

General Conference 2024 Contributed by UMDAILYNEWS

Planning a big family wedding with dozens of people coming in for a weekend is challenge enough.

But imagine trying to bring more than a thousand people together from four continents for a gathering that lasts two weeks.



They speak 10 languages, have various dietary needs, require multiple hotel rooms and must be able to come together to pray, worship and make decisions that affect millions of United Methodists. Hundreds of these visitors also need visas just to attend. (excerpt from a story by Heather Hahn, assistant news editor, *UMNews*.)

This is the General Conference of the United Methodist Church. The General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the international denomination. General Conference brings together lay and clergy delegates from four continents whose decisions will affect how millions of United Methodists do church for years to come.

The coming General Conference, scheduled for April 23rd - May 3rd in Charlotte, North Carolina, comes at a particularly momentous time. Typically gathering every four years, the pandemic caused the 2020 meeting to be canceled. Which means the last regular session was in May, 2016. In that time, the denomination has seen a quarter of its U.S. churches depart under a disaffiliation policy.

What comes next for the international denomination will be largely up to General Conference itself.

What does General Conference do?

General Conference is the denomination's highest legislative body. As such, it has the authority to make revisions to the denomination's *Book of Discipline* and *Book of Resolutions*. The Book of Discipline is the denomination's governing document that contains its doctrine, constitution, church law, rules of organization and procedures. The Book of Resolutions contains the denomination's positions on current social issues.



In addition, the assembly approves theological statements on subjects such as baptism and communion. The coming General Conference will consider adopting a theological statement on the United Methodist understanding of church titled "Sent in Love."

Garden Ministry




Well, this "NO winter" winter has made our gardens awaken early and start to bloom. While a pretty good fall cleanup was done, we are going to have to be out there pretty soon.

Here at OCCUMC, our mission includes growing in faith and inviting others to become disciples of Jesus Christ. Sometimes, that means moving out of familiar spaces to meet youth where they are available. Here are some ways we've found fellowship, faith, and service with youth this year:

In **January**, we made use of a limited window of snow by heading to The Rock in Franklin for some tubing. Everyone had a great time zipping down the slopes, and although it was windy, the sun was bright and kept us warm until we headed in for hot chocolate. Joining us were youth from Faith Presbyterian Church, a renewed connection of ministry from years ago when I was a youth welcomed to join in their events.



After the snow tubing, we began exploring mission trip opportunities for the summer.



In **February**, we moved forward in earnest with our first fundraiser. The youth spent a couple of hours preparing and freezing soups, and the following week we offered those soups for sale during Soup-er Bowl Sunday. Thanks to your generosity and support, we sold over 60 containers of soup and received several donations. This will help us have a truly meaningful experience as we seek to serve those in need.

March marked the return of

a favorite activity, the Escape Room. With over a dozen participants, we split into two teams to tackle two separate challenges: surviving a great storm, and discovering Merlin's legacy. Working together, each team was able to discover clues and solve puzzles to beat the games – and we all had a great time doing it!



As we continue finding new and exciting ways to open opportunities for their fellowship, faith, and service, I want to remind you how much we appreciate the support you are already giving. 


Personal Dignity Kit

Liquid laundry detergent - 100-150 oz. total

1 Scrub brush (with or without handle)

⇒ Lotion 8-10 oz. (no pumps); Diaper Cream 2 oz (not A&D)

The following items don't need to be new!

⇒ <u>Sewing machines</u> electric and treadles (We can accept sewing machines that need a little tuning up, oiling, etc. We cannot accept the computerized ones.)

⇒ <u>Bicycles</u> (adult in good condition with minimal rust)

⇒ <u>Medical equipment</u> such as folding walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, canes, knee scooters, shower chairs, hospital beds, walking boots, and slings. (no toilet risers please)

⇒ Blankets new or gently used, for disaster response

⇒ Non-electric tools specifically shovels, brooms, rakes

A quick Trustee team update: With Kathy B stepping down, Jane E has stepped into the vice-chair role. Thank you, Jane!!



We will be staying in the Rader Retreat Center, where each room has a double and a single bed with private bathroom. Bedding and towels will be provided. Projects will include installing docks and piers, cleaning cabins and washing windows. There will probably be wood cutting, splitting, stacking, chipping and general grounds clean-up - whatever

projects the staff has on the priority list. You provide your own transportation to camp, with a cost of \$200.00 per person for the week or \$40.00 per day. You are encouraged to come for a day or two even if you can't stay the whole week. **Registration deadline is April 30th**, with a deposit of \$40.

September 26th - October 4th - Lake Lucerne UMC Camp, Neshkoro. Join us for a week of



fellowship, fun and hard work! Plan to arrive and settle into your room in one of the cabins, then join us for dessert and our first evening together in Ridgewood, where we will share morning and evening devotions each day. Meals will be eaten in the Lodge starting with Monday breakfast and concluding with breakfast on Friday. Tasks may range from cleaning out cabins (washing windows, sweeping floors), to bringing in work

at the waterfront, to cutting down trees and brush, to roof repairs and laying new sidewalk! We will do what the staff asks us to do -- and more! Fall or spring, Lucerne is a place to appreciate God's creation. You provide your own transportation to camp. Cost: \$200.00 - includes lodging, meals, work supplies and donation to camp. To insure adequate planning, registration deadline is September 1st with a deposit of \$40.

Food Pantry

We support our community and neighbors in need by supporting the Salvation Army. Please drop off non-perishable food items at the Salvation Army or visit their website to make an online donation at https://centralusa.salvationarmy.org/oakcreek/

The Oak Creek Centennial Corps Food Pantry on Howell and Centennial Drive also provides a 2-3-day supply of emergency food to neighborhood individuals and families in these zip codes: 53129, 53130, 53132, & 53154, on Wednesday & Thursdays: 9:00 am - Noon. The food is given on the day it is requested and represents breakfast, lunch, and dinner for all members of the household. Those receiving food are also informed about how they can participate in supplemental food programs so they can move beyond visiting food pantries. The following are required in order to be eligible:

- Client picture ID (Must have current address and be shown every time)
- School record, Birth Record, Birth Certificate, for children in household. If you do not have this information you will only be served for yourself and not the other household members
- 2 proofs of residence (Mail and utility bill from the last 30 days).

Mobile Market

The Mobile Market is a grocery store on wheels that travels throughout Milwaukee County with grocery staples, such as fruits, vegetables, milk (dairy & non dairy options), chicken, beef, pork, deli meat, cheese,



yogurt, etc. Canned items or processed foods are not sold here. The market is an active store, not a food pantry or donation center. Prices are 50% off Piggly Wiggly prices. The market accepts debit cards, credit cards and Quest EBT, but no cash. Hours and days vary at locations in South Milwaukee, St. Francis, Cudahy and Franklin.

Senior Stock Box Distribution

Hunger Task Force is distributing a box of free, healthy food for seniors at different spots around Milwaukee County. All stockboxes include cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese. Qualifications are:



- 60 years or older (Bring an ID showing your age)
- Monthly household income of less than \$1,580 (1 person) or \$2,137 (2 persons) (NEW)
- Be a resident of Wisconsin
- Paperwork will be filled out at each site by Hunger Task Force employees.
- ⇒ 1st Thursday of the month from 1:00-2:00 pm at the Greenfield City Hall, 7325 West Forest Home Avenue;
- ⇒ 1st Friday of the month from 1:00-2:00 pm at the Grobschmidt Senior Center, 2424 15th Avenue in South Milwaukee;
- ⇒ 2nd Thursday of the month from 12:30-1:30 pm at Franklin Senior Meals in City Hall, 9229 West Loomis Road;
- ⇒ 3rd Thursday of the month from 12:30-1:30 pm at the Kelly Senior Center, 6100 South Lake Drive, Cudahy
- ⇒ Every Tuesday & Thursday from 10:00 am till Noon at St. Stephen Church,
 1441 West Oakwood Road in Oak Creek.
