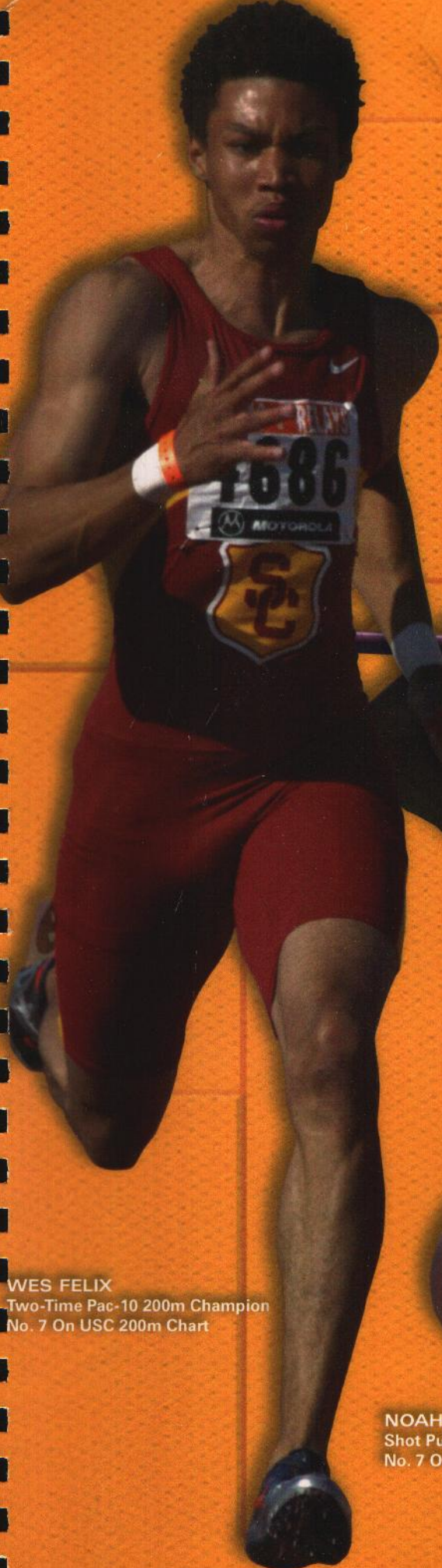
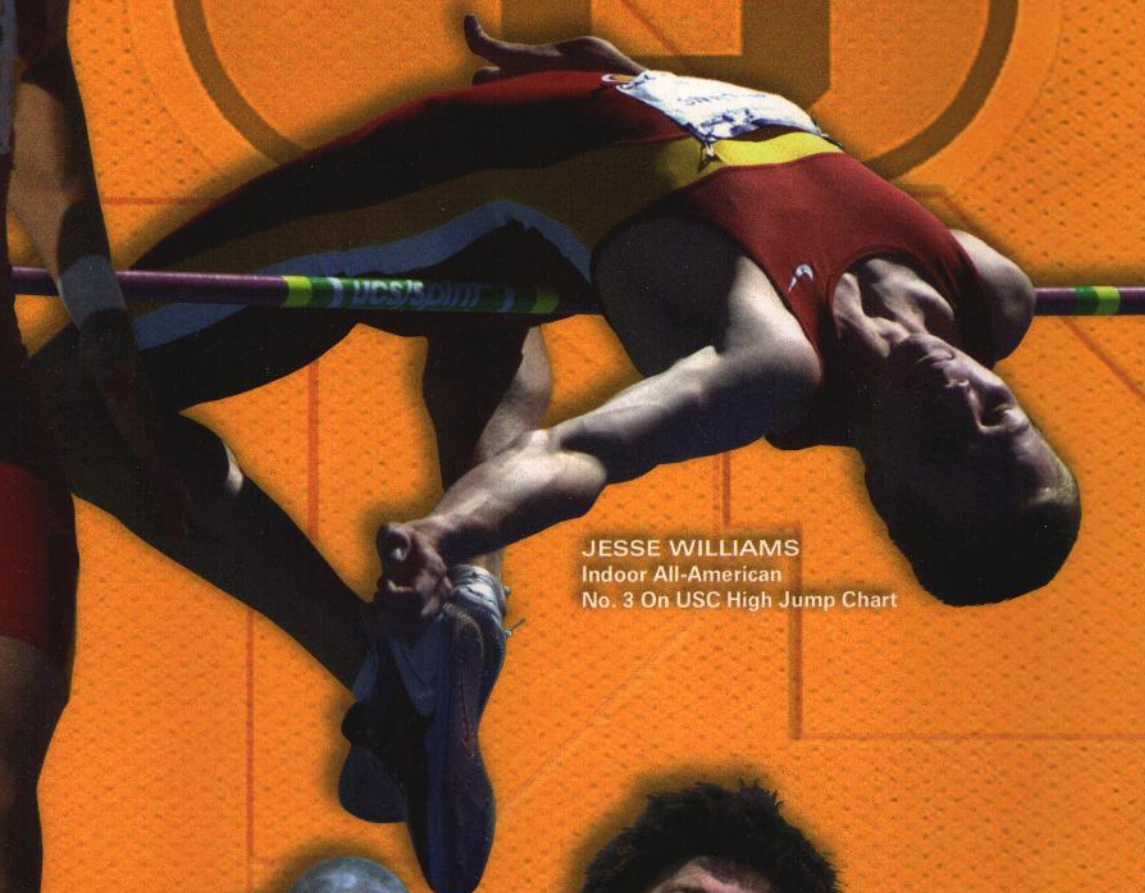

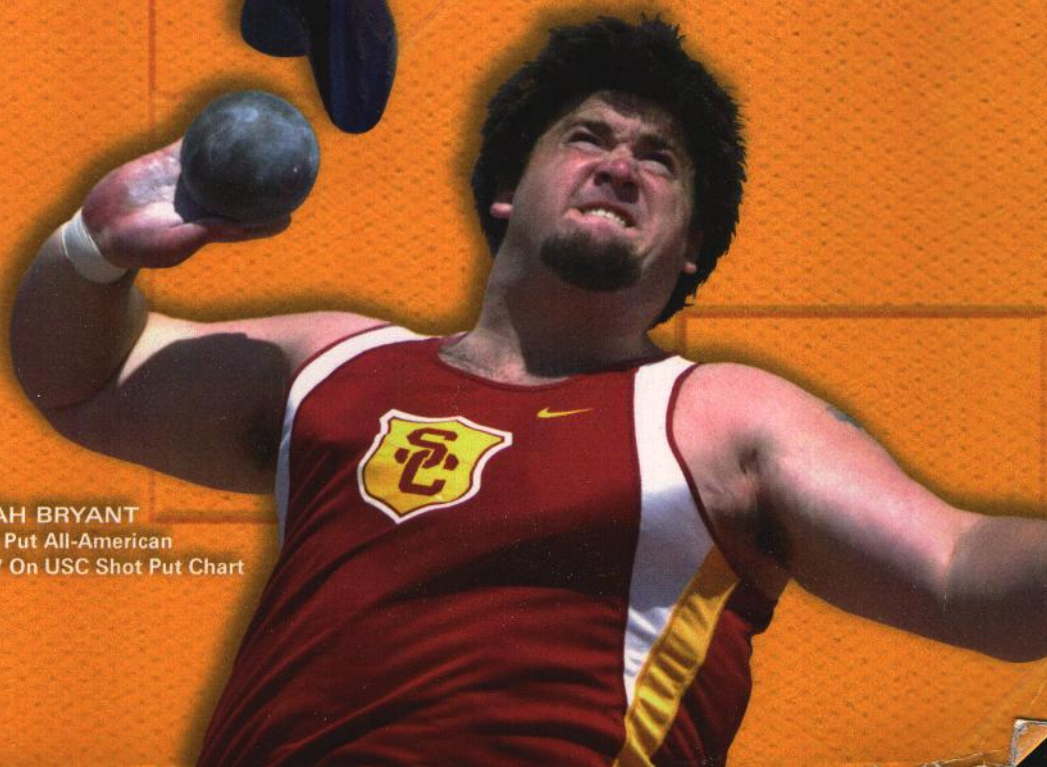

2005 USC Season Outlook

BALANCED SQUAD READY TO SHOW ITS STUFF

USC has been in the news a lot of late as a result of national titles won by the football team these past couple years.

If one weren't careful, one might forget that the the mightiest athletic legacy at Troy competes not at the Coliseum, the McDonald's swim stadium or the Lyon Center, but at Cromwell field within the confines of Katherine B. Loker Stadium.

It's the USC sport with the richest tradition and the most national championships. That sport is track and field.

Twenty-eight Trojan men's teams have brought home NCAA titles, the most of any school in the country. USC athletes have won 145 NCAA individual championships--again, more than any other school.

The tradition and excellence in achievement is not a thing of the past for USC track and field, but an ongoing affair. Each year seems to bring more champions, more records and more successes.

However, last year's team finished a disappointing 60th at the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas. But the previous season saw the USC men's team finish third at the NCAA Championships in Sacramento, Calif. The Trojans scored 41.5 points, their most since scoring 48 in 1977. It was also the highest team finish for USC since also finishing third in 1997.

In other words, USC men's track and field is alive and flourishing, despite the occasional dip in the road. Give most of the credit to the efforts of Director of Track and Field Ron Allice and his staff. They have kept alive USC's unparalleled tradition and their teams have created new standards of excellence.

This season, look for more of the same from USC. This year's squad is as balanced as any team in the Pac-10 and has the building blocks to once again fight its way near the top, where Trojan track and field belongs.

"We have a great mix of youth and experience," said Allice, who is in his 11th season at USC. "Last year was very disappointing to us. Everything that could go wrong, did go wrong. But this season we are on a mission to make everything right and compete at the highest levels to which we are accustomed."

"We have as much balance and depth as we have had in a long time. I expect us to be very good not only at the dual meet level, but at the conference and national level as well."

This year, the Trojans' path takes them crosstown to UCLA

for the Pac-10 Championships, then to Oregon for the NCAA West Regionals before heading to the NCAA Championships in Sacramento.

If the Trojans stay healthy and hungry, it could be another year to remember.

Squad Breakdown

The key to this year's team may lie in how well the sprint corps performs. The potential certainly is there, but the group has been nagged by injuries in the last couple years. This sprint corps features five athletes who have run 100m at 10.35 or better, making it perhaps the deepest group of speedsters at USC since the late 1970s.

Leading the way is senior **Wes Felix** (10.27/20.43), a tough competitor who is the two-time reigning Pac-10 champion at 200m. He's the first Trojan athlete to win back-to-back Pac-10 titles in the deuce since Clancy Edwards in the late 1970s. Look for him to make a splash at the national level this year. Senior **Marvin Anderson** (10.31/20.84) has loads of talent but was injured for much of last season. If he stays healthy, he could contend for All-American honors. Juniors **Phillip Francis** and **Garry Jones** are proven talents who were also struck by the injury bug last season. Francis (10.35) was the NCAA West Region's 100m champ last year, while Jones ran a wind-aided 10.26 early in the season and would have competed at the NAAs had he not been injured. Also in the mix are two talented freshmen in **Lionel Larry** (10.31/20.73) and **Christopher Peart** (10.40). Look for a combination of these runners to improve upon a sprint relay time of 39.35 last year and challenge for national acclaim in 2005.

"Our sprint corps had a great fall and looks to be in good shape for the spring," said sprints coach John Henry Johnson. "To start with, Wes Felix has really been outstanding this fall. He is as strong as he's ever been and is ready to take it to the next level. Anderson has so much talent, but must stay healthy. We will concentrate him mainly in the 200 this year. Francis is in the best shape of his life and could be a real surprise nationally. Jones is much stronger but also must stay healthy. Larry has been tremendous and will be a great one for us, while Peart is a real sleeper who has a solid work ethic."

In the 400 meters, juniors **Jeff Garrison** and **Patrick Wetzel** will carry the load. Garrison is a converted hurdler who has battled injury throughout his career, while Wetzel is a highly-regarded transfer from Moorpark Junior College with a best of 46.9 in the quarter. These two, plus a combination of Felix, Anderson, Larry, incoming freshman Kai Kelley, junior

Raphael Asafo-Agyei and sophomore Da'Sean Cunningham could comprise a swifter 1600m relay squad than last season's. Cunningham ran the 400m last year, but may move up to the 800m this season, while Kelley is an intermediate hurdler with relay experience. Felix, Anderson and Larry have all shown they are able to run very fast relay splits.

"There's not a lot of depth here," said Ron Allice, who coaches the men's quarter and middle distances. "Jeff Garrison needs to step up in order for us to be successful. He was converted because of a back injury. Wetzel came in mid year, so he didn't go through our fall program. He should come around by the end of the season. I think our 1600m relay will be much improved over the squads of the last few years, as there are more runners to choose from now."

The middle distances, under the direction of Laszlo Tabari, are a pillar of strength for the Trojans this season. Redshirt sophomore **Raphael Asafo-Agyei** is USC's top 800m runner (1:48.63). He was the NCAA West Regional champion and also the Pac-10 runner up in 2003, but missed the majority of last year due to a broken foot and had to redshirt. He has the potential to have an outstanding year and, along with vastly-improved senior **Anthony Heckman** (1:49.13), leads the pack in the middle distances. Heckman qualified for the NCAAs last season and should do so again this year. These two are joined by two promising runners in sophomore

Da'Sean Cunningham, a converted 400m sprinter, and incoming freshman **Duane Solomon** (1:49.79), who is a former California state high school champ. Senior **John Peschelt** adds depth in this area. In the 1500m, junior **Tomasz Babiskiewicz** (3:44.99) is the standard bearer and one of the best in the conference. He finished second at the Pac-10s as a freshman and is already third on the all-time USC 1500m chart. He can also run the 5000m. In that race and the steeplechase, look for Travis Beardslee, John Ciampa, William Davis, Daniel Seddiqui and Damon Ferrara to contribute.

"Both Asafo-Agyei and Heckman are proven talents and they will have great seasons for us," said Tabari. "Asafo-Agyei has worked hard this fall and should be a factor at the Pac-10 and NCAAs. Heckman keeps getting better and better and we expect him to again make it to NCAAs. Solomon is a huge talent and he will also run some in the 1500m. Cunningham could split time at 400m and 800m. He's got a lot of potential in either race. Babiskiewicz is a consistent 3:45 runner with the ability to run much faster this year."

The hurdles had been a major strength for the Trojans in recent years, thanks in part to 2003 NCAA champion Ryan Wilson. But this is an area that is still developing since his loss. Steady senior **Kenneth Thomas** is USC's top returning hurdler (14.31/52.78). He ran all of last year with a broken arm and was a Pac-10 finalist in the high hurdles. Speedy junior **Blake Frazier** (14.31), who was fast enough to run third leg on USC's 400m relay at times last season, also made the Pac-10 finals in the high hurdles. Others returning include **Jenson Wayne** (53.63) and **Alex Von Oech** (59.55) in the intermediates. This group should get a big boost with the addition of freshmen **Sheldon Evans**, **Kai Kelley** and **Logan Taylor**.

"Thomas showed a lot of grit last year and then he came through at the Pac-10s," said Allice. "Frazier had an excellent fall of training and should be vastly improved. Wayne and Van Oech give us depth, while the incoming guys have good ability and should make an impact."

The jumps were USC's bread and butter two years ago in 2003, as the Trojans scored 43 points in jumping events at the indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships and won three individual titles. It was definitely a season to remember for jumps coach Mike Pullins and his crew. This year has the potential to reach those lofty heights once again thanks to a fabulous trio of jumpers--senior triple jumper **Allen Simms**, junior high jumper **Jesse Williams** and freshman high jumper **Manjula Wijesekara**. In 2003, Simms became the first Trojan to win the indoor NCAA triple jump title and the first USC trackster since 1961 to earn All-America honors in both the long and triple jumps at the same NCAA outdoor meet. Simms is the Pac-10 record holder in the triple with a best of 56-7 1/2 and is fourth on the USC long jump list at 26-3 3/4. Simms is joined in the horizontal jumps by some non-scholarship athletes who nonetheless have a lot of potential: sophomore **Clark McGuire** (23-1 1/4/47-9) and sophomore **Inman Breaux** (47-7 1/4). As hard as it was to replace school record holder Dawid Jaworski in the high jump last year, the Trojans found the perfect fit in North Carolina State transfer **Jesse Williams**, who won All-American honors for the third time by finishing seventh at the NCAA Indoor Championships. He had a best of 7-4 1/4, third-best all time at USC. He'll be pushed by Sri Lankan freshman **Manula Wijesekara**, who participated in the Athens Olympics and has a best of 7-5.

"Two years ago, we almost jumped our way to a national title," said jumps coach Mike Pullins. "We should expect similar excitement from this year's trio. Both Allen Simms and Jess Williams have rededicated themselves and are more determined than ever to prove they belong among the nation's top jumpers. Jesse has his sights set on the school record set by Jaworski in 2003, but will have his hands full with Wijesekara. This may turn out to be the best high jump duo in the country. Clark McGuire has shown a great deal of improvement in the triple jump and is on pace to reach the 50-foot barrier soon. His training partner Inman Breaux redshirted last season but has clearly grown as a jumper. They both have Allen Simms to feed off of and that has proven to create a competitive environment. It will be exciting to see who gets to 50 feet first. Our jumpers have their eyes set on school records early and often. The key is to stay healthy and focused and to have fun."

USC has a great throws tradition and should add to that legacy this season. The group is young, but is improving by leaps and bounds. In the shot put last season, the Trojans had two 60-footers on the same squad for the first time in over 30 years. Junior **Noah Bryant** earned All-American honors and had a best of 62-5, seventh all-time at Troy. Right behind him was redshirt sophomore **William Denbo**, whose 62-0 1/2 put is eighth-best all-time at USC. Together, they are two of the most improved shot putters in the country. In the hammer, sophomore **Adam Midles** (205-8) returns off a redshirt year after qualifying for the NCAAs as a true freshman. Look for him to be the next great hammer thrower at USC. Bryant also throws the hammer, with a best of 189-6, and Denbo has thrown 171-9. Sophomore **Kevin Swartz** (157-0) adds depth. Junior javelin thrower **Dennis Rice** (209-2) is healthy again and should make an impact. He'll be backed by junior **Ryan Colich** (165-7). Midles is also a fine discus thrower and is expected to improve upon his PR of 168-10 as a freshman.

"We've got a good, hard-working group that should shine this season," said throws coach Dan Lange. "In the shot put, Bryant and Denbo are a formidable duo. They had an excellent fall and could both challenge for All-American honors. In the hammer, we've got Adam Midles coming off a redshirt year where he improved tremendously. He has a chance to finish very high at the NCAAs and we look for him to carry on the tradition of USC hammer excellence. Bryant threw just under 190 last year and should move to the next level this year, while Denbo adds good depth in the hammer, along with Kevin Swartz. Dennis Rice is training better than ever and I expect a big improvement from him. Midles will also help us some in the discus. Overall, there's some talent here that will, with hard work and good health, score points for us at the Pac-10s and NCAAs."

The Trojans will once again not field a scholarship pole vaulter, so redshirt freshman **Graham Bockmiller** (15-4) and junior **Brad Slinkard** (16-0) will carry the load here.

THIS YEAR: If healthy, senior Marvin Anderson could be one of the best sprinters in the country in 2005. **2004:** Anderson was hampered by injuries as a junior, but he still managed to

finish second to teammate Phillip Francis at the NCAA West Regional ... His best 100m time was a 10.31 at the Texas Relays ... At the NCAA Championships, he ran a wind-aided 10.29, but did not advance past the first round of the 100m. **CENTRAL ARIZONA COLLEGE:** Anderson was an All-American in his two seasons at Central Arizona College ... Had bests of 10.24 in the 100m and 20.62 in the 200m ... Was on the honors list for his work in the classroom. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Anderson prepped at St. Jago and William Knibb High School in Jamaica ... He was the Jamaica high school 100 and 200m champion his senior year of 2001 ... Was voted the Jamaica high school Athlete of the Year in 2001 ... Won the 100m title at the 2001 Central America and Caribbean games ... Finished sixth in the 200m at the 2000 World Junior Championships ... Had bests of 10.34 in the 100m and 20.82 in the 200m. **PERSONAL:** Marvin was born on May 12, 1982 ... His nickname is "Marvelous" ... He is an international relations major at USC.

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field • 11th Season

Like a phoenix rising from the ashes, USC track and field has reemerged as a force on the collegiate scene thanks to the work of Director of Track and Field Ron

Allice and his coaching staff.

Under the guidance of Allice and company, the Trojan men went on a run of seven consecutive top 10 finishes--a feat last accomplished during the late 1960s and early 1970s under Verne Wolfe--from 1994-2000 and have won three Pac-10 titles in the last seven years. The hallmark of an Allice team is balance--after all, the sport he coaches is called track and field--and his tenure has been marked by squads that have been able to compete for championships at the national, conference and dual meet level. In 2003, his men's team won the Pac-10 championship (though it was later forced to relinquish the title due to an ineligible athlete) and placed third at the NCAA meet. The year before, his young men's team finished third in the Pac-10 and tied for 11th at the NAAs. The previous season--2001--the Trojans were 12th at the NCAA meet and 2nd in the conference, while snapping crosstown rival UCLA's dual-meet win streak at 22. The seven seasons prior to 2001, Troy finished no lower than seventh at the NAAs (including three top-5 finishes) and won three Pac-10 titles. During his tenure, Trojan men have won six NCAA individual titles, garnered All-American acclaim 67 times and set six school records--not an easy task considering the glorious track and field history at USC.

Allice also runs perhaps the top women's program in the country. Before 2004's 12th-place and 2003's 13th-place finish at the NCAA meet, the Women of Troy were the only team in the country to finish in the NCAA top three each of the previous four years while winning at least one NCAA team title. In 2002, his squad finished third at the NAAs. It was led by the most celebrated sprinter in collegiate history, Angela Williams, who won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title and later was awarded the Honda/Broderick Cup given to the nation's top female collegiate athlete. In 2001, the Women of Troy put on a near-perfect meet to win their first NCAA team title. In 2000, USC took second--at the time, their best-ever showing at the NAAs. In 1999, USC was the only program that finished in the top five in both men's and women's track and field, as the women were third and the men fifth. In 1998, the women's team finished in fifth place. In 1997 they placed 14th, but that came on the heels of their first-ever Pac-10 title and a seventh-place NCAA finish in 1996. Allice's women's teams are feature powerhouse athletes who go on to shine on the national and world stages, including such stars as Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc and Torri Edwards.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 29 NCAA championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 40 Olympic gold medals and 16 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame - all encapsulated in 104 years of a rich and storied tradition.

And now, with the second century of Trojan track and field already well underway, Ron Allice and his staff continue to work hard to maintain the luster of USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 211-43-1 in 35 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 245 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and

college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous stops followed him — the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

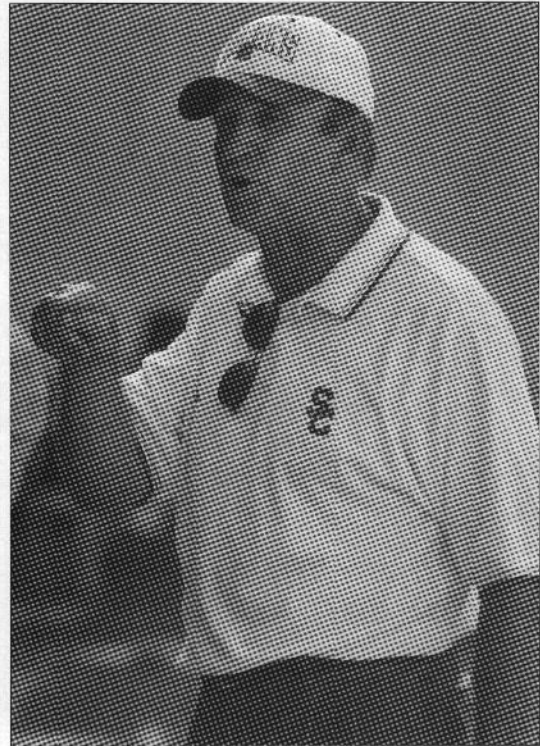
He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then went to Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

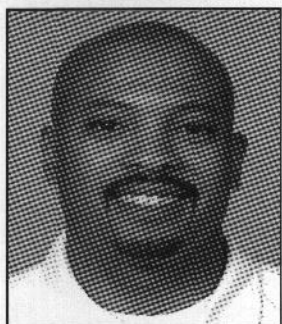
Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (37, who is a lawyer), Melinda (35, a USC graduate in the field of geriatric and special patient care who made Coach Allice a grandfather last July with the birth of her son, Jay Ron) and Sean (29, a USC graduate of the school of Cinema who is currently student teaching).

COACHING STAFF



JOHN HENRY JOHNSON, Jr. Sprints/Recruiting Coordinator

John Henry Johnson enters his 11th year as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach, but it is his prowess on the recruiting trail that has been the most instrumental in putting Troy back on the map.

Each of USC's past nine men's and women's recruiting classes have ranked among the best in the nation. Johnson has brought into the Trojan fold such superstars as Jerome Davis, Felix Sanchez, Denis Kholev, Charles Lee, Ryan Wilson and Julien Kapek on the men's side, and Angela Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc, Grezyna Penc and Inga Stasiulionyte on the women's side. His extensive knowledge of the world amateur track scene--bouyed by a degree in international relations--has proved invaluable to USC and has established Johnson as perhaps the preeminent recruiter of foreign track and field athletes in the last quarter century.

Johnson has coached USC's last three sprint All-Americans. In the 100m, Sultan McCullough captured such honors in 2000 and Jason Shelton

did so in 1996. In the 200m, Charles Lee was an All-American in 1998 and 1999. Current sprinter Wes Felix has won back-to-back Pac-10 200m titles--the first Trojan to do so since the late 1970s.

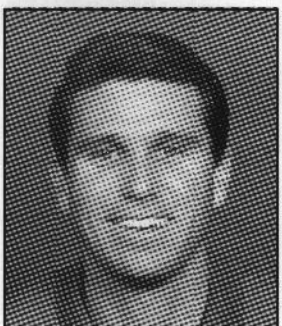
Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Alice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson--who is the son of NFL Hall-of-Famer John Henry Johnson--became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers.

In 1993, Johnson studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. His hobbies include writing, playing and recording music.

DAN LANGE Throws

After 15 years of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers, having coached his athletes to All-American honors 35 times.

The 39-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships (and a collegiate record) and aided USC throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. In 1997, despite the departure of Kiss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA hammer title. Johansson was runner up in the hammer in 1998, as was Norbert Horvath in 1999 (Horvath also finished fifth in 2000 and third in 2001). At the 2000 Pac-10 Championships, USC continued its men's hammer domination, sweeping the top four spots to key the Trojans' title run. In 2001, Horvath captured his third straight Pac-10 hammer title and third straight All-American honor. In 2002, Lange guided walk ons Michael Murray and Harrison Lee into the Pac-10 finals. In 2004, Murray earned USC's 12th All-American honor in the hammer, while Noah Bryan became Troy's first shot put All-American since 1984.

On the women's side, he has coached 2001 NCAA javelin champ and Pac-10 record-holder Inga Stasiulionyte, 2003 NCAA runner-up and former Pac-10 hammer record-holder Julianna Tudja, 2002 hammer All-American and 2004 shot put All-American (and school record holder) L'Orangerie Crawford, 2001 shot put All-American and school discus record holder Cynthia Ademiluyi, two-time hammer All-American Jenni-

fer Vail, 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA runner-up Nicole Haynes and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer).

Outside of USC, Lange is currently coaching hammer thrower Lisa Misipeka, who holds the American Samoa record in that event, plus Tudja. He was at one time the coach for two-time U.S. Olympian discus thrower Adam Setliff.

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant.

He and his wife Darcy (Arreola), who was one of America's finest middle distance runners and a former NCAA champion, reside in Valencia, Calif., with their son, Dylan, age four.

TOM WALSH

Distances/Women's Cross Country

Tom Walsh enters his 11th year as middle and long distance coach at USC. He also serves as the head women's cross country coach.

During his tenure, the Women of Troy middle and long distance program has consistently been one of the best in the country. In fact, no other middle-distance program in the country in the last decade--except for USC's under Tom Walsh--has had a four-time All-American in both the 800m and the 1500m at the NCAA Championships.

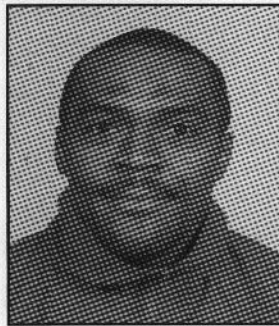
During the last nine years, USC middle and long distance runners have captured All-American honors 19 times, including an NCAA 800m championship by four-time All-American Brigita Langerholc in 2001. Langerholc also finished a surprising fourth in the 800m at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney in a school-record time of 1:58.51. Another Walsh product was Grazyna Penc, a four-time All-American in the 1,500m. Penc finished third in 1996 and 1998, fourth in 1997 and was runner up in 1999. Emebet Shiferaw was a two-time All-American in the 3,000m

in 1996-97. Her best NCAA finish was second place. Anna Lopaciuch twice earned All-American honors in the 1500m, finishing fifth in 1998 and third in 2000. In 2002, Aleksandra Deren placed seventh in the 800m at the NCAAs. Last year, Julia Budniak became the first Women of Troy athlete to earn All-American honors in the 3000m steeplechase as she finished sixth. Iryna Vashchuk was also an All-American last year in the 1500m as she also finished sixth. This past cross country season, Iryna Vascshuk qualified for the NCAA Championships for the second year in a row. It was the fourth year in a row that a Women of Troy cross country runner qualified for the NCAAs. Brooke Thomas and Sarah Ellis qualified in 2002 and 2001, respectively.

Walsh graduated from USC in 1988, and served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater for three years in the late 1980s. He also served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the U.S. Olympic Trials.

MIKE PULLINS

Jumps

Mike Pullins is in his seventh year as jumps coach at USC. Coach "Mike," as he likes to be called, is responsible for coaching both the women and men's jumpers.

Under his tutelage, the USC jumpers have been mainstays on the honors podium at the NCAA Championships. Last year, he coached Jesse Williams to indoor All-American honors in the high jump. However, 2003 was an especially bountiful year.

At the 2003 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Pullins guided Julien Kapek to the triple jump title--USC's first outdoors since 1961--while Allen Simms placed third. Simms, who also finished seventh in the long jump outdoors, won the triple jump at the NCAA Indoor Championships earlier in the year with a Pac-10-record jump of 56-7 1/2. To cap off a remarkable season for USC jumps, Dawid Jaworski won the NCAA high jump title--Troy's first since 1963--with a school-record jump of 7-5 3/4. All totaled, Pullins' athletes scored a remarkable 43 points at the indoor and outdoor NCAA meets.

In 2002, Julien Kapek set a school triple jump record with a jump of 55-8 1/2 and then went on to place third at the NCAAs. The year prior, Djeke Mambo became the first Trojan to win both the long jump and triple jump at the Pac-10s since Luther Hayes in 1961. On the women's side, he guided freshman Michelle Sanford to the Pac-10 long jump championship in 2004, while Tatyana Obukhova took

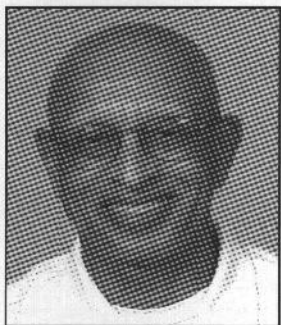
her third-straight Pac-10 triple jump championship and a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs in 2002. The year before, Obukhova was third at the NCAAs. In his first year, he coached Pam Simpson to a third-place finish at the 1999 NCAAs. He also helped Disia Page and Stephanie Jones land on the USC top 10 charts in the long jump. In fact, four of the 10 women on USC's long jump chart were coached by Pullins.

A 1987 graduate of USC, his name is still among the top ten triple jumpers on the all-time Trojan charts. As a high school senior Mike qualified for the CIF Championships in four individual events and went on to win the triple jump, in which he placed fifth in the 1982 state meet. Mike starred at Cal State Northridge and Pasadena City College before coming to Troy. A three-time USA Track & Field outdoor qualifier (he qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials), he was forced to set track aside due to injuries and four ankle surgeries in 1994.

Mike is single and currently working on his master's degree in education.

He was an elite athlete in track and field for over 10 years, representing the U.S. on numerous national teams. For 12 years, he was the coordinator in "Promotions for Olympics" for Adidas, USA.

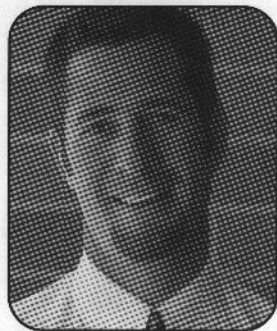
Famed distance great Lazlo Tabari works with the men's distances

Tabari has a wealth of experience to share with the Trojans. After all, he was the third man to break the 4 minute barrier in the mile. He did so on May 28th, 1955, joining Roger Bannister and John Landy in that elite group.

Laszlo's coaching methods are well founded. Trained himself by the great middle distance Hungarian coach Mihaly Igloi in Hungary and then later in the United States after the 1956 Olympic Games, Tabori is a great believer in the interval method of training.

He coached Valley Junior College in the 1970s where his team won three state titles and held the national junior record for the 10,000 distance medley and the 4 X 1 mile relay.

Jacqueline Hansen, winner of the Boston and Western Hemisphere Marathons and Miki Gorman, winner of the New York City and Boston Marathons, were two of his athletes who achieved international recognition during the 1970s.

LENNOX MILLER, 1946-2004

Olympic 100-meter silver medalist Lennox Miller, a sprinter on two USC track and field NCAA championship teams and a part of the reigning world-record 440-yard relay squad, passed away on Monday, Nov. 8, 2004, of cancer in Pasadena at the age of 58.

He is survived by his wife, Avril, and two daughters, Inger--herself a USC track alum and Olympic medalist--and Heather.

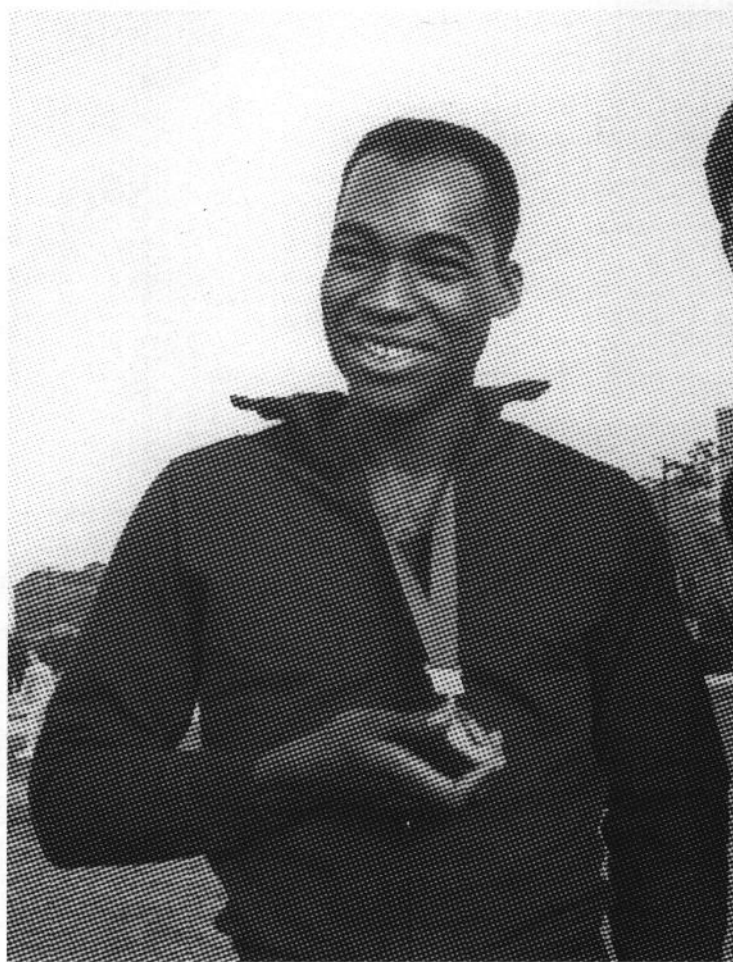
A memorial service was held at USC on Nov. 19th at the United University Church and a reception was held afterwards in Heritage Hall. A large turnout of Trojan alumni was present.

Born in Kingston, Jamaica, Miller lettered for Trojan coach Vern Wolfe's squad from 1967-69.

He holds the school record for the 100-yard dash (9.2 seconds) and ran the anchor leg on USC's sprint relay team that--along with Earl McCullouch, Fred Kuller and O.J. Simpson--won the NCAA title with a still-standing world record for 440 yards (38.6). Miller was the NCAA 100-yard dash runner-up in 1967 and the 100m champion in 1968 as the Trojans won NCAA team titles both years. Miller's 47 career NCAA championship points is the third-best total in USC history.

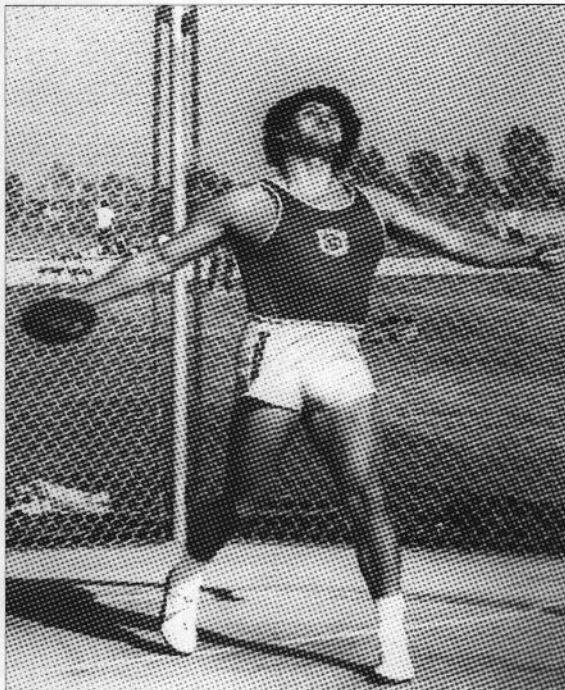
After the 1968 collegiate season, Miller competed for Jamaica at the Mexico City Olympics, winning the silver medal in the 100m dash. He set the world record in the indoor 100-yard dash in 1969, the same year he was USC's team captain. He was ranked in the top 3 in the world in the 100-meter dash for three straight years (1967-69), then went on to win a 100m bronze in the 1972 Munich Olympics. He remains one of the greatest sprinters in USC's storied track and field history.

Miller graduated from the USC School of Dentistry in 1973, then ran a successful dental practice in Pasadena for the next 30 years. His daughter, Inger, carried on the family sprint tradition, starring at USC before winning a gold medal in the 400m relay at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

Paths of Glory

The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

USC is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 100 men's and women's national championships. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43).

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s and World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez in the 2000s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons.

However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as headcoach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thopson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thomson and Bourland brought home gold medals in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in

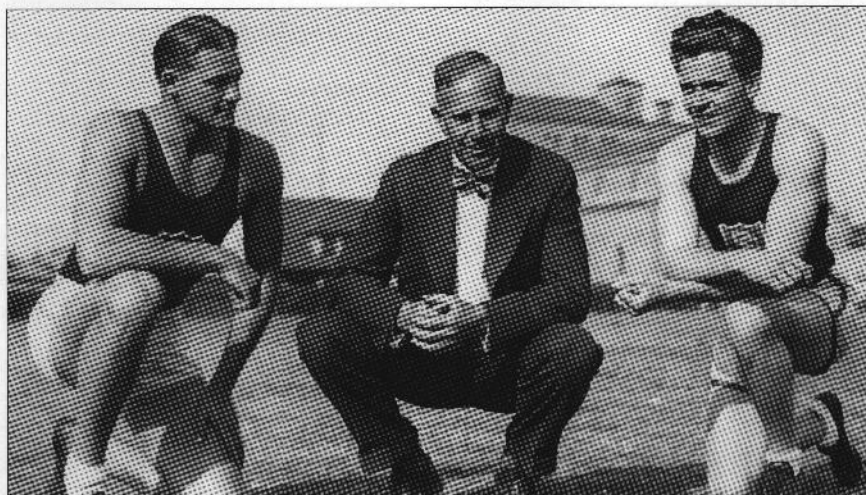
the world. Cromwell's influence extended far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his long-time friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field his-

tory was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 22 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw.

Consequently, he helped lay the foundation for the latest in the distinguished line of Trojan head track coaches: Ron Allice.

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995-Present

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.

He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In



1996, his Women of Troy won their first-ever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's team to its first Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NCAAs. At the 1998 NCAAs, he led the USC men's team to seventh-place and the Women of Troy to fifth. In 1999, the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NCAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history). In 2000, the men finished seventh--their seventh consecutive top 10 finish--while the women placed second--their highest finish ever. In 2001, Allice guided the Women of Troy to their first-ever NCAA team championship while the men tied for 12th. In 2002, the women were third and the men tied for 11th at the NCAAs, then in 2003, the men finished third (as three Trojans won NCAA titles) and the women tied for 13th.

Allice has a career dual meet record of 211-43-1 at five schools, and he has coached more than 252 All-Americans, 20 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.

"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," Allice said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for 105 glorious years, is in good hands.

Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer.

USC's two-mile relay of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remember and ran 7:14.4 to set a world record at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 13, 1966.

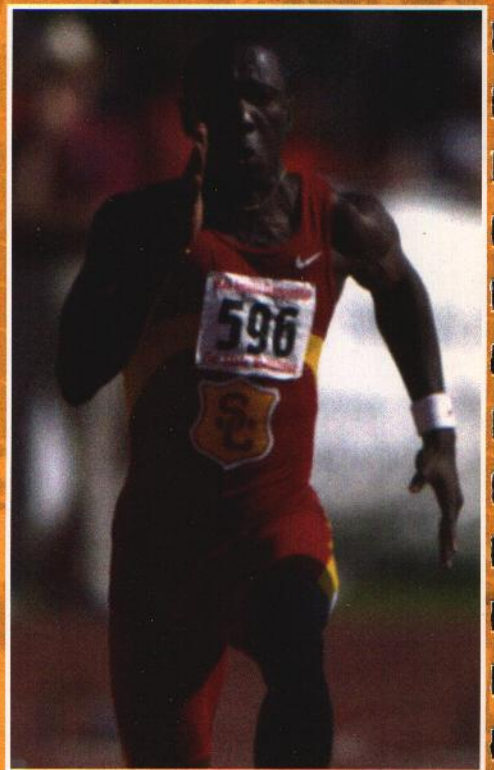
