# History:

CCLC is a non-profit 501(c)3, special purpose school that teaches the Bible to public school and homeschooled students during the school day for elective credit. White County Christian Learning Center (WCCLC) was established in August, 2004 under the umbrella of Eagle Inc. A group of citizens from the White County community formed a steering committee in March 2004 to develop a plan to implement Released Time classes for White County High School Students. The first classes were held on August, 2004, with 17 students, and steadily grew.

In 2009, the WCCLC decided to incorporate and withdrew from its parent organization, Eagle Inc. The WCCLC was renamed the Catalyst Christian Learning Center, Inc. In the fall of 2012, CCLC added a class for students at the Ninth Grade Academy. This past school year, 2013-2014, CCLC had 137 high school students taking courses at CCLC for a full class period every school day for elective credit.

#### Our Beliefs:

We believe that ...

- Students should be an "example to the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith, and purity" (1 Timothy 4:12), and to that end, we should offer instruction in such Christian concepts as honoring parents and respecting authority at all levels, purity before marriage, developing trust bond friendships, living a life of integrity, and being a leader like Moses, Esther, Joshua, Nehemiah, Paul, and other scriptural examples of leadership.

# Our Philosophy:

The Catalyst Christian Learning Center exists to provide biblically based instruction in the area of character building and leadership skills to the public school students of White County Public Schools.

#### Our Statement of Faith:

We believe that...

- 1. The Bible is the inspired Word of God, without error in the original manuscript.
- 2. God is the only true, living God, existing eternally as three persons The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—and that these three are one God, having the same divine attributes.
- 3. Man, created in the image of God, fell into spiritual death through sin. This death has been inherited by all, with Jesus Christ as the only exception.
- 4. Jesus Christ, God's one and only Son, came into the world to redeem it from sin. He was born of a virgin and sinless. He died on the cross to take away the penalty for sin, after which he rose from the dead and ascended into heaven. He shall return to judge the living and the dead.
- 5. All men are lost until saved by their own personal faith in the finished work of Jesus on the cross.

We are a non-denominational organization and therefore submit to the authority of the scriptures and not any one denomination. We believe in teaching students to study for themselves God's Word, leading them in an exegetical study of the scriptures so that they may know fully what they believe and in Whom they believe.

# **CCLC-** Course Descriptions

The Catalyst Christian Learning Center offers six high school courses that reinforce our purpose and mission. They are as follows:

#### Old Testament and Its Influence

This course is designed to give an overview of the Old Testament. We will study both context and authorship. Students will learn about the different kinds of writing and the various books that make up the Old Testament.

#### New Testament and Its Influence

This course is designed to give an overview of the New Testament. In this course students will get a tour of the entire New Testament and learn about both context and authorship. Students will learn about the different kinds of writing and the various books that make up the New Testament.

### **Boundary and Relationship Skills**

This course is designed to teach boundaries in dating, marriage, and families with a view towards equipping students for present and future roles. Among the areas to be covered are defining boundaries from a Biblical perspective, communications, and conflict resolution as well as relevant boundaries in dating relationships.

#### Financial Freedom

This course is designed to equip students to be financially responsible. We seek to give them the tools needed to be good stewards of what God has given them. In this class we will cover topics such as debt, loans, stewardship, and college preparation.

#### **Character and Core Values**

This course is designed to teach students what it means to be a true follower of Christ. We will study the example that Jesus has laid out for us in scripture and we seek to reflect His image throughout our daily lives.

# **World Religions**

This course is designed to give an overview of other religions in order to compare and contrast how they line up with Christianity. Ultimately, our goal is to teach students how to share the gospel to other cultures and have confidence in the absolute truth found in the Bible.

### **Entrance Requirements:**

The only requirement for taking any course offered by the Christian Learning Center is written permission from a parent or guardian. Students who do not obtain written permission within the first week of any course will not be allowed to continue and will need to meet with their counselor for drop/add. There is no cost to the student for any Christian Learning Center course. CCLC is totally privately funded and receives no public funding.

# **Grading Policy:**

#### Attendance:

Students are expected to attend class daily and be on time. It is the student's responsibility to be on time and ready for transportation from his or her school to the Catalyst Christian Learning Center. Students that miss transportation must report to the front office at the high school. Students who do not report to the office will be written up for skipping class.

# Make-up Work:

A student who is absent has 3 school days from the day of return to make-up any missed work. Any work not made up within 3 days will not be assigned class credit. It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with the teacher regarding make-up work.

#### Student Code of Conduct:

The purpose of the Catalyst Christian Learning Center is to teach and promote traditional ethical values, to integrate faith and life into practical applications, and to supplement the efforts of the home, church and school to help students grow emotionally, mentally, and spiritually. In order to fulfill our purpose, the CCLC has a twofold teaching focus: teaching God's Word as relevant and applicable truth and teaching personal accountability. We, at CCLC, believe that teaching our students to be accountable for their words and actions is one of the single most vital lessons we can teach your child. Our class moto is: "I am accountable to the Lord, the authority figures He has placed in my life, and my peers for my words and actions."

Pursuant of this focus on personal accountability, we, as the CCLC staff, want you as parents/guardians to be aware of certain policies we have in our classroom. First of all, we accept **NO** late assignments. Assignments that are not completed and turned in at the time of collection result in a zero for the assignment. Naturally, if a student is absent, he or she has the opportunity to make up any work missed within three days of the absence. As well, in the case of a family emergency or sickness, students may make up assignments if the parent provides a note.

We have chosen this policy for one primary reason. We, at CCLC, are helping to prepare your student for God's call on their lives. For most students, that will result in their working under the authority of someone else and/or pursuing additional higher education after high school. Bosses and college professors will expect work to be turned in on time, and there will be deadlines to meet that are nonnegotiable. We want to prepare students for that reality and for success at those next levels. At CCLC, we believe in extending grace when extenuating circumstances arise; however, we also believe in holding students to the highest of standards and that everything we do in the name of the Lord should be done to the absolute highest degree of excellence.

We, at CCLC, believe that the way our students conduct themselves in our classroom setting is key to their success in the future. We want them to learn to be responsible citizens who are prepared, who are respectful and courteous to others, and who model godliness in their daily walk. Below, we have outlined our expectations for words and actions in our classroom. Please review these with your student carefully.

#### Rules:

- 1. Be respectful...of everyone at all times.
- 2. Be an active student—listen and complete work on time.
- 3. Bring all materials for class daily.
- 4. Clean up after yourself.
- 5. Follow directions the first time they are given.

#### Dress Code:

The dress code as outlined in the Student Handbook of the Walton County School System will be strictly enforced at the Christian Learning Center. Students are reminded of the Biblical principle of dressing modestly (1 Timothy 2:9) and to remember Who we represent. Students violating dress code will be given one warning to rectify the offense and then sent to the school office to call a parent to bring them appropriate clothing.

# **CCLC** Discipline Policy and Procedures:

- 1. Students will be expected to abide by White County High School policies at the CCLC, in areas including but not limited to dress, phone usage, substance abuse, and behavior.
- 2. When problems arise, the following disciplinary measures are available to teachers and should be attempted in the suggested order:
  - a. Warning
  - b. Reprimand
  - c. Referral to director
  - d. Phone call to parent
  - e. Parent conference
  - f. Student/teacher/parent conference with director present
  - g. Removal from CCLC (only in extreme cases)
