

## Varsity Prospects

Stronger in dual meets but weaker in the sectional and national meets -- that's a quick analysis

of the 1954 SC varsity track team.

The loss of the Big Three -- Jack Davis, Parry O'Brien and Sim Iness -- will force Coach Jess Mortensen to relay upon many come-through performances in order to retain the NCAA team title that SC has held for the past five years and for 17 of the past 28 years. This departed trio scored 48 points in the national collegiate meet at Lincoln last June, which was more than enough to take the title. In all, the men who scored 66 out of SC's winning 80-point total will not be back this spring. Ernie Shelton and Jim Lea are the only returning point scorers.

Conversely, Illinois, runner - up for the title a year ago, has 22 of its 41 points coming back in additional to several stars of previous years.

The return of little Joe Graffio and the addition of Coast Guard veteran Howard Bugbee insures SC of top sprint talent. Bugbee ran 9.6 as a prep in 1948, while Graffio equalled that time twice last season. Bugbee should be very strong in the furlong this spring, bettering his previous best of 21.5. Sophomore Pat Coyle and senior Rod Wilger will back up this pair.

Lea, who captured the NCAA 440 title with ease in 47-flat last season, will be out to retain his laurels this year and will probably run either the 220 or low hurdles also. His best efforts in these events(21.1 and 23.3 so far) would likely place him high in the nationals also. Sophomore Mike Larrabee, along with Wilger and jaycee transfer Howard Smith will give the Trojans another strong mile relay quartet.


SC will be fairly strong in the half - mile for the first time in several years, due to the running of Bill Taylor, who clocked 1:54.7 in junior college last year, as well as Ernie Amador, an ineligible freshman in '53, and versatile Marty Montgomery.

Sophomore Fernando Ledesma should be a standout in the mile and two-mile this year, and he'll have plenty of help. Ledesma ran 4:16.8 and 9:16.4 last year, both close to national freshman records. Montgomery, Chuck Beeman, George Root, Dick Adams and Dave Bungay should all run well at both a mile and two miles this spring.

SC will not be strong in the hurdles with only one man, Willard Wright, of proven ability. If he can shake the injuries that bothered him last year, he may better his 14.2 and 23.8 times. John Morgan and Henry Ketels are the other hopes in the highs.

Mortensen hopes to get three good low hurdlers out of a group that includes Wright, Morgan, Ron Loy, broad jumper Lou Bortolin and pole vaulter Dwight Chambers. All have run close to 24-flat. Lea may have to fill in in the lows.

Off his tremendous sophomore season, Ernie Shelton could well become history's first seven-foot high jumper. Ernie did 6' 9 7/8" for an S C record last

summer and averaged better than  $6\,^{\circ}7\,^{\circ}2^{\circ}$  in 22 European meets. Basketballers Jack Findley and Dick Hammer

are the only other prospects.

Two sophomors, Jon Arnett and Lou Bortolin, appear to be excellent broad jump prospects. Arnett did 23'11" for the Trobabes last spring, while Bortolin did 23'8 3/4" and 24'3/4" with a wind for San Mateo J C. Arnett's jumping will be indered by a four-week spring football practice from March 15 to April 10. He is fine halfback prospect.

Mort has plenty of pole vault talent available. Walt Levack and Dick Richards did 13'6" for the frosh last spring, while Dick Hecht and Chambers are also

over 13 feet.

The Trojan discus situation is abnormally strong despite the graduation of Iness and O'Brien. Leon Patterson, who bettered 166 feet as a frosh, and Des Koch, who has also thrown beyond 166 feet, should be consistently in the 170-foot area this spring. Smith and Sherwin Sosnovsky are 150-plus throwers.

O'Brien's dpearture and Patterson's wrist injury leave S C without a top shot hope. Patterson did 51'8½" last year, but has given up the shot due to a wrist injury, which does not affect his discus throwing. Sophomore Fred Edwards along with Al Barry, Hillard Torgan and Sosnovsky should pick up second and third place points, but not many blue ribbons.

It is hoped that Doug Maijala, a junior college transfer with a 198 2" mark, can fill the shoes of Dick Genther, NCAA javelin champ. Novice Corky Phillips and the versatile Koch give depth in the spear

throwing event.

So, despite the loss of three Olympic record holders, another national champion and supporting talent such as Verle Sorgen and Mannie Ronquillo, Jess Mortensen appears to have another great Trojan track team in production.

## Coaching Staff

HEAD COACH JESS MORTENSEN

Jess is in his fourth season as SC's track and field coach with three NCAA championships and a perfect dual meet record while guiding the Trojans.

Born in Gila, Ariz. on April 16, 1907, Mortensen was one of Troy's greatest all-around athletes in the 1927-1930 period. He took over the reins in 1951 when Jess Hill moved into the head football job that spring. Mort was serving as track and field-and with good success--coach at West Point.

He came to SC in the fall of 1927 after a fine athletic record at Gila Academy in Thatcher, Ariz., and at Gila Junior College. Competing in football, basketball and track he once scored 26 points during a single afternoon in the 100, high hurdles, javelin, high jump, shot put and discus.

Upon arriving at SC he won himself a starting basketball berth, led the PCC (southern division)in scoring and made the conference team. The following spring he barely missed the US Olympic team in the decathlon, placing fifth in the final tryouts.

Mort again repeated on the conference hoop all star team and was a starting halfback on the Howard Jones teams of 1929 and 1930. In 1929 he won first place in the NCAA javelin at  $203^{\circ}73/4^{\circ}$  and was the track captain in 1930 when he won the National AAU title with his all-time best of  $204^{\circ}113/4^{\circ}$ .

Following graduation in June, 1930 he took the coaching assignment at Riverside Junior College. In the spring of 1931 he competed in his last decalh-lon and set a new world's record in the National AAU ten event test at Lincoln, Nebr. with a tremendous tally of 8166.663 (under the old table which was revised in 1936). Under present figures the score is worth 6545.

He was declared ineligible for further amateur competition because of his coaching duties and for fourteen years handled football, basketball, track, and baseball at Riverside. He developed many stars including the famous 880 relay team--it ran 1:25.6-and included Hovis Bess, Finley Culpepper, Bryant Allen and the great Clyde Jeffrey.

After serving in the Navy Pre-Flight program-he was discharged in 1946 as a lieutenant, (senior grade)-he returned to Riverside and was dean ofmen and head football coach. He moved to Denver U. in 1947 and coached two unbeaten frosh football teams, and gave Denver its' first track title in 1949.

From there he moved to West Point in January, 1950 where he developed the late Dick Shea, an outstanding distance and cross-country runner. At the Helsinki Olympic Games he had the pleasure of witnessing four of his Trojans win medals including a pair of Gold Medal winners in Parry O'Brien and Sim Iness in the shot and discus, Jack Davis and Silver Medal in the high hurdles and Art Barnard, a Bronze Medal winner in the same event. In addition a Denver pupil, Jerry Biffle, won the broad jump.

Jess is married to the former Irene Ross, and they have two children--Anne 15 and Ross 12--while the family home is in South Pasadena.

#### ASSISTANT COACH GRAY BERG

Gray is working with the SC distance men this year while he is preparing to enter dental school in the fall. If he can improve his runners as much as he improved himself, he will be a great success as a coach.

He came to SC in 1947 after a term of service in the Air Force. He had graduated from Amon Carter-Riverside High School in Fort Worth, Tex., where he

did not compete in track.

As a Trojan freshman he barely broke twelve minutes in the two mile. However, he kept coming out and training and by his senior year, 1951,he pushed his time down to 9:22.0, which made him one of the nation's best two-milers. He was voted the Paddock Award as the team's most-improved athlete that year.

Gray graduated from SC in June of 1951. Since that time he has been doing time studies for the Chrysler Corp. He started back to school last fall to prepare for SC Dental School.

## FRESHMAN COACH JACK DAVIS

Jack is coaching the freshmen on a voluntary basis this year so that he may retain his amateur standing. His goal is an Olympic title and world

record in the high hurdles.

Davis is one of the all-time great hurdlers and is the only man ever to win three NCAA high hurdle championships. He is co-holder with Harrison Dillard of the Olympic record for the 110-meter highs at 137 which he did in finishing inches behind Dillard at Helsinki in 1952. Jack got a measure of revenge for that loss this year when he ended Dillards 37-race win streak in the indoor National AAU meet, although he had never previously run on boards.

Last year as a senior at SC he ran three 13.6 races with the aid of a slight wind and ran 13.8 and 22.8 without wind aid. He won 38 out of 39 races last year. Jack has never missed a race because of illness or injury and has never failed to finish a

race.

He graduated from Hoover High in Glendale in 1949. He had marks of 14.4 and 19.2 in the hurdles and  $23.9\frac{1}{2}$ " in the broad jump.




#### BIOGRAPHIES

DICK ADAMS, two-mile

HS: Salem, Or., 1951. Turned in 4:25.8 race in Oregon AAU for best prep time. Was eligible for the varsity as frosh but didn't fare too well. Before hurting foot turned in 9:37.0 eight-lapper at Stanford. Stayed out of cross-country to rest foot and appears headed for good year.

ERNIE AMADOR, 880

HS: Villanova Prep, 1952. Was runnerup in 880 in State meet in 1:58.2. Ineligible as frosh last year but did do 51.5 and 1:59.8 in open competition. Ran cross-country last season at Santa Monica City College with good success. Has lots of speed along with endurance and may be big surprise. Will probably be fourth man in mile relay combine.

JON ARNETT, broad jump

HS: Manual Arts (Los Angeles), 1952. Was upset winner in City meet with 22'8 3/4" on poor Coliseum pit as prep. Started off with 23'11" leap but hurt heel in late April when he was readying himself for best efforts. Managed to comeback for second place tie in Coliseum Relays and won JC-Frosh class blue ribbon at California Relays. In all seven performances past the 23' mark. Was All-City grid "Player of the Year" in 1952 and starred on Trobabe eleven last fall.

AL BARRY, shot put

HS: Beverly Hills, 1948. Average prep putter with best of 49'10 1/2". Competed on '49 frosh and remained out in 1950-51. Put on Spartans (JV) during 1952 with best of 49'8 1/2". Bad back kept '53 best down to 48'9 3/4. Lettered as guard on championship '52 football team. Has 50' potential.

CHUCK BEEMAN, mile

HS: San Bernardino, 1950. Turned in fair half mile of 2:02.2 as prep. Spent two seasons at both 880 and mile at San Bernardino Valley College with 1:57.0 as top mark. Ran much of last season before discovering broken bone in foot. Had exceptionally good cross-country season and showed fine shape by running 4:21.9 in mid-February. Possible two-miler.

LOU BORTOLIN, broad jump and low hurdles
HS: San Mateo, 1952. Best known as a prep hurdler with 14.9 and 19.5 timings. Did broad jump in some meets with 22'11 1/2" best. Concentrated when he went to San Mateo JC on it and begin at 22' last ne went to San Mateo JC on it and begin at 22' last season. Didn't get over 23' until May 2 at the Big Seven Conference meet with 23'l 1/4" jump. Big win came the following week when he went 24'3/4" to win the West Coast Relays (JC division) and followed it with 23'8 3/4" to take State JC crown. Ran the low hurdles in 24.2 and will help out there. Could be NCAA point getter along with Teammate Jon Arnett.

HOWARD BUGBEE, 100 and 220

HS: Redondo, 1948. Was great prep sprinter in senior year, turning in 9.6 and 21.5 marks and winning CIF (So. Section) title in 100, third in 220. Beat Bill Fell of Compton and John Bradley of Glendale Hoover in taking century. Had windy times of 9.5, 21.0. Second in State 100, fourth in furlong. Was at Stanford as frosh in 1949, ineligible at SC in '50 and in the Coast Guard '51, '52, '53. Shows signs of regaining old form and may be top sprinter.

DAVE BUNGAY, two-mile

HS: Glendale, 1951. Best prep mile was 4:49.0 and improved at Glendale JC to 4:29.0 and 9:51.0 in taking second in State JC two-mile. Illness slowed him down last year with best of 9:56.4. Clocked a 4:27.2 mile in mid-February and appears ready for a great improvement.

TWIG CHAMBERS, pole vault and low hurdles
HS: Phoenix, Ariz., 1952. Twice State champion in vault with 13\*1/4" top. Correction of vaulting fault slowed him down as frosh with 12'6" performance best last year. Turned to low hurdles and surprised with 24.2 clocking. Could be best there.

PAT COYLE, 100 and 220

HS: Redondo, 1952. Best high school times of 9.8 and 21.5. Didn't reach peak until mid-year as frosh due to excess weight. Ran legitimate 9.7 100 in getting second to Jim Decker at UCLA and did 220 in 21.5. Got to finals in West Coast Relays 100 in open division but didn't place. Very reliable.

FRED EDWARDS, shot put

HS: Visalia, 1953. Best competitive prep mark was 52'8 3/8" as junior and was hurt most of senior year although he had practice marks over 55'. Did 48'9" as frosh and was just hitting stride in event when spring football claimed him. Trick left shoulder has ended grid career. Has stuff to top 52'.

JOE GRAFFIO, 100 and 220

HS: Huntington Park, 1950. Had windy prep 100 of 9.6 and 21.2 furlong but ran legitimate 9.8, and 21.8. Spent two seasons at Compton College and won State JC 100 title in 1951 and West Coast Relays in 1952. Won all dual meets except for hairline loss at UCLA. After windy 9.6 in NCAA heat ran legit 9.6

in third place effort at Ann Arbor and then at Dayton whe he earned fifth in National AAU. Ran great 21.7 around curve at Ann Arbor and will run it more often this season.

DICK HECHT, pole vault

HS: Los Angeles, 1950. Vaulted 12' as prep in winning Western League title. Spent frosh year at Santa Monica City College and improved to 12'11 1/4" that season. Did 13' as soph and 13'4" as junior -and tied for fourth in PCC vault. Seems to be more serious this season and could be real help in event.

DES KOCH, discus and javelin

HS: Reed (Shelton, Wash.), 1950. An All-America prep discus ace with a 165'10" best with lighter high school platter. Recorded marks as a freshman of 47'10 1/4", 151'6" and 178'11" in the weight events. Moved up to the varsity and improved them to 49'9", 166'3" and 181'2". Always behind fellow Trojans Iness and O'Brien, but did get third in PCC meet and sevenths in NCAA and Final Olympic Tryouts. With the same duo back last season Des saved a year and competed unattached. Although limited in meets he improved to 166'10 5/8" and had a throw of 173' in practice. Is threat for NCAA honors in disc and a potential 200 footer with the spear.

MIKE LARRABEE, 440

HS: Ventura, 1952. Primarily a sprinter as a prep with 10.1 and 21.5 times, finishing third spot in CIF (So. Section) furlong. Best 440 was 51.2 in high school. Showed rapid improvement as Trobabe -starting off with 51.4 race and winding up with the breezing 49 flat race at UCLA. Followed it up with his second 220 of the year in 21.2. Ran a 48.9 leg on the leadoff of a distance medley and beat Valley 440 man Clarence Anderson, the State JC champ, during leadoff of sprint medley.

JIM LEA, 440 and low hurdles

HS: Roosevelt (Seattle, Wash.), 1950. Ran 9.8 and 21.2 as prep and was "sold" on Troy by sprinter Jim Abbott who also came to SC from Roosevelt. Had fine frosh year with marks of 9.9 and 21.1 plus low hurdle clocking of 23.3. Switched to 440 as sophomore but success was not immediate. Won UCLA go in 48.5 but didn't make PCC trip. Went to NCAA championships and surprised all by running 47.2 (for 400 meters) and placed third. Won NCAA last year hands down in 47.0 around two curves. Lost only two 440s on American soil last year--both to J.W. Mashburn-in eleven starts. Mashburn is now at Oklahoma A&M and ineligible for the NCAA. Lea will try 440 with low hurdles in NCAA which double has been turned by Glenn Hardin of LSU in 1933-34 and Elmore Harris of Morgan State in 1944. Lea plans to be the third.

FERNANDO LEDESMA, mile and two-mile

HS: Compton, 1952. Won State title in record 4:23.2 as senior after getting second as junior. As

Trobabe last spring was unbeaten in dual meets and broke both frosh distance records in his last meets with 4:16.8 in SPAAAU and 9:16.4 in Compton Invitational. Placed second both times in wiping out the 4:17.7 by Roland Sink and 9:28.2 by Lou Zamperini. His two-mile mark was fastest ever by a native American college freshman. Only half mile was a 1:56.1 anchor to win the sprint medley in the Coliseum Relays. Will divide time between two events where he is considered equally outstanding.

WALT LEVACK, pole vault

HS: Manual Arts (Los Angeles), 1952. Finished second in the City and fourth (tie) in the State at 12'9", his best vault. Had a fine dual meet season on the frosh last year with no worse than firsts or ties for same after a third in the first meet. Got over 13'6" in a triangular meet and then repeated in California Relays, Compton Invitational and the SPA AAU meets. Extensive gym work during the fall has built him up quite a bit. Showed early signs of a fine year with 13'9" vault in early February.

RON LOY, low hurdles
HS: Alhambra, 1951. Ran prep 180 lows in 19.3 and placed fourth in State meet. Did 24.0 as frosh on varsity in '52 but sufferedc recurrent leg hurts that limited him to 24.5 clocking last year. Short-legged but has no trouble with stride on hurdles.


DOUG MAIJALA, javelin and high jump

HS: Casa Grande, Ariz., 1951. Was State high hurdle champ with 14.3 best and was low hurdle runnerup at 19.4, in addition to a 9.7 century (windy) race. Did 15.0 and 24.5 as frosh eligble for varsity competition. Slipped to 15.3 and 25.1 in 1953 and ran 49.4 mile relay leg. Headed for good year.

LEON PATTERSON, shot put and discus

HS: Taft, 1952. First prep to put 12 lb. shot over 60' with best of 60'9 7/8" for a National Interscholastic record. Also tossed prep platter for 177'5" and did 49'10 3/4" and 150'10" with college implements in open competition. Has a good freshman year with a 51'8 1/2" best throw and five other meets over the 50' mark. Tossed discus 166'11 3/8" for second best ever by college freshman. Over 160' on two other occasions. Fall weight-lifting schedule has given him much greater strength as workouts in early season has shown. Practice flips of 178' and 175' indicate big things for the blond soph.

CORKY PHILLIPS, javelin

HS: Glendale, 1947. Never competed before in track. Was "discovered" in gym class by NCAA champ Dick Genther. Has played baseball and developed as an outfielder a strong arm. Is taking to event in quick fashion and may well be a 190 footer.

HILLARD TORGAN, shot put and discus

HS: Classical (Providence, R.I.), 1949. Copped State honors with 50'6" shot mark and 137'10" throw with college disc, and also tossed 12 lb. hammer as prep 163'10". Turned in 49'2" mark at Modesto last year and hurled the platter 140'6 1/2". Has picked up added strength through fall weight-lifting.

DICK RICHARDS, pole vault

HS: Los Angeles, 1952. Did 12'6" as prep and took third in City meet. Was wrong-footed vaulting ace thru high school and was switched over as frosh last year and made amazing progress with 13'6 vault before measles sidelined him. Powerful arms should push him to greater heights this season.

GEORGE ROOT, mile

HS: Corvallis, Or. Won State prep crown while turning in best of 4:30.2. Best frosh time, 4:24.6 in winning UCLA meet. Has scored two upset wins in past two years in Cal meet and last season ran best time of 4:18.3. Worked hard during cross-country-he had good season -- and should be ready for best.

ERNIE SHELTON, high jump

HS: Washington (Los Angeles), 1951. Very consistent prep leaper with five marks over 6'5" and a best of 6'5 1/8" (twice). Placed second in the National Junior AAU. Spent freshman year at Valley JC and won State JC title with best of 6'42". Off toa slow start last year he hit stride at Fresno with a 6'7 1/2" leap. Beat World Record Holder Buddy Davis at Coliseum Relays at 6'7 3/4", tied him the following night at Modesto and then was on his way. Rolled over 6'8" and 6'8 1/2" prior to NCAA. Lost heel spike on jumping shoe while attempting 6'8 1/8" and was forced to settle for fourth. Scored big win at Ann Arbor in PCC-Big Ten meet when he cleared standards at 6'9 3/4". He toured Europe and won all 22 meets with a better than 6'7 1/2" average. Set new SC record of 6'9 7/8" (actually 6'10 1/8" but Finns refused to split centimeters) at Turku, Finland. Is determined to become history's first seven foot man this spring.

HOWARD SMITH, discus HS: Marshall (Los Angeles), 1951. Didn't take up platter until moving to Los Angeles City College as event wasn't on prep program and did hurdles in high school with only moderate success. Reached to 145'l" last year and got fourth in State JC meet at Visalia. Ran relay leg in 49.5. Has practice disc marks of over 164° and is real comer in event.

SHERWIN SOSNOVSKY, shot put and discus

HS: Roosevelt (Los Angeles), 1951. Had put of 55'1 1/2" as prep and nabbed fifth in State meet as senior. Stayed out in '52 but competed last season at East Los Angeles JC. Did 47'll 3/8" in shot and 150°2" in discus, placing third in the state in the latter. Has reached 160° in practice and improving BILL TAYLOR, 880

HS: North Hollywood, 1951. Mediocre prep half miler with top mark of 2:06.9. Went to Valley Junior College as frosh and improved under ex-Troy 880 man Jim Slosson to 2:00.0 to get second in State JC meet. Continued great improvement last year, shaving time down to 1:54.7 and finishing second in the State meet. Expected to drop times considerably.

ROD WILGER, 440

HS: Beverly Hills, 1950. Primarily 220 man as prep with 22.4 best clocking. Concentrated on furlong on frosh with 21.5 mark. Did 10.1 and 21.9 as soph, 10.0 and 21.4 as junior last year. Will concentrate on 440 and should be a very good man. Will continue on sprint relays and of course mile relay. Is expected to break 49.0 in new event.

WILL WRIGHT, high and low hurdles

HS: Redlands, 1950. Was prep high hurdle star with 14.2 topper which beat Glendale's Steve Turner for CIF (So. Section) title. Did 180 lows in 19.3. Ran 14.7 and 23.8 as frosh and then moved up to the varsity and trailed Jack Davis for two years. Fifth in NCAA and National AAU as soph and seventh in the Final Olympic Tryouts with best of 14.3. Ran 14.2 behind Davis at Tucson last year and then hurt leg. Injury hung on all year although he wound up with a 14.4 and 23.8 performance at Ann Arbor and a fifth in the National AAU. Is ready to come in to own as Davis is now departed.

#### TROJAN CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 48 SC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1921. The names of 10 Trojans appear in the current record book.

OLYMPIC GAMES: SC trackmen have won twelve individual Olympic titles and have shared in nine relay victories. Thirty-five men have won a total of fifty-seven places on US Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: SC has won seventeen out of twenty-four NCAA meets competed in since its beginning in 1923. Five times they have finished second. They won nine in a row (1935-1943) and the last five years (1949-1953). They have won fourty-seven individual championships and hold seven meet records.

NATIONAL AAU CHAMPIONSHIPS: SC men have won a total of fifty-three National AAU senior individual championships since 1905 and won thirty-five individual junior championships before the meet was dropped in 1952.

IC4A CHAMPIONSHIPS: SC competed thirteen times from 1924 to 1939, winning nine times. SC men won thirty-seven individual championships and still hold two meet records although resigning membership following the 1939 meet.

PACIFIC COAST CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS: SC has been undefeated in the meet since 1928, and has won the last thirteen times. This includes eighty-nine individual titles while meet records in seven of the fifteen events are held by Trojans.

#### FRESHMAN PROSPECTS

Frosh coach Jack Davis has on hand one of the strongest Trobabe track teams in the school's history, but also has one of the toughest schedules to face.

Only in the weight events, where Troy has had talent to spare in recent years, does the freshman team show a weakness. Even though this weakness may cause the frosh to lose a meet or two, there are at least a dozen men on the squad who will be valuable additions to the varsity next spring.

Darryl Ellingson with 9.7 and 21.3 high-school clockings and Don Risinger at 10.0 and 21.5 appear to be fine sprint prospects, while tall Lanny Quigley should become an excellent quarter-miler. His best high school time was 50.2.

Davis has four good half-milers in Murray Coburn(1:56.2), Bert Purdue(1:58.7), Buddy Cole(1:59.4) and Phil White (2:00.6). Coburn should be a standout 440-man also, having run 49.8 already.

The lone distance candidate, Chuck Tobias, has run 4:28.5 and 9:58.0 for the mile and 2-mile, both good performances.

Top hurdle prospect is Wayne Bithell who has run the college highs in 14.9. He is backed up by Gary Silman and Paul McCuistion who have marks of 14.6 and 14.8 for the 39-inch hurdles.

Rock Burgoyne cleared 6'3" in high school in

the high jump and should become a standout in that event. McCuistion has a jump of 6'l".

Basketball star Jim Kaufman may be the team's best broad jumper. He has done 21'5'2" while George Dieudonne has jumped 21'11" and Bill Jacobson 21'8".
National high school record holder Ron Morris

is already thinking about 15 feet in the pole vault. He did 13'll2" in high school. Bob Voiles cleared

12'10 1/4" at El Monte High last spring but a knee operation has curtailed his vaulting somewhat. This will keep him busy with the weights and javelin and he may have a future with the spear. His season is to be interrupted by spring football. He'll reach about 44', 130' and 165'. Jerry Goldberg will lend help in the weights, but he, too, has a bad knee.

The Trobabes should field a top-notch mile relay team and an exceptional two mile team. For the shorter one they'll go with Coburn (48.5 relay), in the anchor spot plus Quigley (50.2), Cole (51.0 re-lay), Purdue (51.7 relay) plus sprinters Ellingson and Risinger. They'll shoot for California's frosh mark of 7:52.3, best on record, and have a good--in fact outstanding chance -- of beating it. With Coburn (1:55.3 relay), Purdue (1:58.7), Cole (1:59.4) and White (2:00.6), they can do it with stiff pushing.
