Gail announced that Brookside has a new website. It's the same address, everything is transferred and it's much easier to use than the old site.

Brian said they won't be back in session till Jan. Nothing new going on. He spoke at length about the county losing the property along Rt.4. The Christiana School District got a new superintendent.

Bill Foster spoke how he would have liked a Boys Club to go on that property. The Transition Team thought it was a good spot but the county messed up.

Mr. Dash mentioned the grading from the Old Newark Rd. Project was to steep to mow.

Donna announced the amnesty day went well. We collected \$3500.00 and will now proceed with collections and liens. With two audits currently being done we will not be doing a third one.

A resident ask about a breakdown of the cost of recent purchases, repairs & upcoming services.

The zero turnaround, fuel tank, a new air conditioner, a new septic system, cameras, and a reserve study yet to be done.
