Around Ontario County, you have probably noticed historical markers. They are often blue signs, plaques, or statues, that commemorate the countless local historical events or figures. We will bring this history to new life with the incredible technology of Augmented Reality (AR). Through the creation of a web-based program and an app, when people visit the historical markers, a story will be told through a narrator or a 3-d animation or another unique approach. The story will provide a teaser to a more in-depth story of what happened at that location and how the viewer can find out more. In addition to promoting travel by linking the signs in special interest categories, it will also be an innovative, fun, and engaging way to share it with others and bring the personalities of these individuals to life once again. This project is the result of a grant to Ontario County tourism in cooperation with Ontario County and a Market NY CFA. FLVC is just awarding a creative contract with a Rochester Based creative agency called STQRY. They will work closely with the FLVC team and the professors and students at the Magic Studios at RIT and the historical community of Ontario County. FLVC will be announcing an open house to share the top 70 or so sites whose stories will be told through the AR process.
