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Moscow Final Document: Hypersonic Missiles Target Romanian and Polish Bases - Planned Ukrainian F-16 Strikes by NATO's EEC

"This warning is not propaganda - We will strike with everything we have"

Russia has targeted airports in Romania and Poland, putting its Sarmat, Yars and Avangard hypersonic systems on high alert after intelligence gathered that F-16 fighters, as well as potentially Mirage 2000D, Eurofighter Typhoons and Gripens will operate from NATO airfields against Russian forces in Ukraine.

According to the information that reached Moscow, "if these fighters arrive en masse, then they will be based outside Ukraine and not at Ukrainian airfields, which are extremely vulnerable to Russian airstrikes.

Ukrainian airports will only be used for short-term transits to avoid accusations of attacks on Russian territory from NATO airspace.

This information targeted Russian hypersonic and nuclear systems at Polish airfields in Rzeszow, Łask, Radom, Powidz and Krzesiny, as well as Romanian bases at Bakau, Bucharest (Henri Coanda base), Campia Turzi, Constanta (base Mihail Kogalniceanu) and Fetesi.

Under the cover of Polish Patriots, the raids of the Ukrainian fighters?

According to the same information, Poland will protect Western Ukraine and the Ukrainian fighter repositioning bases with Patriot anti-aircraft systems.

It is no coincidence that the Ukrainian Foreign Ministry said last week that Western Ukraine will be protected by Polish Patriots.

"Kiev and Warsaw are considering a scenario to protect the western regions of Ukraine with Polish Patriot systems," said the head of the country's Foreign Ministry, Dmitry Kuleba.

He noted that negotiations on this initiative are currently underway, including with NATO representatives.

Kuleba did not specify whether the Polish Patriots would be deployed in western Ukraine or moved inside Poland to cover western Ukraine, intercepting Russian missiles and drones.

The second version will probably be implemented according to the Russians.

Be that as it may, if Poland develops air defense systems on behalf of Ukraine they will become a legitimate target for Russia.

It must be said that the Russians are sure that the pilots of these fighters will not be Ukrainians but NATO ("mercenaries").

This was also the reason why Moscow, through state television, issued a direct warning against the USA, France and Britain.

As the head of the Rossiya Segodnya TV station and vice-president of the Russian National Broadcasting Council Dmitry Kiselyov said during a TV show:

"If the USA, France and Britain send forces to Ukraine, then at the exact same moment what President Putin has said will happen:

What do we need the world if Russia is not not in? Kiselyov said.

"In that case we'll send anything flying everywhere.

Sarmat, Yars and Avangard missiles.

American command centers, land and sea launch sites are already in our sights.

France, a nuclear power will disarm immediately.

The British Isles will be swallowed up. We have the technology for that.

We have said this before. Of course, it would be better not to go that far and this warning is not propaganda," noted Kiselyov.

F-35 with B61-12 nuclear bombs next to Russia

Poland has officially requested that NATO nuclear weapons be

deployed on its soil thus cheating on its nuclear targeting by Russia. Its F-35s will be certified to use and carry B61-12 nuclear bombs.

Warsaw will gain nuclear strike capabilities, a breath away from Russia's borders, and this will not go without a reaction from Moscow.

It is now certain that Warsaw will go to war against Russia in the future, either inside Ukraine or in the Baltic, to defend the Suwalki Corridor.

The nuclear weapons he just requested are a necessary step aheac of military operations against nuclear powers.

It is also important to emphasize that together with nukes, Poland becomes the most powerful Army in Europe.

It has the American Aegis Ashore anti-ballistic defense base in northern Poland, in Renjikovo (250 km from the Russian enclave of Kaliningrad) while spending billions of dollars on equipment such as Patriot, F-35, Himars, Abrams.

The US recently approved the potential sale of \$1.77 billion in hardware that includes up to 821 AGM-158B-2 JASSM-ER air attack cruise missiles (LACMs) with a range of more than 930 kilometers.

In addition to JASSM-ER, Warsaw has expressed interest in the procurement of Tomahawk LACMs for its submarines under the Orka program.

Yesterday the Polish Ministry of Defense announced the construction and renovation of hundreds of air raid shelters built during the 1950s and 1960s at a cost of 700 million dollars.

In fact, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Poland, Radoslaw Sikorski, appeared particularly threatening. In his statements he said that "if the US fails to provide military support to Ukraine despite the wishes of the Supreme Commander (President Biden), the allies will start developing their own nuclear weapons because America is dysfunctional and unreliable".

According to a 2022 video obtained by War News 24/7, General Wesley Clark, the former commander of NATO forces in Europe told CNN that Russia will nuke Poland.

His statements came from information from the US secret services and the reason was to "break" Article 5 of NATO. At the time these statements seemed extreme, but now?

"The Russians will strike with nukes. Probably not in Ukraine but in Poland, in a populated area in Poland," General Wesley Clark, former commander of NATO forces in Europe, told CNN.

Russia: NATO nukes in Poland will become a primary target!

Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov warned a few days ago that Russia would make NATO nuclear weapons in Poland one of its primary targets if they were deployed there.

"Moves in this direction will not provide greater security (to Poland or other countries hosting such weapons)," Ryabkov said, according to the TASS news agency.

"I'm not even talking about permanent growth, which is also hotly debated by hotheads in Warsaw. Therefore, all those politicians who are now enthusiastically discussing such a plan in Poland and beyond, for their own reasons, should understand the following:

This direction will not make Poland safer, but the respective facilities will certainly be targeted."

On Monday, April 22, Polish President Andrzej Duda said that Warsaw is ready to host nuclear weapons on its soil if NATO, of which it is a member, decides to strengthen its eastern flank to counter the development of new weapons by Russia in Kaliningrad and Belarus.

"If our allies decided to deploy nuclear weapons on our soil to strengthen the security of NATO's eastern flank, we are ready to do so," the Polish president explained to the Fakty newspaper.

For her part, Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said that any nuclear weapons developed in Poland would be legitimate targets in the event of an armed conflict with the NATO military alliance.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu told US Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Wednesday that he would not accept an end to the war in Gaza as part of a potential hostage deal, an Israeli official told The Times of Israel.

"He told Blinken that we are interested in reaching a deal, and determined to topple Hamas," said the official.

Israel conveyed its latest offer to Hamas through Egyptian mediators late last week, and is expecting a response Wednesday evening, an Israeli official told The Times of Israel.

Netanyahu also told Blinken during their meeting in Jerusalem that a hostage deal with Hamas does not mean an invasion of Rafah would be avoided, the Prime Minister's Office told The Times of Israel.

"The **Rafah operation does not depend on anything**," said the PMO. "Prime Minister Netanyahu made this clear to Secretary Blinken.

Meanwhile, Blinken "reiterated the United States' clear position on Rafah," said State Department Spokesman Matthew Miller.

The **US readout did not say exactly what that position is, but the Biden administration has been firm in its opposition to a Rafah operation** without a credible plan to evacuate civilians, even calling a move into the southern Gaza city a "red line."

The US readout said that Blinken "emphasized that it is Hamas that is standing in the way of a ceasefire." In his meeting with President Isaac Herzog in Jerusalem earlier in the day, Blinken expressed similar sentiments, placing the blame squarely on Hamas for the failure to reach a hostage deal since November.

The Gaza terror organization is "the only reason that that wouldn't be achieved," said the top US diplomat, who is in Israel for the seventh time since the massive Hamas attack on October 7.

"No delays, no excuses," said Blinken. "The time is now."

A report from the Lebanese news outlet al-Akhbar indicated that Israel's offer would see at least 33 hostages released in the first phase, followed by later stages that would establish a sustainable calm and possible full withdrawal of IDF troops.



The first stage of the deal, to last 40 days, reportedly involves a gradual withdrawal of Israeli troops from parts of the Strip in order to allow the movement of humanitarian aid and the return of civilians to their homes.

The Prime Minister's Office declined to comment on the report.

failure to reach a deal were an attempt to put pressure on it and acquit Israel.

Abu Zuhri also told Reuters that the group was still studying the recent truce offer.

In a change of tune from recent criticism of Israeli policies, Blinken also blamed Hamas for the suffering of Gazan civilians: "We also have to be focused on people in Gaza who are suffering in this crossfire

of Hamas's making, and so focused on getting them the assistance they need — the food, medicine, the water, the shelter."

In a public statement ahead of their meeting, Herzog blasted the potential issuing of arrest warrants against Israeli leaders by the International Criminal Court in The Hague.

"Our enemies and other elements are trying to undermine the entire process by using international legal forums that were established in order to have a world order that pursues peace, and pursues the values and norms that we all believe in in the modern world," said Herzog. "Especially the efforts



done at the International Criminal Court."

"Israel has a very strong legal system, very strong adjudication and law enforcement system, and it has pursued legal steps from the highest authorities in this land [against] any other citizen," said Herzog.

Blinken arrived in Israel on Tuesday evening following visits to Jordan and Saudi Arabia.

The top US diplomat was set to meet Defense Minister

Yoav Gallant at the Kerem Shalom Crossing and National Security Adviser Tzachi Hanegbi at Ashdod Port in the afternoon to examine humanitarian aid flowing through to Gaza.

Washington has intensified its pressure on Hamas to reach a deal — a message pushed by Blinken during his tour.

"Now it's on Hamas," Blinken told reporters in Jordan. "No more delays, no more excuses... We want to see in the coming days this agreement coming together."

A truce is "the most effective way to relieve the suffering" of civilians in the besieged Gaza Strip, he told reporters near Amman.

Blinken saw off a first Jordanian truck convoy of aid heading to Gaza through the Erez Crossing reopened by Israel, and urged a redoubling of the aid efforts.

"It is real and important progress, but more still needs to be done," he said.

Israel has drastically increased humanitarian aid to Gaza since the deadly April 1 strike on World Central Kitchen aid workers, but the situation remains dire. The vast majority of residents have fled their homes and the United Nations has warned of looming famine.

A **US-built floating pier on Gaza's coast is expected to be completed later this week**, said Cyprus, to receive aid arriving through a "maritime corridor" via the eastern Mediterranean nation.



Blinken said the pier would "significantly increase the assistance" but was not "a substitute" for greater overland access.

It is believed that 129 hostages abducted by Hamas on October 7 remain in Gaza — not all of them alive — after 105 civilians were released from Hamas captivity during a weeklong truce in late November, and four hostages were released prior to that.

Three hostages have been rescued by troops alive, and the bodies of 12 hostages have also been recovered,

including three mistakenly killed by the military.

The Israel Defense Forces has confirmed the deaths of 34 of those still held by Hamas, citing new intelligence and findings obtained by troops operating in Gaza.

Israel should invade Rafah, not give in to 'global pressure,' son of Hamas leader to Piers Morgan

Mosab Hassan Yousef insisted that Israel should not give in to global pressure, and the world has refused to acknowledge that a genocide was committed by Hamas on Oct. 7.

Mosab Hassan Yousef, the disowned son of a Hamas co-founder Sheikh Hassan Yousef, appeared on Piers Morgan Uncensored on Tuesday, where he defended his stance that a Rafah operation was essential for defeating Hamas.

Yousef insisted that Israel should not compromise its security because of "global pressure," as the pressure was only temporary.

"If we don't end Hamas and remove them from power... we are going to have many other wars. This is not

Hamas's first attempt to take hostages and use civilians for human shields...We do not need to give Hamas one more opportunity to destabalize the region and create a major war like this," Yousef stressed.

Morgan proceeded to ask if Israel was not creating a new generation of terrorists, as civilians may turn against Israel after having lost their loved ones during the current war. Responding to this, Yousef answered "Israel is fighting for its very existence...when there are people out there who want you to cease to exist – this is when they push you to the corner and you have no other choice but to fight."

The ICJ ruled that Israel's actions are not genocide, Yousef asserted while insisting that the world was failing to acknowledge that Hamas committed genocide on October 7.

Rahma Zein, an Egyptian journalist, also appeared on the show where she accused Israel of committing "blatant war crimes" in Gaza and referenced the International Criminal Court's upcoming decision to potentially charge Benjamin Netanyahu and other Israeli leaders. Morgan, the show's host, reminded Zein that Hamas leaders were also under the ICC's inspection.

Asked what Israel should have done after October 7, Zein dodged the question and pushed that she needed to respond to the comments by Yousef. She claimed that Yousef's relationship with his father had led him to "condone the annihilation of your own people."

Continuing to negate Morgan's question, Zein said the conflict predated Hamas. and referenced that Palestinian people were denied the right of return.

"At one point you get so oppressed, you have to fight back," Zein said. "...So what ends up happening, you have to understand...You are going to keep having more resistance as long as you don't do something about it."

Mentioning the hostages, Zein quickly stated "What about those being abducted from the West Bank? What about those who are in prison? The children in prison?"

During the November ceasefire, Israel released a number of security prisoners who had committed terror offenses against civilians in exchange for the release of some civilian hostages who were kidnapped on October 7.

Later in the interview, Yousef stated that the Palestinian people were using a "victim card" and that it was the Jewish people who had experienced historic oppression - not the Palestinians. Yousef pointed to the fact that Mizrachi Jews were thrown out of Arab countries with little notice, but Palestinians had claimed that narrative. <u>https://www.jpost.com/israel-hamas-war/article-799307</u>

Far-right minister: Hostage deal throws war goals in trash to save only 22-33 hostages In response, Lapid says Orit Strock's 'extremist' government has 'no right to exist'; Movement for Quality Government calls on Netanyahu to fire her

Settlements and National Projects Minister Orit Strock sparked fierce criticism on Wednesday when she rejected the "terrible" hostage deal currently being negotiated in Egypt and said that its approval would be tantamount to a betrayal of IDF soldiers and Israel's war aims.

There are "soldiers who left everything behind and went out to fight for goals that the government

defined, and we throw it in the trash to save 22 people or 33 or I don't know how many," the far-right minister told Army Radio. "Such a government has no right to exist."

In comments in the same interview that were not widely highlighted, she also said: "This deal turns its back on all three of these [war] aims, including the aim of creating conditions for the return of the hostages. Because what does it essentially say? It says, return a small number of hostages now. But in return for the others, you'll have nothing left to pay, except really the complete end of the war."

"Is Hersh Goldberg a 'humanitarian' hostage or not? Is Omri Miran a 'humanitarian' hostage or not?" Strock went on. "Those people will be left behind [in Gaza] and we won't have anything to offer [for their release] except a complete end to the war."

Condemning Strock, Opposition Leader Yair Lapid tweeted that "a government with 22 or 33 extremist coalition members has no right to exist."

Minister Chili Tropper of National Unity, who sits with Strock in the cabinet, accused her of insensitivity toward the hostages. Whether one supports the deal or not, "the fundamental Jewish precept that 'whoever saves a single life, it is as if he saved an entire world' should spare us obtuse and blunt statements regarding the terrible suffering of the hostages and their families, like the words of Minister Orit Strock," he said.

"The Jewish path is more humane and sensitive to human life than those who sometimes seek to speak on its behalf." **[So how well did that work with the hostage Gilad Shalit? Once you give into**

terrorists you have lost the battle and they see a way to success which is exactly the problem of Oct 7 hostages - rdb

In a statement, the Movement for Quality Government in Israel called on Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to fire Strock, declaring that "Israel now needs unity and not division, responsibility and not political populism."

"There is no place for someone who adheres to an extremist ideology at the expense of human life, and we call on the prime minister to fire Minister Strock immediately," the watchdog group demanded.

Shir Siegel, whose father <u>Keith Siegel</u> is being held hostage in Gaza, described Strock's words as expressing "disdain for human life at the highest levels," in a statement cited by the Haaretz daily.

This is not the first time that Strock has

criticized the handling of the war against Hamas, having <u>questioned the conduct of Israeli Air Force pilots</u> regarding air support for ground troops in Gaza in December.

Strock's latest comments echoed those of Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, the leader of her Religious Zionism party, who on Tuesday appeared to threaten to bolt the coalition if it approves an agreement being negotiated in Egypt.

In remarks following a meeting of his party in the Knesset, Smotrich told reporters that while he would have received kudos for coming out in favor of a deal, he believes that such a course of action would endanger Israeli civilians and that he is "ready to pay the political price" to prevent an "existential threat" to the State of Israel — even if it means going to the opposition.

Smotrich explained that though his "heart is torn" by the suffering of the hostages and their families, his "head is thinking at the same time about the future of nine million Israeli citizens" and how they will be affected by a potential return of Hamas to northern Gaza and the release of terrorists with blood on their hands in exchange for the hostages.

"We have reached a crossroads where the State of Israel has to choose between decisive victory and defeat in war and humiliation," he declared, claiming that "acceptance of the deal that is on the table means unequivocally waving a white flag and granting victory to Hamas."

"A government that submits to international pressure, stops the war in the middle, avoids immediate entry into Rafah and returns to Egyptian mediation proposals that leave Hamas existing in any configuration, will at that moment lose its right to exist," Smotrich said.

His announcement on Tuesday came shortly after National Security Minister Itamar Ben Gvir said, following a private meeting with the prime minister, that Netanyahu had promised not to agree to a "reckless" hostage deal.

Responding to Ben Gvir and Smotrich, National Unity Minister Gadi Eisenkot, an observer in the war cabinet, slammed what he described as political blackmail.

Calling their actions "a serious phenomenon that harms Israel's national security," Eisenkot asserted that he "will only be a partner in a government that makes decisions based on the national interests of the State of Israel, and not on political considerations."

Smotrich hit back at Eisenkot, calling for him to show "a little humility," and adding that it was his "duty to

act against a bad deal that will endanger the security of the citizens of Israel."

While Eisenkot condemned Smotrich and Ben Gvir's threats, National Unity leader Benny Gantz earlier this week used similar language, saying that if the government rejects a hostage deal backed by the security services, it will "have no right to continue to exist."

Houthis could sever global Internet lines by targeting submarine cables, expert says

Tensions rise in the Red Sea as Houthis escalate military operations and hint at potential cyberwarfare disrupting global internet connectivity for 2 billion people in Europe and Asia Anwar Muneer/The Media Line\13:50

Houthi control over areas with submarine communication cables raises fears of potential cyber warfare that could disrupt global internet connectivity amid escalating military operations in the Red Sea and Bab al-Mandab Strait, posing significant threats to international trade and security in



these waters.

Fahmi Mohammad*, a technical specialist at the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology in Sana'a, spoke to The Media Line about the extent of the Houthis' technical capabilities to carry out such an attack and the extent to which the group's leaders can exert political pressure through this card to achieve their goals.

"The Ansar Allah group (the Houthis) controls the majority of the locations through which these cables pass," he explained, noting that the fiber

optic cables are located at the bottom of the sea and hundreds of meters below the earth's surface. "Accessing [them] requires advanced capabilities that allow access to the depths of the sea and handling the cables."

Despite doubts about the Houthis' possession of these capabilities, Mohammed does not rule out that the Houthis do have submarines and advanced weapons capable of carrying out such attacks "especially after Ansar Allah group announced It has many boats and submarines that are technically capable of



reaching these cables."

The Ruby Mar vessel that was sunk by the Houthis (Photo: EPA) Fahmy added that the Houthis, through the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology and the telecommunications and internet companies under its control, employ a group of engineers, some of whom work directly with the Chinese company Huawei.

"They [the Yemeni engineers] have sufficient technical capacity to participate in any military operation targeting submarine cables if Ansar Allah wanted that," Mohammed confirmed.

On February 24, HGC Global Communications Limited announced that access to the Internet in the East African country of Djibouti had become more difficult, according to the Associated Press. The press linked the outage incident to events in the Red Sea at the time. Additionally, the

company said it was forced to intervene to divert and repair Internet traffic after four out of 15 submarine cables in the Red Sea were cut.

Sixteen submarine cables pass through the Red Sea and the Bab al-Mandab Strait, linking the

continents of Asia and Europe and transporting 17% to 30% of global Internet traffic, serving more than two billion people.

Speaking to The Media Line on condition of anonymity, Ali Al-Samman*, a committee leader within Yemen's Public Telecommunications Corporation, discussed the situation, noting he was not authorized to speak publicly.

"The submarine internet cables that pass through the Bab al-Mandab Strait are under our control," he confirmed. "Any option proposed by the leadership of Ansar Allah group will be implemented to achieve its [the Houthis] goals, and it will not be reversed until the demands of Ansar Allah group, which is to end the siege on the Gaza Strip, is achieved."

The same source added that the Houthis have the military and technological capabilities to control these cables fully. He said, "The Houthi's political leadership took upon itself the duty of



supporting the Palestinian cause and worked to do so through military operations."

Houthi spokesperson

"Yemen's location, which intersects with the interests of the world, will preserve these interests unless they go against supporting the Palestinian cause," Al-Samman explained.

National Security and Strategy expert Omar Al-Raddad stressed to The Media Line that targeting submarine cables is an option for the Houthis if the American-British strikes continue and achieve their

goals.

"There are several factors that contribute to taking this option, including support from Iran, which may use this option to exert pressure during its discussions with the West, meaning, with support of Iranian technologies, there is an increased chance of such an attack occurring," Al-Raddad added.

The Houthis control internet services in Yemen, including areas under the control of the internationally recognized government (IRG), and implement their policies in this sector according to their best interests. This includes blocking news websites and cutting internet services in some areas.

Journalist Saddam Al-Huraibi spoke to The Media Line about this pressure card, stressing that the Houthis have used the internet and communications since their control of Sana'a. He added: "I do not rule out that the Houthis will threaten or actually carry out military operations to target submarine cables in the Red Sea and the Bab al-Mandab Strait."

Al-Huraibi confirmed that despite the televised statements by the Houthi's leader, during which he spoke about continued military escalation and no intention to target submarine cables, leaders within the Houthi group hinted via social media platforms at the possibility of using this card within their military operations in the Red Sea.

Pro-Houthi journalist Maher Al-Khaled confirmed this during an interview with The Media Line, saying, "Communication cables pass under lands which Yemen has sovereignty, and any option to use them is on the table if the United States, Israel, and their allies continue their military operations."

Since mid-November 2023, the Houthis have been targeting commercial ships heading towards Israel's ports as part of operations that led to the detention of one ship, the sinking of another, and the exposure of many vessels to significant danger and even damage. In response to these operations, forces from the United States and

Britain launched a series of attacks on Houthi targets. To respond to that, the Houthis declared that they would use all the available means for them to stand with the Palestinians in the Gaza Strip. https://www.ynetnews.com/article/hyrm511efr

Hezbollah has destroyed South Lebanon, says BBC report

Beautiful Southern Lebanon could have been tourist center, like Italy or Greece, but Hezbollah destroyed it.

The BBC recently reported on southern Lebanon where it said it saw "air strike destruction in deserted towns." The report sought to downplay the role Hezbollah has had in bringing this disaster on southern Lebanon. However, reading between the lines, one can get a sense of how Hezbollah's thousands of attacks on Israel since it joined the war in support of Hamas on October 8, has harmed civilian life in Lebanon.

Hezbollah is an Iranian-backed terrorist group that

illegally occupies southern Lebanon and has illegally stockpiled more than 150,000 missiles and rockets. It has also acquired anti-tank missiles in the thousands and several thousand attack drones in recent years, as well as precision-guided munitions. Some of its weapons are developed locally, while other are trafficked from Iran.

Hezbollah has festooned southern Lebanon with weapons, moving them into villages and building networks of bunkers, observation posts, launch sites, and other illegal terrorist infrastructure in Lebanon. After the 2006 war, the UN and Lebanon were supposed to keep Lebanon from creating a state within a state in southern Lebanon, and returning to the border.

Parts of the South are ghost towns

However, the group is exponentially more powerful today than in 2006. Similar to their blind eye to Hamas activities, the international community has sought to enable Hezbollah's threats or pretend not to notice them.

The result of ignoring Hezbollah's threats have now become apparent. The group began attacks on Israel on October 8 – one day after the Hamas incursion and brutal October 7 attack in Israel's South – and has now launched thousands of missiles and rockets at Israel.

Israel has responded proportionately, often targeting Hezbollah launch sites or observation posts, meaning that, in general, Hezbollah's fighters simply move from place to place to attack again. Hezbollah has lost some fighters, more than 200 in the six months of attacks.

The BBC report, one of the few on southern Lebanon, includes details on how Hezbollah's war has driven civilians out of southern

Lebanon. According to the report, more than 70 civilians have been killed and the conflict has turned "parts of the south into ghost towns. Residents have fled, leaving their homes at risk of destruction. The BBC went on patrol with the UN's peacekeeping force there to see what has happened."

The report said that "in every town near the line, there are similar sights: buildings leveled or vanished into craters; next to them, buildings which have been damaged, then rows of houses intact – followed by more craters."

"We are paying the price"

SOUTHERN LEBANON is a beautiful and diverse area, with hills rising from the coast. It could be a tourist center, like Italy or Greece, but Hezbollah has destroyed it with checkpoints and turned the area into a military camp.

Although the UN is present in southern Lebanon and is supposed to monitor what is happening there, Hezbollah threatens the UN and has attacked its vehicles if they go off certain designated

roads that Hezbollah has approved them to use.

For instance, in December 2022 five members of Hezbollah murdered an Irish UN peacekeeper named Sean Rooney. Those who go to southern Lebanon are monitored by Hezbollah and journalists are likely closely controlled by the group, and only see what it wants them to see.

Therefore the BBC report doesn't include mention of seeing any Hezbollah members around, despite that the group carries out daily attacks on Israel. Nevertheless, the report is an insight into what Hezbollah has done to Lebanon due to its war on Israel. "In Alma el Shaab, about 4 km. west of Yarine, stand the remains of what appears to have been a gated villa with parked cars – destroyed, apart from a fence now surrounding a pile of rubble. The windows of houses nearby were all smashed from the force of the explosions," the BBC report notes.

"We are paying the price of all of this," a 75-year-old resident told the reporters. This means the elderly resident would have been born in the 1950s and grown up at a time before the Lebanese civil war. Lebanon was once a nice thriving state, full of diversity, with numerous Christian, Muslim, and Druze groups making up the country. However, an influx of Palestinians led to destabilization and Palestinian terrorists hijacked Lebanon to attack Israel, just as Hezbollah did decades later.

This led to a civil war. The Saudis helped end the war in 1989 but Syria occupied the country until 2005 when Hezbollah murdered former Lebanese Prime Minister Rafic Hariri. Israel left Lebanon in 2000 after almost 20 years of war there.

Instead of bringing peace, Hezbollah stockpiled more weapons and launched a war on Israel in 2006, much as Hamas would do after Israel may leave Gaza. This is the Iranian-backed plan, getting Israel to leave



and then hollowing out areas and filling them with weapons and extremist groups to fight Israel.

A time before Hezbollah

FOR THE elderly Lebanese, they remember a time when they were not held hostage by the PLO and then by Hezbollah. But they also know that they are paying the price for these groups that they can't oppose. "Everything is lost, the house, the belongings, and the cars. But I will return as soon as I can, even if I were to live in a tent there," the resident told the BBC. Lost because of a war they have no power over, hijacked by a group that

they can't control and which the UN and international organizations and world powers have foisted on them.

"Right now, there is no sign of life in many southern villages. People have fled, leaving towns deserted. About 90,000 Lebanese have become displaced, according to the International Organization for Migration (IOM). On the Israeli side, about 80,000 people have been evacuated," the BBC notes. Israel had to evacuate the border because of Hezbollah attacks on October 8 and fears Hezbollah might try to replicate the Hamas attack of October 7.

The report goes on to note that "The Lebanese town of Aita el Shaab – just 700 m. (2,300 ft.) from Israel – has suffered the heaviest damage so far. On the day of our visit, Israel said it launched 40 strikes on the town." It also notes that one resident who was interviewed had left the town in October, when the fighting began, and is now living near Beirut.

"We didn't expect it all to last that long. We thought it would just be a couple of days," a woman told the BBC. "We know it will still take a while." According to the report there is a civil defense group that operates in these deserted towns and the mayor of the town has remained.

A UN Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) officer told the BBC, "the next challenge for the UNIFIL

is to help and support the local population in returning to their homes." It is unclear how the UN will be able to do that, especially considering that the UN has enabled Hezbollah to grow exponentially in southern Lebanon.

Hezbollah has thrived during UN presence

BASICALLY, FROM the moment the UN has been there, and certainly after 2006, Hezbollah has thrived. In essence, the international community has midwifed Hezbollah and Hamas to extraordinary power, enabling the groups to grow more powerful militarily than many small countries under the watchful eye of UN organizations and international organizations.

Israel has been systematically misled over the years about how much Hezbollah is deterred and whether Hezbollah feels impunity to attack. For instance, it appeared that the 2006 war had brought some quiet, but it now appears it is Israel that is deterred by the Hezbollah threat, rather than Hezbollah.

In the fall of 2022, Hezbollah threatened Israel with war if Israel didn't sign a maritime deal with Lebanon that would potentially enable Qatar, which hosts Hamas, to partner on energy deals in Lebanon. At the time US envoy Amos "Hochstein said after meeting with Lebanese President Michel Aoun earlier Thursday that the agreement will create stability on both sides of the border and an economic horizon for the Lebanese people," Axios website noted on October 27, 2022. United Airlines cancels Israel flights until May 9

American company says it prioritizes safety of passengers and crew members, as it extends flight suspension amid Iranian attack last month

United Airlines announced Wednesday that it will not resume flights to Israel until May 9.

"We continue to closely monitor the situation and will make decisions regarding all upcoming flights, focusing on the safety of our customers and crew," the company said in a statement.

The American airline, which operates a daily route from Tel Aviv to New York, canceled its flights to Ben Gurion Airport on April 19 following the Iranian attack and the widespread unrest from Iran.

On the night of April 13-14, Israel's airspace was closed for seven hours due to the Iranian missile attack. United Airlines, like other foreign carriers, subsequently announced that it was suspending all flights to Israel. The American company initially canceled flights until May 2, but now it is extending its suspension in Israel.

United Airlines resumed its flights to Israel on March 2, shortly after the outbreak of the war. It was the first American airline to do so, with Delta Airlines planning to return to Israel on June 7 and American Airlines announcing a return only in October. <u>https://www.ynetnews.com/travel/article/hjolo1xfc</u>

F-16s could arrive in Ukraine this month – official

Kiev may receive the US-made jets sometime after May 5, but the exact timeline is not yet clear, an Air Force spokesman has said

US-made F-16 fighter jets could start arriving in Ukraine as early as this month, a senior Ukrainian military official has said. [How to start a nuclear war in 3 easy lessons? Rd b

Speaking on national TV on Wednesday, Ukrainian Air Force spokesman Ilya Evlash predicted that Kiev could receive the first batch of the advanced jets after Orthodox Easter, which is celebrated on May 5 this year.

Still, he cautioned against getting hopes up. "We are not guessing the future, because the date has been changed several times. That's why we are waiting," Evlash.

The official stressed that the timeline for F-16 deliveries is out of Ukraine's hands, and that Kiev's military "will work with what it is given to it."

Later, in an interview with the newspaper Ukrainskaya Pravda, Evlash elaborated that "'after Easter' is a drawn-out notion," noting that Kiev would like to get the warplanes as soon as possible and vowing to make an announcement once they arrive. He added that Ukrainian pilots are currently training to fly

the jets in Denmark and the US.

In March, Dutch Defense Minister Kajsa Ollongren said that the first batch of F-16 fighter jets would arrive in Ukraine from Denmark this summer. This timeline was also confirmed by Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmitry Kuleba, who nevertheless acknowledged that more training is needed both for pilots and ground personnel.

Ukrainian officials have admitted that operating F-16s will be fraught with serious practical difficulties. Last month, Evlash said that building bunkers for the jets will require "colossal funds," adding that Kiev would try to use other methods to protect the aircraft from strikes, including dispersing them among different airfields.

Last year, Western countries announced an international coalition to help Ukraine procure the US-designed F-16s, with plans to provide Kiev with several dozen aircraft.

However, NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said last autumn that while the F-16s would certainly boost Ukraine's military capabilities, they would not be "a silver bullet" capable of drastically changing the situation on the battlefield.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov has said that F-16s will not change the outcome of the conflict, promising that the Russian military will destroy the planes as it has other Ukrainian hardware. https://www.rt.com/russia/596846-f16-ukraine-arrive-may/

Russian defense chief inspects new anti-drone weaponry (VIDEO)

Troops need an increased supply of weapons to support the pace of their offensive, Sergey Shoigu has said 1 May, 2024 07:46

Russian Defense Minister Sergey Shoigu has met with top military officials to discuss the battlefield situation in the Ukraine conflict, placing special emphasis on weapons production.

The Defense Ministry said on Wednesday that Shoigu heard military reports at the headquarters of the United Group of Forces in an undisclosed location. The meeting reportedly focused in-part on Ukrainian tactics.

Shoigu also inspected modernized anti-drone weaponry, with the video released by the ministry showing him standing near a twin-barreled heavy machine gun equipped with a collimator sight.

According to the ministry, Shoigu said that Russian forces "continue to carry out tasks in operational directions in accordance with the plan for [the] special military operation." He also emphasized the need to further increase deliveries of equipment.

"To support the required pace of the offensive... it is necessary to increase the volume and quality of weapons and military equipment supplied to the troops," the minister said.

To achieve this goal, Shoigu continued, the military has state contracts with defense contractors which prioritize decreasing the production time as much as possible.

He noted that the armed forces sometimes have to deal with *"urgent"* issues in this area, especially when it comes to the production of the weapons most frequently used on the battlefield.

The minister also stressed the particular need to increase the efficiency of repair facilities and units, ordering them to reduce the time needed for restoring inoperable engines and other equipment, as well as for replenishing the stock of spare parts.

The top level meeting comes after Shoigu said in April that Russian troops had seized the initiative on the battlefield and announced the capture of several more settlements in Donbass. On Monday, Ukraine's top general, Aleksandr Syrsky, acknowledged retreating from a number of strongpoints in the area, and that the "most difficult situation" was being faced on several operational fronts.

Meanwhile, both Ukrainian officials and Western media have expressed deep concern about the country's ability to withstand a possible Russian summer offensive, despite the US recently approving a long-awaited \$61 billion aid package. One of those proposals involves using the decades-old United States Refugee Admissions Program to welcome Palestinians with U.S. ties who have managed to escape Gaza and enter neighboring Egypt, according to the inter-agency planning documents.

Top U.S. officials have also discussed getting additional Palestinians out of Gaza and processing them as refugees if they have American relatives, the documents show. The plans would require coordination with Egypt, which has so far refused to welcome large numbers of people from Gaza.

Those who pass a series of eligibility, medical and security screenings would qualify to fly to the U.S. with refugee status, which offers beneficiaries permanent residency, resettlement benefits like housing assistance and a path to American citizenship.

While the eligible population is expected to be relatively small, the plans being discussed by U.S. officials could offer a lifeline to some Palestinians fleeing the Israel-Hamas war, which local public health authorities say has claimed the lives of more than 34,000 people and displaced hundreds of thousands of civilians in Gaza.

Images on social media showed what appeared to be burn marks on an outer wall of the synagogue building, next to a window.

Israel's ambassador to Poland, Yacov Livne, said the synagogue was the only one in Warsaw to have survived <u>World War Two and the Holocaust</u>.

UN 2.0 Coming This Fall - Setting The Stage For Global Government

The United Nations will meet in September for the 79th session of the UN General Assembly, as well as the highly-anticipated "Summit of the Future" where nations will sign the so-called "Pact for the Future". The Pact is



expected to call for declaring a "planetary emergency". What does this agreement and its policies mean for the future of individual and national sovereignty?

By the end of September, the United Nations member states may vote to radically alter the UN itself, what some are calling UN 2.0, and the very nature of how nation-states make decisions regarding the future of the planet. The UN will convene for the 79th session of the General Assembly in New York City starting on September 10th in New York City. The high-level general debate will begin on the 24th of September.

Although the UNGA is an annual meeting, this year's gathering will be unique because of the addition of the Summit o the Future, a UN sponsored event taking place in NYC on the 22nd and 23rd of September. The summit has been in the making since at least 2022. It is the latest attempt by UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to "rally the troops", and garner more support for a rapid completion of the Agenda 2030 goals set by the UN in 2015.

In May 2023, Guterres revealed that efforts to complete Agenda 2030, and the corresponding Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), were failing. Guterres warned that only 12 percent of the SDGs were on track to be completed. He said progress on 50 percent of the goals is "weak and insufficient", while 30 percent of the SDGs have "stalled or gone into reverse". He predicted that if the current trend holds only 30 percent of nations will accomplish SDG1, focused on poverty, by 2030.

Guterres has called for "greater multilateral support for the UN development system and decisive action at the 2024 Summit of the Future".

"I urge you to study the report and implement its proposals," Guterres stated. "This will be a moment of truth, and of reckoning. It must also be a moment of hope - when we unite to turn the tide and kickstart a new drive for SDG achievement."

Our Common Agenda: The Summit for the Future

In June 2020, as the United Nations marked the 75th Anniversary of the creation of the international body, member states released a declaration that included 12 overarching commitments relating to Agenda 2030 and a call for Secretary-General Guterrres to issue his own set of recommendations for achieving the goals. This declaration included statements like "We will leave no one behind" and "We are determined to implement the 2030 Agenda in full and on time. There is no alternative".

In September 2021, the Secretary-General responded with his report, Our Common Agenda, which called for accelerating the implementation of the SDGs and the commitments contained in the UN75 Declaration. Our Common Agenda also called for a Summit of the Future to "forge a new global consensus on readying ourselves for a future that is rife with risks but also opportunities". The UNGA agreed to hold the Summit on September 22nd and 23rd of this year.

The Common Agenda report called for a "renewal of trust and solidarity at all levels - between peoples, countries and generations". The report also called for a "fundamental rethink" of our political, economic and social systems "so that they deliver more fairly and effectively for everyone". Finally, the report recommended a "renewal of the multilateral system" and stated that the Summit of the Future would be the "defining moment" to set new agreements for these goals.

The UN website dedicated to The Common Agenda states, "Our Common Agenda is an agenda of action, designed to strengthen and accelerate multilateral agreements - particularly the 2030 Agenda - and make a tangible difference in people's lives."

Secretary-General Guterres' Our Common Agenda report was the direct inspiration for the upcoming Summit for the Future. The Summit will continue the push for nations to "reaffirm existing commitments" to the SDGs and the UN Charter. Member states will be expected to build on the outcomes of the 2023 SDG Summit and "breathe new life into the multilateral system" to accomplish the Agenda 2030.

According to the Summit for the Future website, the summit is a "once-in-a-generation opportunity" to address gaps in global governance. "Multilateral governance, designed in simpler, slower times, is not adequate to today's complex, interconnected, rapidly changing world," the website states.

Additionally, a UN document on the Summit of the Future titled, What Would it Deliver?, discusses the concept of an updated UN, or "UN 2.0", and what it would be mean for the future.

"'UN 2.0' is about upgraded expertise in innovation, data, digital, foresight, and behavioural science to enhance UN System results, help build similar Member State expertise, and accelerate shared progress towards the SDGs."

The document also calls for "A Global Financial System That Works For All".

"A transformed international financial architecture is fit for purpose, more inclusive, just, representative, effective, and resilient, responsive to the world today rather than as it looked following the Second World War. This architecture invests up-front in SDGs, climate action, and future generations."

These calls mirror similar ones made during the "Summit for a New Global Financing Pact" held in Paris, France in June 2023. The Summit, led by French President Emmanuel Macron, welcomed 50 heads of state, representatives of NGOs and civil society organizations to discuss the effort to reset the international financial system as part of the continued push towards the 2030 Agenda and Net Zero goals.

The French government stated that the objective of the gathering was to "build a new contract between [the global] North and South" which will better equip the nations to fight poverty and climate change. The summit was attended by US President Joe Biden, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, and Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva. In addition to heads of state, the summit was organized with support from the Open Society Foundations, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and the Rockefeller Foundation, among others.

One of the other stated goals of the 2023 summit was to transform the entire international financial system by adapting the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank to modern challenges. These goals correspond with recent statements made by Guterres where he called for a "new Bretton Woods moment", referencing the infamous 1944 international agreement that established the IMF, and adopted rules for governing monetary relations among independent states, including requiring each nation to guarantee convertibility of their currencies into U.S. dollars.

For those reading between the lines and seeing through the buzzwords, the language of these documents rings of globalist-speak intended to override or outlaw national and individual sovereignty in favor of world government. A new monetary system, a renewal of the multilateral system - all of this is designed to sell the public on the idea that the UN (or some new international body) is needed to take humanity safely into the future. In truth, we are likely to see major steps towards the creation of a one-world government at the Summit for the Future.

For example, the Summit of the Future website notes that it will conclude with a "Pact for the Future" which will be endorsed by heads of state at the Summit. The UN says the outcome of the Pact will be "a world - and an international system - that is better prepared to manage the challenges we face now". The Pact for the Future is likely to be another piece of the shift towards a world governed by unelected internationalist politicians. The Pact for the Future

The UN says the aim of the Summit for the Future is to "accelerate efforts to meet our existing international commitments" and "take concrete steps to respond to emerging challenges and opportunities". With these goals in mind, the UN is planning to negotiate and endorse an "action-oriented outcome document" known as the Pact for the Future. The document is already being discussed at UN meetings, with final negotiations and signing of the agreement to take place in September at the Summit.

In January, Germany and Namibia, co-facilitators of the Summit, announced the release of the "zero draft" of the Pact for the Future. The proposals mostly repeat what is found in the UN 75th anniversary document, and the Our Common Agenda report. The document makes it clear that the member states "re-affirm the importance of the multilateral system" with the UN at the center. The zero-draft also reiterates the UN's 75th anniversary declaration to "leave no one behind".

"We will act with urgency to realize the vision of the 2030 Agenda, including through the agreements contained in this Pact, a surge in financing for the Sustainable Development Goals, and additional steps to ensure sustainable financing in line with our commitments under the Addis Ababa Action Agenda of the Third International Conference on Financing for Development," the draft of the Pact for the Future reads.

In terms of "reinvigorating the multilateral system", the draft says the UN will "commit to a vision of a multilateral system" that is "inclusive to allow for a diverse range of actors beyond States". This statement appears to be a reference to the belief that individual nation-states are no longer capable of tackling international crises, and, thus, the world must adapt to new forms of governance.

The zero-draft also mentions the need for an "Emergency Platform" that would be activated in the event of "such a shock that has an impact on multiple regions of the world" and, according to the UN, requires a "coherent, coordinated and multidimensional response".

The draft also claims that any Emergency Platform would "not be a standing institution or body". The UN also claims the "decision to convene an Emergency Platform" would "fully respect the sovereignty, territorial integrity and political independence of States".

The discussion of an emergency platform plays right into calls for the declaration of a planetary emergency. **The Planetary Emergency**

Over the last couple years, the phrase "planetary emergency" has become increasingly used by the United Nations and aligned organizations to describe their belief that the planet is passing from various states of crisis to emergencies from which humanity might not return, unless drastic action is taken. We have even seen the release of opinion pieces calling for "a formal declaration of a 'planetary emergency' by the UN General Assembly at the Summit of the Future in September and the activation of an 'emergency platform'".

The calls for declaration of an emergency have also reached the White House. Last week, Bloomberg reported the Biden administration is considering declaring a climate emergency.

"White House officials have renewed discussions about potentially declaring a national climate emergency, an unprecedented step that could unlock federal powers to stifle oil development," Bloomberg wrote.

White House spokesperson Angelo Fernandez Hernandez told Bloomberg that Biden "has treated the climate crisis as an emergency since day one".

As Bloomberg notes, if Biden does declare an emergency, he would not be the first US president to do so. In fact, past presidents have declared national emergencies for various reasons. However, calls for a so-called climate-emergency declaration are unprecedented.

In recent years, UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres has even used the phrase and warned that the world was approaching one or more "tipping points", or emergencies, which must be addressed by the UN member states. In November 2020, he told the World Forum for Democracy, "Alongside the COVID-19 pandemic, we face a triple planetary emergency--a climate crisis, a nature crisis and a pollution crisis."

"We also confront a planetary emergency - including accelerating climate change, growing pollution and collapsing biodiversity - threatening the environment on which everyone's future depends. And we are witnessing an alarming spread of hatred and discrimination," Guterres said in 2021.

The United Nations is not the only organization promoting the idea of declaring a planetary emergency. UNaffiliated organizations like the Climate Governance Commission (CGC) are also getting in on the fun.

In September 2023, during climate week and the UN SDG Summit, the CGC released a statement titled "Charting a Safe Path for a Workable Future". It states:

"The world faces a deepening planetary emergency-and is on a reckless path toward catastrophic climate change-having already over-stepped six of nine scientifically-identified planetary boundaries. A continued failure to address the underlying causes of this emergency - such as fossil fuel-based economies, resource waste/ overconsumption, and the destruction of nature - will have further devastating effects for all of humanity, triggering potentially irreversible tipping points, with dangerous consequences for planetary stability, both social and ecological. A system-wide approach to solving the climate crisis is required now, ensuring reliable climate and planetary boundary governance for the Earth as a whole."

The CGC claims it is focused on "developing, proposing, and building partnerships" which promote "feasible, high-impact global governance solutions for urgent and effective climate action to limit global temperature rise to 1.5°C or less". The CGC is itself a part of the Global Governance Forum.

The Climate Governance Commission was convened by Maja Groff, a member of the Global Governance Forum, with extensive connections to technocratic, including the Rockefeller Foundation, who have helped finance the work of the CGC. This makes perfect sense when you recall that in 2023 the Rockefeller Foundation made it clear that the climate agenda was their new focus.

The CGC September 2023 statement also continues the call for expanding concepts of global governance. "New perspectives on global governance - deploying new levels of collective wisdom and political courage - are required to tackle current existential planetary risks," it states.

The statement also includes the usual climate alarmism and doomsday predictions. The CGC says the world may have only six or seven years to change course to avoid disaster.

The Climate Governance Commission followed up this statement with their report, Governing Our Planetary Emergency. The report was released during an online event on November 28, 2023, just before the

opening of the UN Climate Change Conference COP28. In this report, the CGC continues their recommendation for updating our ideas on governance.

"A basic premise of the Climate Governance Commission is that new perspectives on global governance-deploying new levels of collective wisdom and political courage--are required to tackle current existential planetary risks," the report states. "Such efforts should complement and enhance ongoing intergovernmental negotiations. By prioritizing fundamental global collective action innovations, we can protect our common home for present and future generations in a just, equitable, and sustainable manner."

It is this writer's belief that the "new levels" of "political courage" needed to implement "new perspectives on global governance" are referring to the fact that empowering the UN (or another international body) will be extremely unpopular with the domestic populations of many of the UN member states, including the United States.

For more evidence that the CGC and some at the UN are interested in moving past national sovereignty, and towards a world governed by global organizations, I refer you to statements made by scientist Johan Rockström, a member of the CGC and advocate of the planetary emergency paradigm, during the November 2023 online event.

"The fact that we are in the anthropocene, actually puts into question the nation-state as the only unit of decision making to solve the problems we have facing us," Rockström stated.

In the section labeled "Near-Term International Governance Innovations" the CGC again says the UN should declare a planetary emergency.

"We therefore urge the UN General Assembly, at the 2024 Summit of the Future, to declare a planetary emergency, recognizing that the triple planetary crisis poses a grave risk to global stability and security, among others, to be reinforced in similar statements by bodies and agencies of the UN system, regional bodies, and national and local governments."

They also echo calls for the "Emergency Platform" referenced by the zero draft of the Pact of the Future. The report recommends convening a "Planetary Emergency Platform" to address the rapidly accelerating consequences of climate change.

"Such a defragmentation and acceleration Platform may be necessary to ensure the imperative 50% global emission reductions by 2030," the CGC report states.

In a section titled "Addressing Individual Responsibility for Environmental Crimes: Including Ecocide as a Crime Under the International Criminal Court", the document states that "individuals involved in policies and/or activities that cause severe damage to the environment need to be held accountable regardless of whether they undertake these actions as government officials, legislators, military leaders, CEOs of corporations, or in other roles".

In a section titled "Next Generation Working Proposals" we also see a recommendation to "Establish An International Court for the Environment".

Is it possible to see the world's governments sign a document that empowers an international court to punish individuals who are deemed polluters or accused of damaging the environment?

Planetary Boundaries

"The current crossing of planetary boundaries has already caused intense suffering and heightened inequality," the CGC's September 2023 statement reads.

The Pact for the Future and the CGC's report Governing Our Planetary Emergency are both built on the concept of planetary boundaries, first popularized by Johan Rockström, former director for the Stockholm Resilience Centre. He first developed the idea with a group of 28 internationally renowned scientists in 2009.

Rockström is an internationally recognized scientist on global sustainability issues and led the development of the Planetary Boundaries framework for human development. He is also a leading scientist on water resources, with more than 25 years experience in applied water research in tropical regions. Additionally, he is an agenda contributor to the World Economic Forum.

Rockström's concept presents a set of nine planetary boundaries within which humanity can continue to develop and thrive for generations to come. According to this theory, the Earth's Planetary Boundaries indicate the "maximum human-induced disruption" each environmental area can sustain before the "Earth system becomes unstable, potentially leading to irreversible changes and cascading effects in multiple domains".

Essentially, Rockström argues that these boundaries should be used as guides to design future governance models, as well as governmental regulation of corporations, industry, and human life in general. It is yet another technocratic program claiming that it can create a utopia by triggering an emergency platform once humanity crosses these alleged boundaries.

As with calls for a planetary emergency, in recent years support for the concept of planetary boundaries has grown among academia, science, and some politicians. Along with the growth of Rockstrom's concept, we have also witnessed broad support for global governance.

In 2023, an international group of 22 "experts" from a range of fields emphasized the importance of establishing a "planetary commons" in an article published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. The group argued that this step is essential for strengthening global governance to "protect the functions of Earth's biophysical systems in ways that ensure planetary resilience and justice for present and future generations".

The article introduces the concept of "planetary commons" as a framework to align global law and governance with the science of the "Earth system". The so-called experts write that there is "presently no effective governance system in place" to properly deal with the crises facing humanity. The paper laments that nations have developed their own policies for climate change which are "often misaligned with other nations and the global goal of a sustainable Earth". The report ends by calling for the development of "collective global-scale solutions that transcend national boundaries".

All Roads Lead to The Club of Rome and Eugenics

We can trace the call for a Planetary Emergency back to the infamous but obscure group, the Club of Rome. The CGC's November 2023 report even notes that the belief in a "polycrisis", or multiple, simultaneous crises, is "recognized in the work of the Club of Rome Planetary Emergency Project". This reference to the Club of Rome reveals yet another reason the public ought to be concerned with the push for a planetary emergency and claims of crossing planetary boundaries

The Club of Rome has been calling for declaring a Planetary Emergency since at least 2019 with the publication of their "Planetary Emergency Plan". The report would be updated in August 2020, after the beginning of COVID1984. The COR's Emergency Plan is described as a "roadmap for governments and other stakeholders to to shift our societies and economies to bring back balance between people, planet and prosperity".

As with the zero-draft of the Pact for the Future and the Climate Governance Commission's 2023 report, the Club of Rome calls on nations to declare a Planetary Emergency and adopt a Planetary Emergency Plan. They say such a plan should be "founded on the urgent need to at least halve greenhouse gas emissions by 2030".

These extreme calls for reducing greenhouse gas emissions, especially carbon, have lead some researchers to conclude that the guiding philosophy of the Club of Rome is actually a belief in eugenics, masked by a faux environmental agenda. An understanding of the organization's history may provide some clues.

The Club of Rome was founded in 1968 and played a major role in the development of the more well-known World Economic Forum (WEF). On the 50th anniversary of the WEF, the organization looked at their history, and noted that at the 1973 meeting, Aurelio Peccei, the Italian industrialist who co-founded the Club of Rome with Alexander King, presented a speech on his now-infamous book "The Limits to Growth". Alexander King was also responsible for a follow-up report released in 1991 titled "The First Global Revolution". This controversial report includes a section called "The Common Enemy of Humanity is Man", which contains this often-quoted section:

"In searching for a new enemy to unite us, we came up with the idea that pollution, the threat of global warming, water shortages, famine and the like would fit the bill. In their totality and in their interactions these phenomena do constitute a common threat which demands the solidarity of all peoples. But in designating them as the enemy, we fall into the trap about which we have already warned, namely mistaking symptoms for causes. All these dangers are caused by human intervention and it is only through changed attitudes and behaviour that they can be overcome. The real enemy, then, is humanity itself."

Some readers have interpreted this statement to mean that the Club of Rome was acknowledging that they would use the fear of pollution, global warming, water shortages, and famine to unite humanity behind the idea that humanity is the problem. The Club of Rome and their supporters claim this passage is taken out of context and simply represents their leadership recognizing geopolitical issues which would soon befall humanity.

Further evidence of the eugenics worldview can be found in the words of Dennis Meadows, a World Economic Forum member and co-architect of the 1972 "Limits to Growth" report. In a February 2022 interview, Meadows detailed his hopes for a "clean" purging of the global population to sustainable levels:

I hope this occurs in a civilized approach. I imply in a non-public approach. A peaceable approach, however, peace does not imply everyone seems to be joyful. But it surely does imply that the street has been resolved by different means, not violence, which is what I imply. So there are 7 billion folks proper now; however, we're going to have 1 billion folks. We now have to return down. I hope it occurs slowly and evenly."

Eugenicists like Meadows and his buddies at the Club of Rome hide their anti-human ideology behind calls for population control. Their talk of "fighting climate change" by limiting human movement or controlling our diets and other personal habits often mask their true desire to reduce and control the human population.

It is imperative that people of the world open their eyes and ears to realize the true intentions of the Technocrats who want to rule our lives. As Swedish researcher Jacob Nordangård recently told me in a recent interview, the UN (and their partners in the WEF, Club of Rome, Global Governance Commission, etc.) are working on declaring a "planetary emergency" which will allow them to activate various agreements--the WHO Pandemic Agreement, the Financing Pact of the Future, and the Pact of the Future--and complete their plans for world government.

The only thing standing in the way of the complete takeover of a free humanity are the free hearts and minds of the world who are able to see the truth. We must resist and counter the UN Pact for the Future. We must put our energy into designing our own pacts for the future. Furthermore, we must reject the Sustainable Development Goals and embrace Autonomous Development Goals. Finally, we must ignore "The Great Reset" and build "The People's Reset". Only once we put our energy into the creation of parallel systems will we see the creation of a truly free society that will last for the next seven generations and beyond.
