

2000 USC Season Outlook

TROY BEGINS SECOND CENTURY OF TRACK AND FIELD

It was 100 years ago that a rag-tag team of tracksters with neither coach nor captain first took flight down the cinderpaths of University Park.

From these humble beginnings in 1900, the greatest tradition in collegiate track and field history was born -- that of the University of Southern California.

Nowhere else in the country is the measure of success higher than at Troy. Consider USC's past successes in track and field: 28 NCAA men's team championships (including two indoor titles), 105 men's and women's NCAA Individual titles, 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 40 Olympic gold medals and 17 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

Now in its centennial season, Trojan track and field is still attracting the top-flight athletes needed to excel at the collegiate level.

Under the guidance of sixth year Director of Track and Field Ron Allice, the USC men's program has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA meet for five consecutive years -- a feat last accomplished in the 1970s under the legendary Vern Wolfe. Meanwhile, the USC women's program has finished in the top 10 at the NCAAs three of the last four years -- a level of success not seen since the late 1980s.

The goals, no matter what century it is, remain the same: win the dual meets, win the conference, win the national championship.

Last year, the Trojan men won nine of 12 dual meets, captured their second Pac-10 title in three years and finished fifth at the NCAAs.


The 2000 edition of USC men's track and field must overcome the graduation of several key veterans, particularly All-Americans Jerome Davis (the only athlete in history to win four Pac-10 400m titles).

Charles Lee (a two-time NCAA 200m finalist) and William Erese (a three-time NCAA finalist in the hurdles). Allice believes this squad is up to the task.


"I like the current chemistry of this team right now," Allicesaid. "But it's easy to have chemistry when you're not being tested with adversities and setbacks. I don't know how this group will respond to that when the time comes. Only time will tell."

"We have lost to graduation some leadership by performance. We're going to need for some people to step out of the group to provide leadership."

A prime candidate for that leadership role is senior Felix

Sanchez, the Pac-10 400m intermediate hurdles champion. This past summer, Sanchez ran a career-best 48.60 in the 400m IH -- just a shade shy of the school record of 48.55.

"Felix Sanchez is an outstanding competitor and perhaps one of the top intermediate hurdlers in the country," said Allice. "He is a leader and has the potential some day to be a good coach. If he can stay injury free and rally the people to the task at hand, then we'll be a much better off team."

In 2000, USC will once again be a powerful force in the sprints, jumps and burdles.

Sultan McCullough, who doubles as a tailback on the Trojan football team, heads the short sprint corps. The blazing sophomore is the defending Pac-10 100m champ and his career-best 10.17 is No. 5 on the all-time Trojan 100m chart (it was also the best 100m time in the world for the under-20 age group in 1999). Senior Vince Williams returns to give the Trojans another threat in the 100 and 200m, while another tailback, sophomore Miguel Fletcher, is a returning All-American in the 400m relay. Look for JC All-American transfer Andre Ammons and prep All-Americans Kareem Kelly and Darrell Rideaux, who starred at wide receiver and cornerback, respectively, on the Trojan football team last fall, to make immediate impacts as well.

"Sultan is one of the most talented sprinters to ever grace this campus," said Allice." He hasn't even begun to show what he can do beyond 100 meters — he may be even better at the 200. Kelly, Rideaux and Fletcher are very talented and will work mostly in the 100. Williams and Ammons give us good strength in the 200 meters."

In the 400 meters, USC must fill the shoes of three-time All-American Jerome

Davis. The Trojans will rely on volume rather than a true superstar to achieve that end. Seniors Leroy Jordan, DeJon Joyner and Ari Monosson, along with sophomore Ray Carter, will be the main weapons in this event.

In the hurdles, USC is young but filled with potential. The 110m high hurdles group consists of junior Djeke Mambo (13.93) and incoming treshmen Ryan Wilson and Marcell Allmond, both prep All-Americans. Allmond, who doubles as a receiver with the footballers, is also the junior record-holder in the decathlon. The trio forms a solid attack that should score key points in conference. Sanchez will be the main man in the 400m IH, with Wilson and sophomore Andre Kelly the primary backups.

"In the hurdles, we are young but good," said Allice. "The key is how well the two young freshman adjust to the higher college hurdles."

The jumps are solid for the Trojans with the return of the brothers Mambo — senior Kedjeloba and junior Djeke. At last year's Pac-10s, Kedjeloba (who was an All-American in the triple jump as a freshman) tinished second in the triple-jump and seventh in the long jump while Djeke came in fourth in the triple jump and fifth in long jump. Added to the long jump mix is JC transfer Elliot Walker and triple jumper Justin Cox, a transfer from Wisconsin.

"Long jump is a point producing event for us," said Allice. "Both Mambos have jumped in excess of 25 feet and Walker is a 25-footer with sprinter's speed. In the triple jump, both the Mambos could score at the NCAAs, along with Justin Cox, who we think could suprise some people."

The 2000 Trojan throws program is one of the finest in the conference. Junior Norbert Horvath, last year's 1999 Pac-10 champ and NCAA runner-up in the hammer, spearheads a strong hammer corps that also includes two other Pac-10 finalists: junior Szabolcs Maroti and senior Dagan Massey. Sophomore Van Mounts has the potential to be one of the better shotputters in the Pac-10. And in the discus, freshman Lucais McKay, a two-time prep All-American who also is an offensive

lineman for the football team, could be a point scorer at the conference and NCAA level.

"The throws could be as strong as they've been since I've been here," said: Allice, "The hammer is very deep. We've got five people who can throw over 200 feet. I don't think that's happening anywhere else in the conference."

A returning All-American in the pole vault -- junior Dennis Kholev -- a solid corps of decathletes -- junior Daniel Haag, junior Casey Thompson, sophomore Russell Silvers and freshman Marcell Allmond -- and good young talent in the 400m and 1,600m relays round out a deep Trojan squad that could go a long way in 2000.

"Kholev is a top pole vaulter, while the decathlon is now one of our strengths," said Allice. "The relays have the potential to run as fast or faster than last year in the 400m relay, but we must try to replace

Jerome Davis in the 1,600m relay."

"We're strong everywhere except for the distances and middle distances. Every other event is stored up with not only an NCAA-level contributor, but also Pac-10 and dual meet scorers.

"We're the best dual meet team we've been since I've been here. I'm looking forward to seeing how this squad develops."

On the women's side, Allice is equally optimistic. "We're good," Allice said, "Maybe as good as last year.

though it's hard to tell just how good we'll be right now."

The women's sprints are led by 1999 NCAA 100m champ Angela Williams. Just a sophomore, she is already the USC recordholder in the 100m (11.04) and owned the fastest 100m time in the world for the under-20 age group in 1999. She also ran the opening leg on USC's 400m relay squad that set a new school record (43.35).

"Angela is just a big-time talent," said Allice. "For her, the sky is the limit. Besides the 100m, she'll also help us out in the 200m this year. However, we will not overcompete her since it is an Olympic year and she will need to be prepared for a long competitive season."

Other key sprinters include junior relay All-American Malika Edmonson (100m, 200m, 400m), sophomore relay All-American Kinsasha Davis (200m, 400m), junior Candace Young (100m, 200m), and junior Carla Estes (400m). Edmonson and Davis form half of USC's 1,600m relay team that set a new school record (3:28.08) at the NCAA Championships last June.

"We don't have much depth in the individual sprints," said Allice. "But we should once again be outstanding in the 400m and 1,600m relays."

The 800m is in good hands with junior Pac-10 champ Brigita Langerholc. Last summer, Brigita ran a 1:59.87 at the World University Games to set a new school record in the 800m. Senior Anna Lopaciuch is the defending Pac-10 1,500m champ and will be

relied on to help replace the graduated All-American Grazyna Penc. Anna also runs the 800m.

"We are relying on Anna and Brigita to do it all for us in

the 800m on up," said Allice.

All-American senior Natasha Danvers returns to key the 100m HH and 400m IH (where she owns the school record - 55.69). She finished fourth in the 400m IH at last year's NCAAs. Senior Miriam Tschomba-Fariala was a Pac-10 finalist in both events last year.

"I feel we have a good chance to get some points from both of them at the NCAAs," said Affice.

In the jumps, the Trojans lose All-American Pam Simpson, but shouldn't miss a beat. Newcomers Stephanie Jones and Tatyana Obukhova of the Ukraine will team with junior Carla Estes and sophomore Disia Page to form an outstanding group of jumpers.

"In the jumps, we are as good or better than last year," said Allice. "We have quality and quantity."

The continued development of junior All-American hammer thrower Jennifer Vail will be a key for the Women of Troy in 2000. Vail, who was a suprise finalist at the NCAAs last year, also throws the shot put. Sophomore Cynthia Ademiluyi's versatility (she competes in the hammer, shot and discus) gives USC yet another potential point scorer at the Pac-10s and NCAAs.

"These two help us immensely in that they do a lot of different things for us," said Allice. "And they are constantly improving.

"For the women, the key is staying healthy," said Allice. "Then, our depth people must go from being fillers, to killers. If they step up, we'll be in good shape and we'll get to the big show."

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field

Like a phoenix rising from the ashes, USC track and field has reemerged as a force on the collegiate scene. Under the guidance of Director of Track and Field Ron Allice, the Trojan men are on a run of six consective top 10 linishes - a feat last accomplished during the 1970s under Verne Wolfe. Meanwhile, the Women of Troy have finished in the top 10 three of the last four years - a level of success not seen since the late 1980s. Last year the men's track team won its second Pac-10 title in three years under Allice. Then, at last year's NCAA Outdoor Championships, he led the USC men's team to fifth place and the Women of Troy to third. It was the women's best showing since 1987. As a combined men's and women's program, that performance was the best in school history. In fact, USC was the only school in the country in 19999 that finished in the top tive in both men's and women's track and field. In 1998, the Trojan men's team finished in seventh place while the women's team finished in fifth place. In 1997, Allice directed the Trojan men's team to its first Pacific-10 Conference title since 1977 (and 30th overall) before finishing third at the NCAAs. In 1996, Allice guided the USC women's team to its first-ever Pac-10 title and directed the men's squad to a 10th-place finish at the NCAAs. And in his first year at USC in 1995, he led the men's team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 28 NCAA men's championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 40 Olympic gold medals and 16 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame - all encapsuled in 100 years of a rich and storied tradition

And now, with the second century of Trojan track and field ready to begin, Ron Allice and his staff are hard at work restoring the luster to USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 192-36-1 in 32 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than

150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous stops followed him - the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished. second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had live state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then went to Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (32, who is a sports


JOHN HENRY JOHNSON Sprints/Decathlon/Recruiting Coordinator

John Henry Johnson enters his sixth year as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and decathletes, and is the team's strength coach. Troy's past five men's and women's recruiting classes rank among the best in the nation, including this season's class, which is ranked second by Track and Field News.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Allice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and tootball star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers. In 1993, John studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica.

His father John Henry Johnson, Sr., who played fullback for four NFL teams, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1987. Johnson is single and is currently working on his master's degree at USC in international relations.



DAN LANGE Throws

In his tenth year of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. The 34-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA harmer throw championships (and a collegiste record) and aided USC throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. In 1997, despite the departure of Kiss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA harmer title. Johansson was runner up in the harmer in 1998, as was Norbert Honath in 1999.

Lange, who has coached athletes to All-American honors 22 times, led Troy's throwers to extremely successful campaigns for the past eight seasons. On the women's side, he has coached Nicole Haynes (the 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA runner-up) and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer).

Lange is also currently coaching U.S. Olympian Adam Setliff (discus) as well as efite discus thrower Kevin Fitzpatrick.

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned AllAmerican honors in the hammer.

Lange studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant.

He and his wife Darcy (Arreola), who was one of America's finest middle distance runners and a former NCAA champion, got married last year and reside in Valencia, Calif.



TOM WALSH Women's Cross Country/ Distance Running

Tom Walsh is in his sixth year as the middle and long distance coach and head women's cross country coach at USC.

In a short period of time, Walsh has helped rebuild the middle and long distance program at USC into one of the linest squads in the nation.

During the last four years, USC middle and long distance runners have captured All-American honors nine times. The group was led by Grazyna Penc, a four-time All-American in the 1,500m. Penc finished third in 1996.

and 1998, fourth in 1997 and was runner up last year. Emebet Shiferaw was a two-time All-American in the 3,000m in 1996-97. Brigita Langerhold, also a two-time All-American, placed third in the 800m in 1998 and 1999. Current senior Anna Lopadiuch earned All-American honors with a fifth-place finish in the 1,500m in 1998.

Walsh graduated from USC in 1988, and served as a graduate assistant at USC for three years in the late 1980s. He also served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Trials.



MIKE PULLINS Jumps

Mike Pullins is in his second year at USC. Coach "Mike," as he likes to be called, is responsible for coaching both the women and men's jumpers. In his first year he coached Pam Simpson to a third-place finish at the 1999 NCAA Championships in Boise, Idaho.

A 1987 graduate of USC, his name is still among the top ten triple jumpers on the all-time Trojan charts. As a high school senior Mike qualified for the CIF Championships in four individual events and went on to win the triple jump, in which he placed fifth in the 1982 state meet. Mike starred at Cal State Northridge and Pasadena City College before coming to Troy. A three-time USA Track & Field outdoor qualifier, he was

forced to set track aside due to injuries and four ankle surgeries in 1994.

Mike is single and currently woring on his master's degree in education.



JOE LANNING Hurdles/Heptathlon

Joe Lanning is in his second year at USC after coming out of retirement. His main responsibility is coaching the hurdlers on both the men's and women's squads as well as the women's heptathlon.

Lanning, the former head coach at Long Beach City College, was Ron Allice's mentor in his undergraduate days and tater assisted Allice there for 16 years. During his time as the head coach at Long Beach City College, Lanning wort 15 state championships and 22 Southern California titles. In addition, 41 of his athletes won individual state titles and 60 Southern California championships, including hurdler Earl McCullouch, who later became a Trojan and world record holder.

He is a member of the California Community College Track & Field Hall of Fame, and the Long Beach Century Club Hall of Fame.



BARBARA EDMONSON Volunteer Coach/Sprints

One of the finest female sprinters of all time, Barbara Edmonson will be a volunteer coach in her ninth season at USC, with the previous eight season spent as the women's head coach and sprint coach for the entire program.

Edmonson came to USC in 1991 and in the process became one of the few, if any, female coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Dvision I program.

In her years as a coach at USC, the Women of Troy had three top 10 NCAA finishes, including a third-place finish in 1999. Edmonson helped lead the Women of Troy to their first-ever Pac-10 title in 1996, outlasting UCLA in a dramatic competition at Drake Stadium in Westwood.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, th 1972 NCAA 100m champion. Her daughter Malika is a three-time track All-American in her junior year at USC.



TINA FERNANDEZ Women's Sprints

Tina Fernandez is in her first year as a volunteer coach assisting in the women's sprints.

A fine sprinter herself, she competed at Long Beach City College and later at Fresno State.

She is currently head of the Physical Education Department at Lynwood (Calif.) Middle School and is completing her Masters Degree in Education at Cal Sate Los Angeles.

Her husband is an assistant football coach at Compton College.



TYRUS DEMINTER Men of Troy

Tyrus Deminter is in his fifth year as a club coach at USC and is the head of the Men of Troy Distance Running Club. Deminter is a former Junior College All-American and graduated from Long Beach State with a degree in speech communication. He is currently one of the Southern California area's best and most consistent road racers as well as a private coach to many Southern California runners. He also operates his own produce business.

His best time in the marathon is 2:19, and he qualified twice for the U.S. Olympic Trials (1988, 1992).

BILL TISDALE Statistics and Newsletter

Bill Tisdale, the meet director for all of USC's home meets for the past four years, works on the Trojan Force web site (www.ez2.net/trojanforce) and publishes the Trojan Force Newsletter quarterly. He has been working with Ron Allice for the past 25 years.

Tisdale ran for Long Beach City College in 1954 and returned the next year as a student assistant to Mel Patton. He then followed Patton to the University of Wichita as an assistant coach in 1956. In 1957, he returned to California to assist Jack Rose at Long Beach State. Following two years in the U.S. Army, Tisdale again served as Rose's assistant in 1960.

From 1961 to 1974, Tisdale left the coaching ranks to work in private business. In 1974, he rejoined Rose to help him at the National Track and Field Hall of Fame. At that time, Rose introduced him Ron Allice, and Tisdale has been with him over since, working as a volunteer assistant.

From 1979 to 1986, Tisdale also served as the SID at Long Beach City College. He and Allice collaborated on "The ARCO Jesse Owens Games Clinic Manual" in 1992.

Tisdale is now in semi-retirement in Sun City, Calif.


KEDJELOBA MAMBO


DAGAN MASSEY


DARRELL RIDEAUX







USC TRACK & FIELD HISTORICAL ACHIEVEMENTS

WORLD RECORDS:

Sixty-one USC athletes have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES:

USC alumni have won 27 individual Olympic titles and have shared in 13 relay victories.

Seventy-four Trojan men and 13 Women of Troy have won a total of 117 places on national Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC has won 26 out of the 75 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921.

On 10 occasions Troy has finished second. USC once won nine in a row (1935-1943) and seven straight (1949-1955).

They have also won two NCAA Indoor crowns since its beginning in 1965.

A total of 105 individual outdoor championships highlights the record.

NATIONAL USA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC trackmen have won 86 individual senior USA (formerly AAU and TAC) outdoor championships.

Paths of Glory

The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

USC is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 92 men's and women's national championships. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's state of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (eight national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented '28 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43).

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Milter and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1960s and continuing on to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons. However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridinon but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA

individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as head coach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Otympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Reland Sink, Wilbur Thompson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thompson and Bourland brought home gold medats in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in the world. Cromwell's influence extended far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the

world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan feams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 21 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five out-door NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A former pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straightahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Emie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw. Consequently, he helped lay the foundation for the latest in the distinguished line of Trojan head track coaches: Ron Alfice.

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995 —

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.


He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In 1996, his Women of Troy won their first-ever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's team to its first

Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NCAAs. At the 1998 NCAAs, he led the USC men's team to seventh-place and the Women of Troy to fifth. Then last season the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NCAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history).

Allice has a career dual meet record of 192-36-1 at five schools, and he has coached more than 200 All-Americans, 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.

"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," Allice said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for 100 glorious years, is in good hands.

Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer. USC's two-mile relay of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remmeber and ran 7:17.4 to set a new world record at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 13, 1966.



THIS YEAR: Natasha Danvers is the Pac-10 400m IH champ for two years running and an All-American in both the 400m IH and the 1,600m relay. The senior is one of the best all-around athletes on the Women of Troy squad and owns the USC school record in the 400m IH (55.69) as

well as the third-fastest 100m HH time (13.20) in program history. She is an NCAA title contender in 2000 and may eventually make a showing on the international scene. Natasha is currently represented on five of USC's all-time Top 10 charts (400m, 100m HH, 400m IH, high jump and 1,600m relay).



Ran a 11.27 to win the 100m at the USA Track & Field Junior Nationals ... Finished third in the 100m at the USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships with a wind-assisted time of 11.03 ... Ran 11.19 to win the 100m at the World University games ... Finished second at the Pac-10s with a time of 11.38 ... Ran a 10.96 (windassisted) at the UNLV Invitational. HIGH SCHOOL: At Chino (Calif.) High, Angela established herself as the nation's fastest female high school track athlete in history with a blistering 11.11 in the 100m at the 1998 National Junior Championships in Edwardsville, III. Won the 100m title at the 1997 Pan-Am Junior Championships, where she also teamed with current Women of Troy teammate Kinshasa Davis and two others for a 44.02. victory in the 400m relay ... Competed at the 1996 Olympic Trials during her sophomore year, but was forced to pull out due to a hamstring pull in the first round ... 

The 1999 USC Women of Troy Cross Country Team



Team Captain Anna Lopaciuch

USC hosted the 1999 Pac-10 Cross Country Championships at El Dorado Park in Long Beach. It was the first time in history that the Trojans hosted a Pac-10 championship in cross country.

Team captain Anna Lopaciuch was the first Trojan to cross the finish line as she placed 32nd in a time of 18:43. Four time ,1500m All-American Grazyna Penc was the second Woman of Troy to finish as she placed 34th in a time of 18:48.

The USC women's cross country nearly broke into the Top 10 at the 1998 NCAA West Regional Championships at Woodward Park in Fresno, Calif., finishing 11th with 334 points. Junior Grazyna Penc led the way for the Women of Troy, placing 10th in 17:14 (5:33 mile pace). Fellow juniors Anna Lopaciuch and Kristie Johnston finished 22nd (17:48) and 44th (18:16), respectively.

At the 1998 Pacific-10 Conference at Alton Baker Park in Eugene, Ore., the Women of Troy finished seventh, beating eighth-place UCLA at the conference meet for the first time in history. Penc (seventh, 17:41) and Lopaciuch (eighth, 17:43) both finished in the Top 10 to lead USC.

Penc also won the individual title at the UC San Diego Triton Invitational with a time of 17:42 (six seconds ahead of runner-up Lopaciuch), leading the Women of Troy to a second-place team finish.

Lopaciuch, who carries a 4.0 GPA as an international relations major, was also named to the Pac-10 All-Academic first team (Penc earned second team honors).

Things look very bright for the Trojans and their fifthyear coach Tom Walsh, as they lose only one senior from this past year's team. They will have everyone else back as they look to improve.

Other Women of Troy cross country members include Brooke Thomas, Brigita Langerholc, Holly Peters, Sheronda Gaines, Jodi Saeger, Mary Gilbaugh and Ellie Khabazian.





DEAN CROMWELL TRACK & FIELD KATHERINE B. LOKER STADIUM



Cromwell Track & Field, which is named after legendary Trojan coach Dean Cromwell who led USC track teams to 12 NCAA Championships, will soon be expanded to include a new 3,000-seat stadium (complete with offices and locker rooms), which will be named after Katherine B. Loker, who made the project possible through a generous gift to the University. Construction is expected to being this June.

Cromwell Track & Field was used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. It underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but the high jump area was expanded, two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps were installed and a new drainage system was also added.

The track's Rekortan surface, the same one that was installed for the Olympic competition at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes.

In the summer of 1991, the track was

resurfaced again.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelitt is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium was the site of the first USC-UCLA Dual Meet held on the USC campus in 1995. The meet was also held there in 1997 and the Trojans and Bruins will meet at Cromwell again this season on May 1.
