability of what we video.

There is a Religious Service Exemption that covers non-dramatic literary and religious music. The thing is, this only applies to physical church services...not online streaming.

I assumed anything I find on Youtube is already "out there" and, therefore, I didn't have to worry about copyright laws. I was wrong. For instance, I wanted to use a meditative music video with beautiful photos beginning around 9 am and then move into the Welcome screen and Reminders. The problem is I do not have any proof that the creator of the video had received proper permission to use the photos they used. It's tricky!!!

What happens if I/we accidently use something without permission? The church will receive a copyright strike. This means that whoever owns the copyright has filed a claim to have the video taken down. Then, you are instructed to go to "copyright school". IF we get 3 strikes within 90 days, YouTube will no longer carry our channel. The good news is that a single strike expires after 90 days.

Of course, there is lots more to it, but you get the gist. To be safe, we will be using lots of photos from our members...please pass them along at <u>saintpaulserin.pastor@gmail.com</u> Yes, I will credit you! And there is a lot of artwork available in the public domain.
