

JOHN McKAY

Director of Athletics



John H. McKay, 48, head football coach and newly appointed athletic director at the University of Southern California continues to distinguish himself as one of America's most successful and respected football coaches.

McKay has served since 1960 as head coach and has announced that he plans to continue coaching while directing the athletic program at the University.

McKay's Trojans have won two national championships

(1962 and 1967), finished in the "Top Ten" in wire service polls seven times, won six Pacific-8 championships and appeared in the Rose Bowl five times, winning three of the five games.

Twice—1962 and 1969—USC teams under John McKay have been undefeated. The 1962 team was 11-0 and the 1969 team was 10-0-1, Both won Rose Bowl games.

McKay is a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Assn.

In the 57-year history of the Rose Bowl, only one coach—John McKay—has had a team qualify for four successive trips to the Bowl.

McKay came to USC in 1959 after having served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of Oregon, since his graduation in 1950. McKay served as an assistant under his college coach Jim Aiken and remained at Oregon under Len Casanova upon Aiken's retirement.

He joined the staff at USC in 1959 and became the Trojans' 16th head coach in 1960.

McKay served in the Air Force following high school before enrolling at the University of Oregon where he starred at halfback for the Ducks during the 1948 and '49 seasons. McKay led the Fighting Ducks in scoring during the 1948 season with eight touchdowns.

The McKay and Norm Van Brocklin-led Oregon club went 9-1 during the regular 1948 season and lost to Southern Methodist in the Cotton Bowl. McKay earned All-Coast first team and all-America honorable mention recognition. He was drafted by the New York Yankees of the old All-American conference following the 1949 season but decided, instead, to pursue a career in coaching.

McKay married Oregon co-ed Nancy Hunter of San Berardino and the couple now have four children (Michele, 20; John Jr., 19; Theresa, 17; and Richard, 13) and reside in Covina, a Los Angeles suburb.

VERN WOLFE

Head Track Coach

Vern Wolfe began his USC coaching career by capturing the 1963 NCAA track championship and has continued winning ever since.

In 1971, Wolfe guided the Trojan tracksters to their fifth undefeated season in dual meet competition in his nine years at USC. He has coached the Trojans to five NCAA championships and two seconds and three Pacific-8 titles.

While capturing three conference titles in the always-tough Pacific-8 is an impressive achievement, even more impressive is the fact that Wolfe has had five teams undefeated in dual meet competition. No Wolfe-coached team has lost more than two meets in any one season.

Wolfe's collegiate coaching records stands at 84-5-1, including undefeated seasons at San Jose State in 1961 and Foothill Junior College in 1962, His USC mark is 67-5-1.

Wolfe took over the coaching reins from Jess Hill, who was also the athletic director. Hill had served in an interim capacity after the death of Jess Mortensen just as the 1962 season was beginning.

Under the popular Wolfe, USC has enjoyed the highest reputation in collegiate track. Wolfe-coached Trojan athletes have won 16 individual NCAA championships and have broken or tied every USC individual track and field record. Fifteen of his Trojans have either broken or tied 24 indoor and outdoor world records.

Wolfe has also achieved acclaim in international track and field circles. Eleven of his athletes have performed in the Olympic Games, and three have won gold medals, Rex Cawley (400-meter hurdles, 1964), Dallas Long (shot put, 1964) and Bob Seagren (pole vault, 1968) each won a gold medal in the Games and Lennox Miller (110 meters, 1968) won a silver medal.

But what Wolfe is proud of most is that 90 percent of the track athletes he's coached have graduated from USC, way above the average for college students.

While attending USC himself, Wolfe competed for the Trojans as a pole vaulter.

Vern and his wife Marilyn live in Rolling Hills. They have two sons, Corey, 18, and Dean, 16.

KEN MATSUDA

Assistant Track Coach

Vern Wolfe's right-hand man, and a respected coach in his own right, is Ken Matsuda, assistant track coach at USC.



The popular assistant also serves as the cross country coach and has a 39-5 career record.

Matsuda is now in his sixth season as assistant coach at USC. He came in the summer of 1966, following a successful coaching tenure at Foothill College in Northern California.

A graduate of San Jose State, Matsuda was one of Los Angeles' most sought-after

prep athletes when he graduated from Westchester High School. At Westchester, Ken earned varsity letters in football, track and baseball, each of the four years he was in school.

After a brief stay at Santa Monica City College Matsuda transferred to San Jose State where he earned two letters as a Spartan halfback, also competing as a sprinter and long jumper on the track team.

Matsuda and Wolfe first worked together in 1961 when the Trojan head coach was on the staff at San Jose State.

The 35-year-old Matsuda and his wife Janet live in Torrance with their two children, Jo Ann, 13, and Michael, 11.

THEO VILTZ

Assistant Track Coach

Former Trojan football and track standout Theo Viltz joins the track coaching staff this season.

Viltz placed fourth in the high hurdles in the 1964 NCAA championships and third in 1965. He won the high hurdles in 1965 Pacific-8 championships.

The new Trojan track assistant also played on the Trojan football team for three years and for the Houston Oilers for two years as a defensive back.

Besides his track duties, Viltz teaches at Long Beach High School where he is an assistant football coach under another former Trojan, Troy Winslow.

A graduate of Serra High in Gardena he attended Compton Junior College before coming to USC where he majored in education.

Theo and his wife, Stanley, have a daughter, Raven, 2.

1972 OUTLOOK

With most of last year's collegiate dual meet champion and NCAA runner-up team returning plus a talented group of newcomers, Vern Wolfe is extremely optimistic as he beains his 10th season as USC track coach.

"The 1972 Trojan track team has excellent team spirit and confidence," says coach Wolfe. "Track buffs would say we have talent to match our enthusiasm."

An impressive array of sprinters and hurdlers head a strong all-around team. Returning sprinters Willie Deckard and Leon Brown and hurdlers Lance Babb and Bob Coffman will be bolstered by an exceptional pair of newcomers, Donald Quarrie and Jerry Wilson.

Deckard, the defending Pac-8 100 and 220 champion, recorded the fastest sprint times in the world last year, 9.2 and 20.2, in a dual meet against UCLA. Brown was not far behind with bests of 9.4 and 20.9 and a fourth place finish in the NCAA 100-yard dash finals.

The addition of Quarrie may give the Trojans the best sprint trio in collegiate history. The junior from Jamaica tied a world record of 19.8 in the 200 meters and was undefeated last year in the 200 meters and 220-yard dash. He won three gold medals at both the 1970 Commonwealth Games and the 1971 Pan American Games with sprint wins combined with the sprint relay.

Defending NCAA champion in the 440-yard relay, USC has even a faster quartet than last year when the Trojans clocked 39.2 for the fastest time of the year in the United States and second fastest in the world. Newcomer Quarrie will team with Deckard, Brown and either Babb or Garrison to threaten the world record of 38.6 held by the 1967 Trojan team.

The Trojans also have their best ever group of high hurdlers in Babb, Wilson and Coffman. Babb, fifth in the NCAA and Pac-8 champion, and Wilson, the California junior college champion, both ran 13.4 last year, third fastest in the world. Coffman, who also runs the low hurdles, set a USC freshman record of 14.0 a year ago.

In the 440, veteran standout Garrison will be joined by two outstanding freshmen, Tony Krzyzosiak and Earl Richardson. Garrison finished second in the NCAA and ran the third fastest time in the world with a 45.4 win over UCLA's John Smith last year. Krzyzosiak won the state high school 440 championship in 46.7 for the best prep time of the year, while Richardson ran 47.2 as a junior and then was injured his senior season.

Leading the middle and distance corps is Rick Carr, an NCAA finalist in the mile with a best of 4:03.6. Adding strength will be veteran halfmiler Nathan Burks, halfmiler Steve Crane, distance runner Fred Ritcherson and junior college transfer distancemen Tom Lipski and Steve Brown. Ritcherson suffered a broken leg and missed most of last season after finishing fourth in the NCAA six-mile as a freshman.

Field event strength should come from NCAA point scorers Larry Hollins second in the high jump, and Doug Lane, fifth in the shot put. But there will be excellent balance provided by improved veterans and several promising newcomers.

Pac-8 high jump champion Hollins (7-01/4) will be joined by Finnish import Johannes Lahi (7-1) and returnee Dean Owens (6-9). Owens is much improved since switching to the Fosbury-flop style.

1972 OUTLOOK

Lane $(64-0 \frac{1}{2})$ will also compete in the discus this season. Adding depth in the weight events will be state high school shot put champion Mark Stevens, whose 67-2 was the nation's second best high school mark.

Although Henry Hines has completed his eligibility, the long and triple jumps will be well represented by talented freshman Randy Williams and experienced senior Henry Jackson, Williams, from Edison High in Fresno, posted the nation's best high school marks in the long jump (25-4 $\frac{1}{2}$) and triple jump $(52-3\frac{1}{2})$ and had a wind-aided long jump of 26-3. Jackson (24-9 and 51-8) will also compete in the 440-yard intermediate hurdles (52.3) and decathlon.

The pole vault will have good depth with three veterans returning. Scott Cryder (16-8), Robert Pullard (16-8) and Jim Cochran (16-0) are all capable of 17 feet, according to Wolfe.

One event where the Trojans will be vastly improved is the javelin. Newcomers Andy Barnet (255-0) and Rich Ram have the potential to score in the NCAA meet, Wolfe believes.

USC may also score in the NCAA in the decathlon with Jackson, Swedish newcomer Bo Sterner and Bob Coffman all excellent prospects.

Coach Wolfe concludes: "Our team has good balance and should be a strong dual meet team, capable of competing on an equal basis with any team in the country. As many as six strong teams throughout the country figure in the fight for NCAA honors, including the Trojans. If our speed events, relays and other top individuals come through the Trojans will have a shot to make it 27 NCAA track and field championships."

INDIVIDUAL BIOGRAPHIES

(Note: The following biographies are limited to those performers expected to see the most action this season. For each performer, the first mark is his 1971 best, the second is his lifetime best in the event indicated.)

LANCE BABB — Sr., Hurdles (13.4, 13.4)

World class hurdler with jet start . . . must add strength to his hurdle talent . . . loves to compete, good Olympic team candidate . . . ran on NCAA Championship sprint relay team . . . defending Pac-8 champion in high hurdles.

ANDY BARNET — Sr., Javelin (—, 255')

Strong arm, has potential to threaten strona Pac-8 throwers and score in the NCAA.

LEON BROWN — Sr., Sprints (9.4, 9.4; 20.9, 20.9)

Late season surge in 1971 produced good sprint times, including a 9.2 wind-aided 100 . . . placed 4th in 100 yard dash in NCAA . . . hard working, has ability to run better and surprise track buffs . . . comes on under pressure and in the big meets.

NATHAN BURKS — So., 880 (1:51.5, 1:51.5)

Ran his life best against UCLA . . . gained valuable experience last year . . . has talent, should run under 1:50 and hopefully run on the mile relay team.

RICHARD CARR — Sr., Mile (4:04.9, 4:03.6)

Finalist in the NCAA mile run last year . . . has the experience to help him strive to be the first Trojan to break the four-minute mark.

STEVE CRANE — Sr., Mile (4:08.2, 4:07.6)

Excellent talent for middle and distance runs . . . needs consistency and experience . . . had good fall programs, is expected to run with anyone in the conference and do well in NCAA meet.

JAMES COCHRAN — Sr., Pole Vault (16-0, 16-0)

Must break into the 16-6 group to score . . . has good speed and strength, can be helpful all the way to the NCAA.

BOB COFFMAN — So., Hurdles (14.0, 14.0; 52.5,

Broke the freshman hurdle record with a best of 14.0 . . . must develop his intermediate hurdle talent, faces a rugged assignment in the highs . . . may surprise in the decathlon.

SCOTT CRYDER — Sr., Pole Vault (16-8, 16-8)

Is expected to break into the 17-foot class . . . strong, good technician and tough competitor . . . vaulted 16-8 in the Southern Pacific AAU Championships for his best.

WILLIE DECKARD — Sr., Sprints (9.2, 9.2; 20.2, 20.2)

Pac-8 Sprint champion in 1971, world class sprinter with best marks of 9.2, 20.2 . . . strong relay runner . . . has had good fall program and experience to make it to the Olympics this year . . . teaming with Don Quarrie gives the Trojans sprint strength unequalled in Trojan history.

EDESEL GARRISON — Sr., 440 (45.4, 45.4)

Has placed three years in the NCAA Championship . . . fall program indicates maturity and eagerness to develop all potential for Olympic year . . . will run sprint relay, quarter and mile relay . . . should have great year . . . ran his lifetime best of 45.4 in the UCLA dual meet last year.

LARRY HOLLINS — Sr., High Jump (7-01/4, 7-01/4)

Came on in the big ones last year, 2nd in the NCAA and Pac-8 Champion . . . can jump over seven feet consistently . . . is expected to have an excellent year with the Pac-8 experience behind him, a tough competitor.

HENRY JACKSON — Sr., Triple Jump (51-8, 51-8)

Is expected to develop into first-class triple jumper and may score well in the decathlon.

TONY KRZYZOSIAK — Fr., 440 (46.7, 46.7)

One of the school's best ever quarter-mile prospects, state high school champion in the 440 last year with time of 46.7 . . . can triple and long jump well . . . great competitor, hates to lose.

DOUG LANE — Sr., Shot Put (63-21/2, 64-01/2)

Good fall program, one of the nation's many premium shot putters . . . no limit on potential, personal desire the key to Doug's success.

TOM LIPSKI — Jr., Distances (13:58.5, 13:58.5)

Hard working, had a good cross country season . . . helps shore up the distance corps, has talent, good competitor.

ROD McNEIL — Jr., Hurdles (14.3, 14.3)

Has always had excellent potential as a high hurdler but spring football has prevented Rod from developing . . . fully recovered from an injury to his hip, if he is excused from football Rod can run well.

DEAN OWENS — So., High Jump (6-6, 6-9)

Recently converted to the Fosbury flop and doing well . . . may surprise the track world . . . no limit to his potential, is expected to score well all year.

ROBERT PULLARD — So., Pole Vault (16-8, 16-8)

Sophomore with great potential . . . works very hard, can really help the squad by breaking into the 17-foot club . . . has desire and experience, should have a great sophomore year.

DONALD QUARRIE — Jr., Sprints (9.3, 20.2; 9.3, 20.2)

Proven world class sprinter . . . had three gold medals in the British Commonwealth Games and three in the Pan American Games . . holds the world indoor 100-yard dash record at 9.3 . . . tied the 200-meter world outdoor record at 19.8 and ran 10.1 in the 100 meters in the Pan-Am Games . . has temperament, poise and pride to run even better . Don's trademark is that of coming on in the big ones.

RICH RAM - Jr., Javelin (-, -)

Limited experience but dedicated worker . . . as season progresses, Rich may surprise people, he has size, strength and a good arm.

Fred RITCHERSON — So., Distances (—, 13:45.5)

Great freshman year climaxed by scoring 4th in the NCAA six mile with a time of 28:36.8 . . out his sophomore year with a broken leg . . . finished cross country season strong and hopes to regain his first-year strength and score high in the NCAA six-mile run.

EARL RICHARDSON — FR., 440 (—, 47,2)

The Trojans are fortunate to land two excellent freshmen quarter-milers . . . Earl can run with anyone, has speed, strength, desire, all the tools . . . was Junior Olympic champion as an 11th grader, running 47.2 . . . makes the quarter and mile relay look promising.

MARK STEVENS - Fr., Shot Put (67-2 h.s.)

Had great senior year in high school, winning the Calif. state championship with a put of 67-2 . . . should have no trouble with the 16-pound shot, will give the Trojans a good 1-2 punch in the shot . . . just learning the discus but fall practice indicates some surprises in that event.

LYNN SWANN — So., Long Jump (23-101/2, 24-10)

Good long jumper, he will also compete in the triple jump . . . has all the physical qualifications to compete in the Pac-8 but spring football may put a damper on his jumping progress.

KEVIN TODD — Jr., Triple Jump (48-9, 48-9)

Has background and strength to help the Trojans in '72 . . . also competes in the long jump.

RANDY WILLIAMS — Fr., Long Jump (25-4 $\frac{1}{2}$, 25-4 $\frac{1}{2}$)

Best jumping prospect in Trojan history . . . Calif. state champion in the long jump with a 26-3 jump . . . has speed, needs leg strength, will develop into a world class performer.

JERRY WILSON — Jr., Hurdles (13.4, 13.4)

Two-time Calif. J.C. champion, ran 13.4 in the AAU championships . . . working to potential, Jerry has the size and speed to run with anyone . . . expect great things from Jerry and Lance Babb in the high hurdles this year.



HERITAGE

CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 60 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 17 individual Olympic titles and have shared in ten relay victories. Fortynine men have won a total of 74 places on United States Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of 41 NCAA meets competed in since its beginning in 1921. On nine occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). A total of 78 individual hampionships highlight the record.

NATIONAL AAU CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC trackmen have won 81 individual senior AAU championships.
