ON THE COVER

Sophomore sprinter Darwin Cook (left) and senior pole vaulter Dave Kenworthy (right) are USC's two returning NCAA point scorers.

Kenworthy's vault of 17-11 $\frac{3}{4}$ at the NCAA Championships topped a field that included seven 18-foot vaulters.

It was the 14th NCAA individual title won by a USC pole vaulter, the most individual winners in one event by any school.

Dave also set a USC all-time record with a leap of 18-2 $\frac{3}{4}$ at last year's National Sports Festival.

Cook, the only freshman to make the finals in the 100 meters at the 1982 NCAA meet, finished a respectable fifth (10.21). Darwin's career best in the 100 (10.20), the 17th fastest time in the world last year, came at the California Relays. In the 200, Darwin ran a personal best of 21.00 in the heats at the Pac-10 Championships.

1983 OUTLOOK

There are no world-ranked athletes on the USC men's track and field team this year, but the youthful Trojan squad still includes some talented individuals who form the nucleus of a team that may sneak up on people in 1983.

Coach **Vern Wolfe** and his top aide **Ken Matsuda** return only six letter winners off of last year's team which placed 12th at the NCAA meet and sixth in the Pac-10.

Heading the list of returnees are senior pole vaulter **Dave Kenworthy** (18-2¾) and sophomore sprinter **Darwin Cook** (10.20, 21.00).

Kenworthy, the school record holder in the vault, surprised a lot of folks last spring when he topped a field of seven 18-foot vaulters to capture the NCAA title.

Cook, the only freshman to make the 100-meter finals at the 1982 NCAAs at Provo, Utah, placed a respectable fifth.

Two other NCAA meet participants return: **Anthony Caire**, the school record holder in the high jump (7-2½), and long jumper/triple jumper/hurdler **Ed Tave** (25-9½, 49-7¾, 14.92). Both will be sophomores this year.

The Trojans took only a six-man squad—three of them scored— to the NCAAs last year, making the 12th place finish a rather remarkable feat! The two losses from that small contingent were hurdlers **Milan Stewart** (13.46, 51.01), the sixth-ranked high hurdler in the world in 1982, and **Philip Johnson** (13.85, 48.84, 400). Stewart won the 110 highs to give USC two individual titles.

One can only speculate how good last year's team might have been. **James Sanford** (10.02, 19.94, 45.77), the world's No. 1 ranked sprinter in 1979 who redshirted in 1981 in order to be eligible for last year's Pac-10 and NCAA Championships, never ran because of a slow healing stress fracture in his left foot.

The Trojans also had four outstanding athletes ruled academically ineligible prior to the season: hurdler **Tonie Campbell** (13.44, 50.28), ranked eighth in the world in the highs in 1982, 400-meter runner **Bill Green** (10.25, 20.51, 45.07), ranked No. 8 in the U.S. in 1981, 400-meter runner **Mike Turner** (20.80, 45.48), ranked 10th in the U.S. in 1982, and sprinter **Mike Sanford** (10.26, 20.88), James' younger brother.

Two seniors round out the list of returning letter winners: middle distance runner **Mark Handelsman** (1:45.3, 3:53.4), who clocked 1:46.5 last summer to tie the school record in the 800 meters, and pole vaulter **Bubba Kavanaugh** (17-1½).

Other members of last year's team who return include senior javelin thrower **Dave Armstrong** (170-6), sophomore **Chris Crisman** (15.24, 53.82) and freshman **James Knowles** (54.54) in the hurdles, sophomore pole vaulters **Paul Peters** (15-10) and **Doug Owens** (14-6) and soph **Timmie Ware** in the 400-meter dash (47.69). **Brad Meinhardt**, who long jumped for the Trojans in 1981, also returns (23-3¾).

The list of newcomers is rather lengthy. There are 18 new faces this season, including 14 freshmen, giving USC needed depth and versatility.

"The difference in this team compared to the last few we've had is the number of walk-ons (12) and the talent they possess," said Wolfe, now in his 21st year at the USC helm.

Walk-ons are critical to the success of a track team since the NCAA allows only 14 scholarships for a sport that has nearly two dozen events.

The addition of more athletes, even though they're young and inexperienced, has the optimism level rising at Troy.

"We've added talented people in the field events, the decathlon and the speed races," added Wolfe. "If everything clicks we could be strong in the relays and have a better balanced team than we've had the last few years."

In the field events, the new people include: junior **Hank Kraychir** (65-4, 183-9) and freshman **Walt DeJean** (57-9hs) in the shot, freshmen **Rick Luiten** (193-8hs, 55-5½hs) and **Randy Kendrick** (169-3hs) in the discus, freshman **Mike Phipps** (14-6) and junior **Lyle Esterkyn** (14-6) in the pole vault, and junior **Mike Patellos** (165-6) in the javelin.

Kraychir, a transfer from Long Beach City College, is the national junior college record holder in the shot and won both the discus and shot at last year's state JC meet. Luiten had the eighth best discus throw by a U.S. prep last year. Phipps was the CIF 4-A champion in the vault last spring.

Two promising decathletes, junior **Darren Hall** (7144) and freshman **Mike Gonzales** (6668), could score at the Pac-10 meet, according to Wolfe.

Hall, a transfer from Shasta Junior College, won the state JC title last year. Gonzales holds the national record for the 16-and-under age group.

Freshmen **Luis "Pancho" Morales** (10.41, 20.82), **Terry Ivey** (10.45, 21.3, 46.77), **Aaron Clark** (21.8, 48.6) and **Dwight Williams** (48.8) will try to uphold the great tradition of Trojan sprinters.

Morales was a *Track & Field News* high school All-American last year and had the No. 2 U.S. prep time in the 100 meters (10.41) and the sixth best mark in the 200 (20.82). Ivey had the sixth best prep time in the 400 meters in 1981 (46.77).

Freshman **Geoff Norton** (37.1 330 lh) will run the 400-meter intermediate hurdles.

In the middle distances, the Trojans have two fine prospects in freshmen **Don Young** (1:51.0) and **Jim Fisher** (1:52.84). Young had the 10th best time by a U.S. prep last year in the 800 while Fisher won the 800 at the CIF 2-A Championships.

A number of Trojan football players, who must work around spring football practice, could figure prominently: flanker **Timmie Ware** (mentioned earlier) is an outstanding 400-meter runner and could help out with the relays. Freshman linebacker **Ron Brown** (13.80hs, 21.7 200) had the seventh fastest time by a U.S. prep in the highs last year. Freshman wide receiver **Lonnie White** (21.7, 53.8 400 IH) is a sprint candidate.

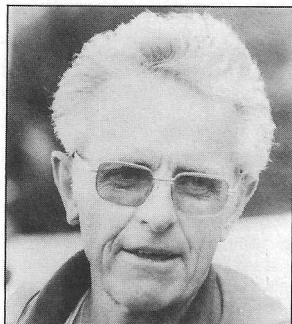
The Trojans lost a number of other performers from last year's team, besides those already mentioned. They include sprinter **Timmie White** (10.96, 21.78), a starting flanker on the football team last fall, 400-meter runners **Rod Bethany** (46.02) and **John Zunino** (48.14); middle distance runners **Scott Cox** (1:49.2, 3:51.7) and **Bill Jackson** (1:52.4, 3:57.4), intermediate hurdler **Chris Fank** (54.63), high jumper **Matt Ross** (6-11), javelin thrower **Barron Rutherford** (243-11), and pole vaulters **Chuck Suey** (17-0) and **Bert Johnson** (16-6).

VERN WOLFE

Head Coach



When the subject of USC head track coaches comes up, the logical descriptions that follow are superlatives like legendary, highly successful, winningest and so on.

That's because USC has dominated track and field more than any one university has in any single sport. The Trojans have won 26 team titles in the 61-year history of the NCAA Outdoor Track Championships, 30 Pacific Coast or Pac-10 titles (including a string of 15 straight), and 38 unbeaten and untied seasons (including a streak of 16 in a row).

First, there was the legendary Dean Cromwell, who began the winning tradition with a record 12 NCAA titles and a dual meet record of 109-48-1 in 38 years.

Then came the perfectionist, Jess Mortensen, whose Trojan teams never lost a dual meet in his 11 years and 64 meets and captured seven national outdoor crowns.

Now, it's Vern Wolfe carrying on the heritage. His teams have contributed seven NCAA titles (five outdoor, two indoor) to place Wolfe tied with Mortensen as the third winningest coach in NCAA Championship history.

USC has always been near the top under Wolfe, if not winning. The Trojans have finished among the top four teams in the NCAA Outdoor Championships 13 of his 20 years—six firsts, two seconds, three thirds and two fourths. And with just a six-man squad at last year's NCAAs, Troy finished an amazing 12th.

Wolfe has a career dual meet record of 103-14-1 (.877) at USC. He also coached undefeated seasons at San Jose State in 1961 and Foothill College in 1962. He has never lost more than two dual meets in any one year.

USC has won the team title in the Pacific-10 Conference, the nation's toughest track league, five of the last 11 years, giving Wolfe eight Pacific-10 crowns in his career. His 1976 team holds the conference record of 182 points in a Pac-10 Championship meet.

Wolfe has also led the Trojans to eight undefeated seasons in dual meet competition and four national collegiate dual meet championships (1971, 1976-78) since *Track & Field News* began those rankings in 1970. He was honored as Track and Field Coach of the Year in 1979 by both the Columbus Touchdown Club and *Runner's World*.

During his tenure at USC, Wolfe has coached 24 athletes who have broken or tied 30 indoor and outdoor world records. At every Olympics since he became USC coach, except the 1980 Moscow Games, at least one of his athletes has won a gold medal. He's had six Olympic champions, including 200-meter champion Don Quarrie in 1976.

Vern's athletes also have won 29 individual NCAA championships and have broken or tied every USC individual record.

Wolfe was born in Garber, Okla. on July 14, 1922. He graduated from Gardena High School in Los Angeles and won honors as an All-Marine League back in football and in track as a pole vaulter.

He then entered USC, winning a letter with the 1941 frosh track team and the 1942 varsity squad, before being called to military duty. Following three and one-half years with the Paratroops, he was discharged in 1946 and came back to school. He vaulted for Cromwell again in 1947 and 1948 (with a best of 14-0) and also obtained his bachelor's and master's degree in education.

Graduating in 1949, Wolfe began his coaching career in 1952 at Torrance High School. He was there three years, then moved on to North Phoenix High School in Arizona for the 1955 season. It was during his six-year reign at North Phoenix that he achieved recognition as one of the nation's most successful prep track and field coaches.

Wolfe has again taken up pole vaulting and competes in senior meets. He won his age division in the Senior Olympics in Georgia four years ago and placed second in the 55-59 age group at the Veterans Games in New Zealand in January of 1981 with a 10-foot vault.

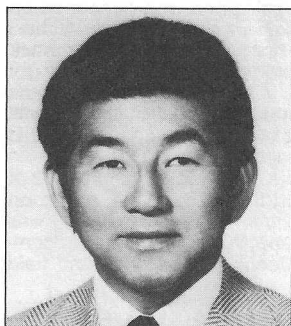

KEN MATSUDA

Assistant Coach



Wherever Ken Matsuda has coached, his track teams have enjoyed extraordinary success. Starting his 26th year of coaching, Matsuda has been on the losing side in dual meets only 12 times.

Matsuda is now in his 17th season as an assistant to Vern Wolfe at USC. He came to USC from Foothill Junior College where he was head coach for three years and his team members set four national JC records. Among his athletes was former decathlon record holder Russ Hodge.

A graduate of Westchester High School locally, Matsuda was a sprinter and long jumper at San Jose State and also earned two letters on the football team as a halfback.

He began his coaching career in 1957 as an assistant track coach at San Jose State to Bud Winter, who has been a U.S. Olympic coach. His freshman teams were ranked No. 1 in the nation twice during his four years there. He coached under Wolfe there when Vern became San Jose's coach in 1961.

Matsuda then became head track coach at Andrew Hill High School for two seasons where his teams went undefeated before moving to Foothill JC. His pole vaulter, Bill Fosdick, went on to USC and won an NCAA title.

During his career, 12 of his long jumpers have bettered 25 feet. Matsuda has also coached the Trojan sprint relay teams to nine NCAA titles and 10 Pacific-10 wins.

Last summer he began work with the Korean National team and will assist them in preparation for the 1984 Olympics. He also guided the USA team to victory in the World Junior Championships at Seoul, South Korea, last August.

He and his wife, Janet, have two children—a daughter, JoAnn, and a son, Mike.

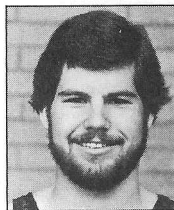

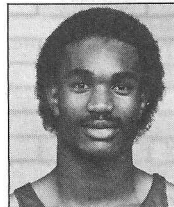
DAVE ARMSTRONG — 6-3, 205, Sr., Javelin — Last year was Dave's first at throwing the javelin competitively. His best mark came at the Aztec Invitational where he threw 170-6.

"Dave had some problems with injuries last fall," said Wolfe. "If he's completely healed he could throw in the 230-foot range."

Armstrong transferred to USC in the spring of 1980 from Fullerton JC and walked on the Trojan team last year.

At Fullerton High, Dave played football (tight end and strong safety) and baseball (outfield). Fullerton won the 1978 CIF 3-A baseball title his senior year.

He's a business major at USC.



RON BROWN — 6-5, 210, Fr., Hurdles — A reserve linebacker on the Trojan football team, Ron could be a big asset to the depleted Trojan hurdling corps if spring football practice doesn't interfere.

"Ron is an excellent hurdles prospect," said Wolfe. "I'm very high on him even though he has to divide his talent between football and track."

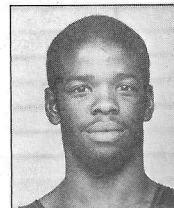
Brown had the seventh fastest U.S. prep 110-meter high hurdles time last year (13.80). That came in a third-place finish at the California state meet.

He was instrumental in Bishop Amat of La Puente's victory at the CIF 2-A Championships last spring. Ron won the 200 meters (21.52w), was second in the highs (14.22) and ran on Amat's winning 400 and 1600-meter relay teams.

Ron ran 14.04 in the highs at the CIF Masters Meet to place second. He set a meet record at the Arcadia Invitational with a 14.04 clocking in the highs and also ran the 300-meter low hurdles in 37.96. Ron ran the third leg on Bishop Amat's 1600-meter relay team which finished second at the state meet (3:14.83). His best time in the 100 meters was 10.80 as a junior.

Last fall, Ron saw action on the specialty teams and as a reserve outside linebacker on the Trojan football team. He was credited with 12 tackles, including one for a two-yard loss.

He's an engineering major at USC.



ANTHONY CAIRE — 6-2½, 175, So., High Jump — Anthony had an outstanding freshman year. He set the USC high jump record at the UCLA/USC Invitational (7-2½), finished third at the Pac-10 Championships (7-2) and participated in the NCAA meet (6-11¾).

"Anthony is a consistent jumper who gained valuable experience last year," said Wolfe. "He needs to concentrate better and correct some basic faults, but he has the talent to jump with anyone."

Caire had a great streak going last May, going 7-0 or better in four consecutive meets, and 6-11¾ in a fifth (7-2½, 7-2, 7-2, 7-0¾ and 6-11¾). In all, he went 7-0 or better seven times in 1982.

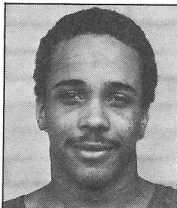
Anthony had first-place finishes at a USC Invitational in March (7-0), the 7-11 Invitational at Dallas (6-10¾), the Northridge Relays (6-11), an all-comers meet at Cal State Dominguez Hills (6-10) and at the

UCLA/USC Invitational.

Indoors, he went 6-10 at both the Sunkist and Jack in the Box meets last winter.

Caire came to USC last year ranked as the No. 3 U.S. prep high jumper in 1981 by *Track & Field News*. He jumped 7-1 while a senior at Downey's Pius X High to win the California state meet. That jump tied him for the eight best prep mark in 1981.

He's a communications major at USC.



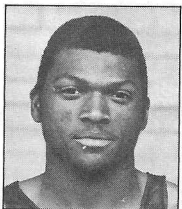
AARON CLARK — 5-7½, 138, Fr., 400 — Aaron is a walk-on who will help the Trojans in the 400 meters and the relays. Last year as a senior at Alemany High in Northridge, he placed second in the CIF 1-A Championships in the 400 meters (49.55) and third in the 200 meters (22.14). He had prep bests of 48.6 in the 400 and 21.8 in the 200.

"Aaron works hard but needs to develop strength and gain experience," said Wolfe.

"His strong points are his confidence and desire."

Clark also played running back and defensive back on Alemany's football team.

A fine student, Aaron had a 3.63 prep grade point average. He's a political science major at USC. He was born in Detroit, Mich.



DARWIN COOK — 5-10½, 170, So., Sprints — Darwin upheld the USC tradition of outstanding sprinters last year as just a freshman. *Track & Field News* ranked him 10th in the U.S. in the 100 meters in 1982.

His career best time of 10.20, the 17th best mark in the world last year, came at the California Relays in Modesto where he ran second to Carl Lewis (10.00). His 10.20 clocking places him fourth on USC's all-time performers list.

Cook finished fifth at last year's NCAA meet (10.21) and placed second at the Pac-10 Championships (10.31).

Darwin also ran his fastest 200 meters at the Pac-10s running 21.00 in the heats and placing fifth in the finals (20.94w). He ran 20.69w for a third-place finish at the UCLA/USC Invitational.

"Fall workouts gave every indication that Darwin will continue his development into a world-class sprinter," said Wolfe. "Durability, confidence, poise and pride give him the necessary tools for consistent, top-flight sprinting."

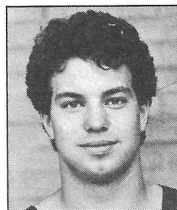
Darwin won the 100 at five meets last year: the Martin Luther King Games (10.68), the UCLA/USC Invitational (10.20w), the 7-11 Invitational in Dallas (10.60) and at two USC Invitationals (10.65 in February and 10.41w in March). His lone win in the 200 came at the USC Invitational in March (21.59).

Last summer Darwin ran on the 400-meter relay team for the U.S. National team which competed in meets against the USSR, East Germany, West Germany and Africa. Against the East Germans in Karl-Marx-Stadt, East Germany, the U.S. team ran 38.22, the fourth fastest time ever recorded for the event.

Cook had a successful indoor season last year, winning the Times 60-yard dash (6.18). His best for 60 yards came at the Jack in the Box meet in San Diego where he ran second (6.15). He also finished second in the 50-yard dash at the Jack in the Box meet but set a career best of 5.3.

An All-American sprinter at Woodson High in Bowie, Md., Cook had prep bests of 10.3 in the 100 meters and 21.4 for 200 meters, plus the fastest prep indoor 60-yard dash clocking (6.23) in 1981. He missed most of the 1981 outdoor season with a torn muscle in his right thigh.

Darwin is a business major at USC. He was born in Washington, D.C.



CHRIS CRISMAN — 5-11, 160, So., Hurdles — With a year of adjusting as a freshman behind him, Chris is being counted on to have a competitive and improved 1983 season.

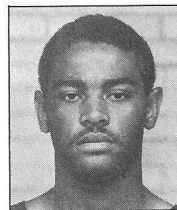
Last year he recorded his best personal time in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles by winning a USC Invitational in March (53.82). He also won his heat in the 400 IH at the Martin Luther King Games (53.99).

His career best time for the 110 highs came at a USC Invitational in February (15.24).

"Chris must continue to work hard on his strength, speed, technique and his ability to compete," said Wolfe. "He should be much improved this year."

Chris is a business administration major at USC and has a fine 3.28 grade point average. He was born in Winchester, Va.



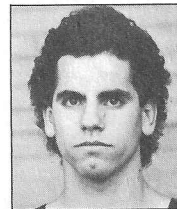
WALT DeJEAN — 6-3½, 235, Fr., Shot Put —

A fine student, Walt had a 3.28 prep grade point average. He hasn't declared a major at USC.

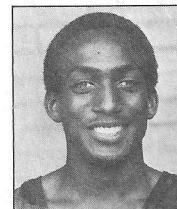

He's a psychology major at USC.



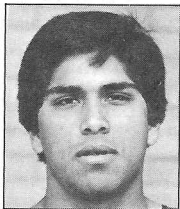
JIM FISHER — 5-10, 157, Fr., 800 — A teammate of Ron Brown's on Bishop Amat's CIF 2-A Championship team, Jim won the 2-A 800-meter run (1:53.66) and was fourth at the CIF Masters Meet (1:53.13). His prep best came at the Mt. SAC Invitational where he had a 1:52.84 clocking.

Jim also ran on Amat's 1600 relay team which placed second in the state meet (3:14.11) and first at the 2-A Championships (3:16.73).

"Jim has the talent and ability to be a good prospect in the 800," said Wolfe. "Developing his speed and competitiveness must be high on his priority list though."

Jim was also an outstanding basketball and football player at Bishop Amat. He won All-Angelus League first-team honors and was Amat's defensive MVP in basketball.

A fine student, Jim had a 3.58 prep grade point average. He's a business major at USC.

**MIKE GONZALES — 6-1, 190, Fr., Decathlon**

— Mike passed up a full scholarship to play football for Oregon in order to come to USC and compete in the decathlon.

He set a national record (6505) for the decathlon in the 16-and-under age group as a sophomore at Bishop Montgomery High in Torrance. That mark came at the AAU National meet at Porterville and was only Mike's second decathlon ever.

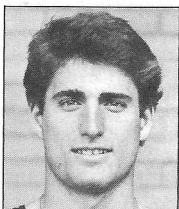
His career best came last December when he scored 6668 at an all-comers decathlon at Long Beach State.

Last year at the CIF 2-A Championships he finished third in the 300 low hurdles (37.44), fifth in the 110 highs (14.52) and tied for sixth in the high jump (6-2). He also finished third in the highs at the Arcadia Invitational (14.44) and fourth in the highs at the CIF Masters Meet (14.18).

"Mike is an outstanding prospect," said Wolfe. "He's a hard worker, a quick learner, a good competitor and should develop rapidly in the decathlon."

Mike was an all-league fullback at Bishop Montgomery and played in the Lions All-Star game this past summer. He went to Taiwan last year as part of an international sports exchange program and competed in a meet with the Taiwanese and Koreans.

He has not declared a major at USC.

**DARREN HALL — 6-1, 175, Jr., Decathlon**

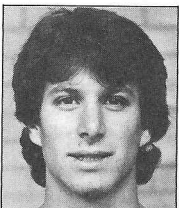
— Darren is a transfer from Shasta Junior College in Redding. Last year he won the California state JC decathlon title with a score of 7095. His career best came at the 1982 NorCal JC meet where he scored 7144 points in winning the event. He placed third in last year's Martin Luther King Games.

As a freshman he won the NorCal meet (7044) and was sixth at the state meet.

"Darren has the ability and experience to score at both the Pac-10 and NCAA meets," said Wolfe. "But he still needs to develop better speed, strength and technique."

Hall attended Enterprise High in Redding and was a high school All-American in the decathlon. He had prep bests of 6580 with collegiate implements and 6980 using high school standards.

He's a physical education major at USC.

**MARK HANDELSMAN — 6-0, 160, Sr., 800—**

Mark re-established himself as a world-class middle distance runner last summer with a 1:46.5 clocking in the 800-meters at Lausanne, Switzerland. The time tied Lloyd Johnson's and Rayfield Beaton's USC record.

Handelsman struggled last spring for the Trojans, finishing sixth at the Pac-10 meet (1:50.53), second at the 7-11 Invitational (1:50.3) and sixth at the Martin Luther King Games (1:48.9).

He also ran a 3:53.4 1500 meters to finish fifth at a USC Invitational last February, placing him ninth on USC's all-time performers list.

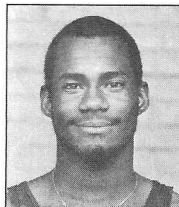
"The Trojans need a strong year from Mark," said Wolfe. "He has the talent to finish high in the Pac-10 and NCAA Championships."

Handelsman, an Israeli citizen, burst into prominence when he posted a personal record 1:45.3 in 1981. That was the 14th best time in the world that year. In his last seven races of the 1981 season, he averaged 1:46.2.

Mark was born in Johannesburg, South Africa. He attended King David High and in 1978, his final year there, was the South African junior champ in both the 1500 and 1500 steeple. He has since mov-

ed to Israel and competed for its national team this past summer.

He attended South Africa's University of Witwatersrand and completed three years of a five-year dentistry program. He's a biology major at USC and plans on finishing his studies at the USC Dental School.



TERRY IVEY — 5-11½, 165, Fr., 400 — Terry's story is similar to fellow Trojan sprinter Darwin Cook. A knee injury suffered in football hampered Ivey's senior track campaign after a brilliant junior year. (Cook missed his senior campaign with a leg injury.)

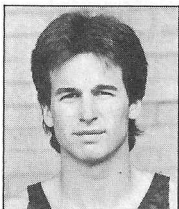
The Trojans are hoping Terry can regain the form he showed two years ago. As a junior at Ribault High in Jacksonville, Fla., he was both a National Coaches and Adidas All-American.

He had career bests of 10.45 for 100 meters, 21.3 for 200 meters, 46.77 for 400 meters and 1:54.3 for 800 meters. His best senior marks were 10.6, 21.4 and 47.2.

His 46.77 in the 400 was a Florida state record and the sixth fastest U.S. prep mark in 1981.

"Watch this young man go this year," said Wolfe. "He has strength and speed and loves to run."

A fine student, Terry had a 3.26 prep grade point average. He is a computer science major at USC. He was born in Jacksonville, Fla.

**BUBBA KAVANAUGH — 5-11, 155, Sr., Pole Vault**

— One of three USC vaulters to go 17 feet or better last year, Bubba has the experience to be a consistent jumper for the Trojans this year.

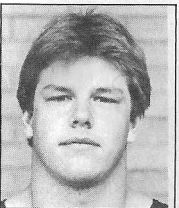
"With a season of Pac-10 competition under his belt, Bubba should be a consistent scorer in 1983," said Wolfe. "But he still needs to develop confidence and aggressiveness in order to reach his potential."

Kavanaugh's best effort last year came at the Mt. SAC Invitational where he went 17-0 to finish second in his flight. That mark tied him with Chuck Suey for eighth on USC's all-time pole vault performers list. He went 16-0 or better in nine meets last year.

Bubba transferred to USC from Scottsdale JC in Arizona in February of 1982. He was the National Junior College Athletic Association indoor and outdoor pole vault champion in 1981. His career best of 17-1½ is the NJCAA record.

He spent 1980 at Arkansas, posting a best of 16-10. He was the TFA national prep champ while at Oak Park High in Kansas City, Mo., with a best of 16-4. He was also a second team all-state defensive back and lists former Trojan All-American offensive lineman Roy Foster as one of the toughest players he's competed against.

Kavanaugh's real first name is Charles. He's a business major at USC. He was born in Little Rock, Ark.

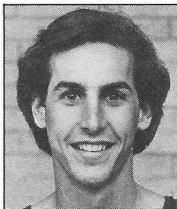
**RANDY KENDRICK — 6-2, 202, Fr., Discus**

— A walk-on from Huntington Beach High, Randy set a school discus record with his fifth-place toss of 169-3 at the CIF Masters Meet.

He was captain of his high school track and field team in both his junior and senior years. He also played linebacker and offensive tackle for the football team and was team captain as a senior. He was honored as Huntington Beach High's Most Inspirational Athlete in 1982.

"Randy has all the equipment necessary to become an outstanding thrower," said Wolfe. "He needs to develop his competitive skills and gain some experience."

He's a business administration major at USC. He was born in Las Vegas, Nev.



DAVE KENWORTHY — 6-0, 165, Sr., Pole Vault — Last summer at the National Sports Festival in Indianapolis, Ind., Dave finished second to Dave Volz in the pole vault, but his jump of 18-2¾, the 28th best vault in the world last year, gave him the USC record. Kenworthy now heads a list that includes Russ Rogers (18-1½), Olympic gold medalist Bob Seagren (17-9) and Paul Wilson (17-7¾).

Track & Field News ranked Dave No. 9 in the U.S. in 1982. It was an outstanding year for the improving vaulter, topped off by a surprising victory at the NCAA Championships (17-11¾). He went over 18 feet three times: the Sports Festival, TAC (18-1½) and the Pac-10s (18-0½). He posted victories at the Martin Luther King Games (17-9¾), the UCLA/USC Invitational (17-4¾) and at an all-comers meet at Venice High (17-3).

In 13 meets last year he always cleared the opening height, with 17-3 his worst finish.

"Dave has his work cut out for him" said Wolfe. "He already has the best jump in history by a Trojan. The 19-foot range is within his grasp but only if he covers all the bases."

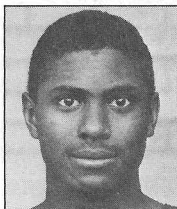
Indoors last year, Dave went 17-6 at the Jack in the Box meet, 17-5 at the Husker Invitational, 17-2¾ at TAC, 17-2½ in qualifying for the NCAA meet and 17-0 at Sunkist.

Kenworthy competed unattached while out of school in 1981 and posted a best of 17-8¼ while placing second at the California Relays. He never placed below fourth in 11 performances.

He spent 1980 at Grossmont JC in San Diego, where he won the California state JC title with a best of 16-6. He was beaten just once in 1980.

Dave cleared a best of 15-0 while at Crespi High in Encino.

He's a public administration major at USC with a 3.06 grade point average.



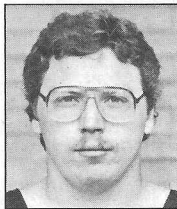
JAMES KNOWLES — 6-0, 165, Fr., Intermediate Hurdles — James received an additional year of eligibility when he suffered a stress fracture of the tibia in his right leg early last season. He competed in only three meets with his best performance in the 400 IH coming at a USC Invitational in February (54.54).

"We're hoping that we can see what James can do in the intermediates this year," said Wolfe. "Obviously he needs seasoning and to bolster his confidence."

Knowles had the third fastest U.S. prep time in the 300-meter low hurdles as a senior at Blair High in Pasadena in 1981 (36.09). That came in the heats of the California state meet.

He was CIF 3-A champion in the lows (36.47) and 100 meters (10.68) and ran second in the high hurdles (14.12).

He's an accounting major at USC.



HANK KRAYCHIR — 6-1, 280, Jr., Shot Put — A transfer from Long Beach City College, Kraychir set a national junior college record in the shot at last year's California Junior College Championships at Sacramento with a toss of 65-4. That mark, the 17th best in the U.S. last year, broke his own JC record of 65-3½.

Hank also won the State JC discus title with a throw of 178-6. His best in the discus is 183-9, which he set while winning the SoCal Junior College Championship last spring in Bakersfield.

"Hank should have a good year," said USC head coach Vern Wolfe. "He works overtime for his success and I wouldn't be surprised if he set a new school record in the shot in 1983."

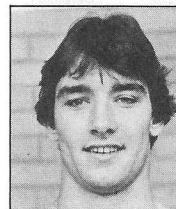
The USC record is 66-11¼ set by Doug Lane in 1972. Kraychir's 65-4 would rank him third on USC's all-time performers list behind

Lane and three-time NCAA champ Dallas Long (65-10½).

Kraychir emerged into national prominence last winter when he reached 62-0¾. Then he really took off last spring: 62-11¾ at a USC Invitational in late February and 64-5½ a week later. In April he threw 65-3½ to place fourth at the Martin Luther King Games in Palo Alto.

At San Jacinto High, Hank threw the prep shot 61-8 and the discus 188-7. He was the California prep discus champ in 1979.

RICK LUITEN — 6-6, 225, Fr., Discus — USC didn't have anyone to throw the discus on last year's team, so Luiten, who had the eighth best U.S. prep mark last year (193-8), will fill an obvious void.

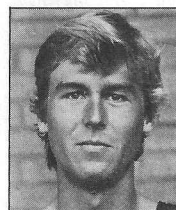

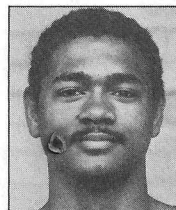

"Brad could surprise everyone with his jumping skills," said Wolfe. "He works hard, loves to compete and has improved. All he needs now is experience."

Meinhardt attended Taft High in Woodland Hills and was the West Valley League long jump champion his junior year. He finished second as a junior in the City finals. As a senior, Brad finished third in league. His best as a prep was 22-5.

He's a business finance major at USC. He was born in Bristol, Pa.



LUIS "PANCHO" MORALES — 5-6½, 145, Fr., Sprints — Luis was a *Track & Field News* 1982 high school All-American in the 100-meter dash. He had nine races of 10.3 or quicker and his 10.41 clocking was the second fastest U.S. prep time last year. He also ran a 20.82 200 which was the fifth fastest time by a prep in 1982.

"Luis was an exciting and successful runner in high school," said Wolfe. "He's capable of running the 400 meters, which gives

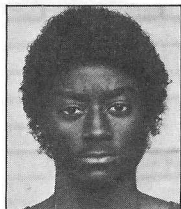
him the strength and power necessary for consistent, fast work. He has it all."

Luis picked up some valuable international experience last summer. GEOFF NORTON — 6-0, 150, Fr., Intermediate Hurdles — Geoff, a walk-on from Seaside High in Marina, was the Monterey Bay League champion in the 300-meter low hurdles and the 400 meters, and ran anchor on the title-winning mile relay team. He also won the 300 lows and placed second in the 400 at the Region IV Championships. He had prep bests of 49.2 in the 400 and 37.1 in the 300 lows.

"Geoff could develop into a good intermediate hurdler but he needs to gain experience and increase his strength," said Wolfe.

Norton also played split end and free safety on Seaside's football team.

Geoff's an aerospace engineering major at USC. He was born in Toul-Rosieres, France.

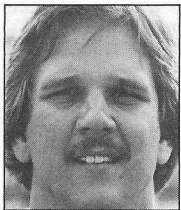

Doug is an outstanding student with a 3.79 grade point average. He's a petroleum engineering major at USC.



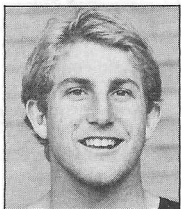

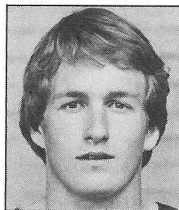

He's an accounting major at USC with a fine 3.00 grade point average.



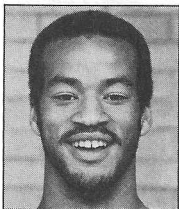

That leap placed Tave No. 7 on the all-time USC performers list.

Ed had four other meets where he went over 25 feet: the TAC Junior meet (25-2¾), the Pepsi Invitational (25-2½), the Northridge Relays (25-1¾) and the Junior Invitational meet at Houston, Tex. (25-1¼). Tave also had a wind-aided jump of 25-10 at the UCLA/USC Invitational.

He won a gold medal in the long jump and a silver in the high hurdles at the World Junior Championships at Seoul, Korea.

The only disappointment for Ed came at last year's NCAA meet where he had three faults in qualifying and didn't advance to the finals.

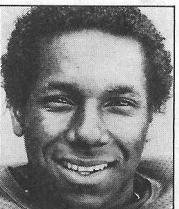
"Look for Ed to compete in the long and triple jumps and the high hurdles this year, like he did in high school," said Wolfe. "In order to compete in three events successfully, he is going to have to develop more strength, concentration and mental discipline."

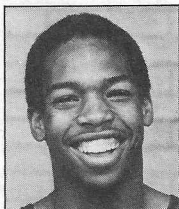
"Timmie is a very talented young man and could really make the Trojans go if he's able to run," said Wolfe. "He adds strength and quality in the 400 and both relays."

Timmie has not declared a major at USC.

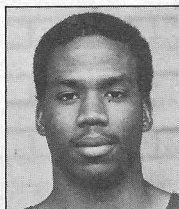

A fine student, Lonnie was Asbury Park High's varsity scholar award winner his senior year. He's a broadcast journalism major at USC.

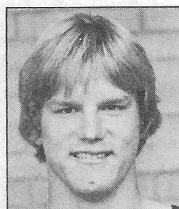

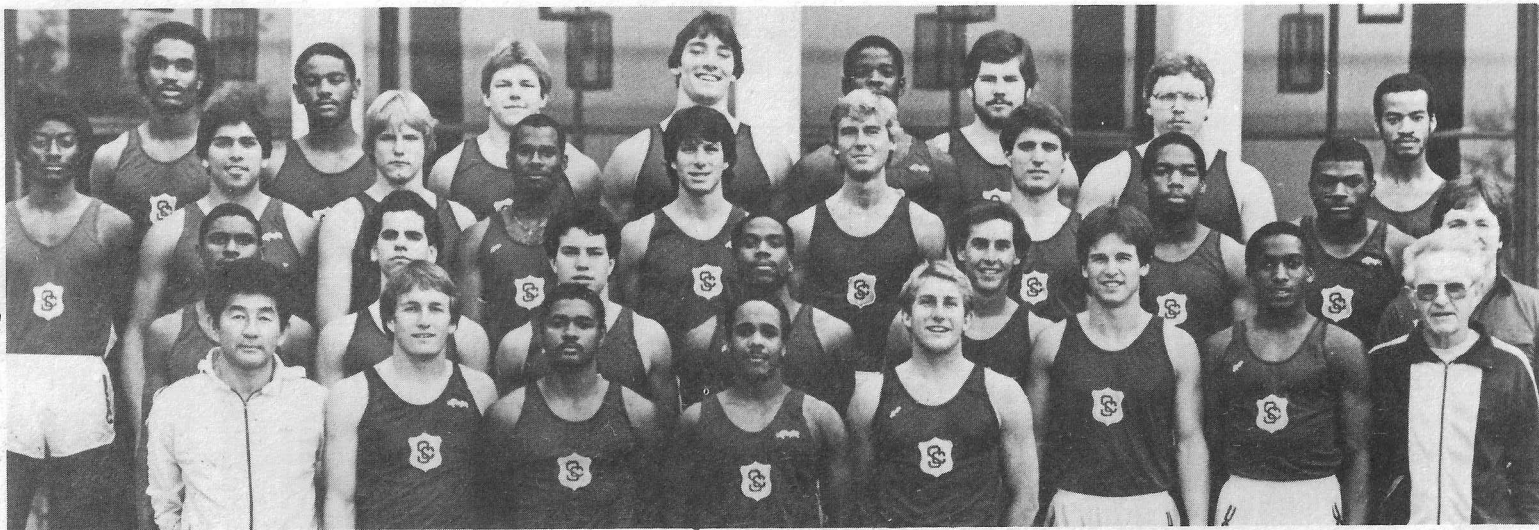

HERITAGE

CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 61 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 23 individual Olympic titles and have shared in seven relay victories. Fifty-seven men have won a total of 86 places on United States Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of the 61 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). They have also won two NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 96 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.

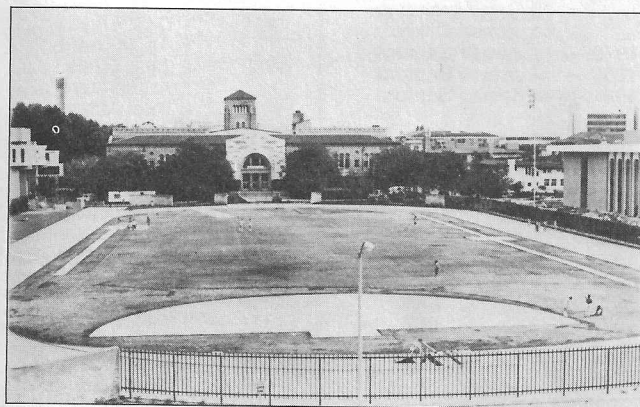

**CROMWELL TRACK AND FIELD**

Cromwell Track and Field was completely refurbished in 1979. The renovation allows the Trojans to hold home on-campus meets, something that hadn't been done since Coach Vern Wolfe came to USC in 1963.

An all-weather polyurethane surface was installed for the track, which has eight 42-inch lanes. It's an extremely fast surface built for speed. All new runways, pits and field event areas were put in and new equipment was purchased. An equipment storeroom and an adjoining weightroom were built on the track's southwest perimeter.

Although there's no spectator stands yet, a \$1.8 million fundraising drive is on and when that financial goal is reached, a permanent doubledeck stadium seating 5,000 people will be constructed. Coach Wolfe anticipates this structure will be completed prior to 1984, when Los Angeles hosts the Olympics. Cromwell Field will be used as a warm-up area for Olympic athletes performing in the nearby Coliseum.

TROJANS IN WORLD RANKINGS

USC athletes have earned more places in the top ten in the world (and top 15 between 1975 and 1978) than any university in the nation. The rankings are compiled by *Track & Field News*, the bible of the sport. Since the rankings were begun in 1947, 66 different Trojans have placed among the world's best 241 times.

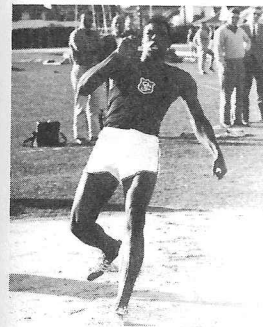

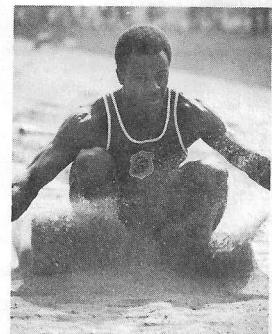

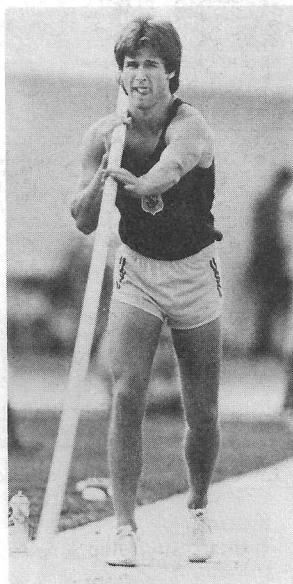
