
LEARNING IN THE AGE OF COVID

During the closure, employees from our maintenance, custodial, school nutrition, and transportation departments were heroic. Due to their efforts we were able to continue to provide meals for students, deliver necessary technology, keep our buildings and buses sanitized, and complete necessary repairs and maintenance. Our teachers and administrators worked throughout the summer to prepare for virtual teaching and learning [in] our SCS University - Virtual Edition all summer to prepare for the school year. Altogether, they completed over 10,000 hours of professional development. We are proud of how well they have adapted during these challenging times. The best thing that the community can do to help us right now is to follow the mitigation strategies outlined by the Virginia Department of Health. Wearing masks, social distancing, washing hands frequently, and avoiding large, indoor gatherings are all strategies that help us bring students back and keep them in school.
