AREA OVERVIEW

The City of Livermore is a great place to live, work and play. In 2016, 93 percent of residents rated the city's quality of life as "excellent" or "good" in a biannual survey. With a focus on public safety, libraries and economic vitality, Livermore is a great place to thrive and grow.

The City of Livermore invites you to discover all our wonderful community has to offer. Livermore's arts, culture, science and technology; western heritage; and vibrant wine industry provide a unique blend for our diverse residents and visitors. Festivals, farmers markets and parades bring people to our beloved, award-winning downtown, while our two national labs bring scientists from around the world to develop new technologies and solve some of the world's most difficult challenges.

Livermore is home to California's oldest commercial wine region, boasting more than 50 flourishing wineries. The region is renowned for its award-winning wines and genuine hospitality. The Livermore Valley played a pivotal role in shaping California's wine industry with the planting of the first grapes by Spanish missionaries in the 1760s. Pioneer winemakers C. H. Wente and James Concannon founded wineries in the early 1880s that are still in operation today. Attracted by Livermore's rich winemaking tradition, climate, soil and geography, new winemakers are working alongside fifth-generation winegrowers to create a Livermore Valley wine renaissance.

Livermore offers premium shopping, dining and entertainment throughout the year. The historic downtown district is the destination place for Livermore residents and guests who want to eat, drink, shop, gather to meet neighbors and friends and enjoy cultural activities. The many locally-owned shops and restaurants, the Bankhead Performing Arts Center and live entertainment venues make downtown Livermore an exciting destination for all. The San Francisco Premium Outlets offer world-class shopping with over 150 stores to suit all shopping needs and desires. Home to Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and Sandia National Laboratories, Livermore is a technological hub and an academically engaged community that successfully competes in the global market.

Through initiatives such as Innovation Tri-Valley and the i-GATE Switch, Livermore is a place for businesses of all sizes that advance collaboration, foster innovation and promote a culture of entrepreneurship in the greater East Bay Region. Livermore also distinguishes itself from other cities by its representation on the Periodic Table of Chemical Elements. Livermorium, Element 116, is named after the city and Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. Researchers from the lab worked with scientists from Russia's Flerov Laboratory of Nuclear Reactions to synthesize Livermorium and Element 114 Flerovium.

Livermore's eclectic blend of science, arts, western culture and award-winning wineries and breweries make it a community worth exploring. The city's diverse amenities, business-friendly atmosphere and strong public schools make it a perfect location for new residents, entrepreneurs and businesses of all sizes like new arrivals Tesla Motors and the Gillig Bus Company.

LIVERMORE VALLEY WINE COUNTRY A THRIVING WINE REGION IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA



Visitors are sometimes surprised to find a flourishing expanse of vineyards and wineries less than an hour to the east of San Francisco:
Livermore Valley Wine Country.
Sharing the picturesque canyons and ridges of the area with outposts of suburbia, the welcoming sight of vines and tasting rooms defines the quality of life in the Livermore Valley.
To the delight of residents and visitors alike, the region continues to experience a wine renaissance harking back to the golden years of early California wine history.

The Livermore Valley is one of California's oldest wine regions and played a pivotal role in shaping California's wine industry. Robert Livermore planted the first commercial vines in the 1840s. Pioneer winemakers C. H. Wente, James Concannon and Charles Wetmore recognized the area's winegrowing potential and founded their wineries in the early 1880s. International recognition followed when Livermore Valley captured America's first international gold medal for wine in 1889 at the Paris Exposition – putting California on the world wine map.

Playing a leading role in the state's enology and viticulture, innovations developed in the Livermore Valley include overhead irrigation, mechanical harvesting and roller crushing in the vineyard. Livermore Valley wineries were the first to bottle Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Petite Sirah varietals. Nearly 80 percent of California's Chardonnay vines trace their genetic roots to a Livermore Valley clone.

Attracted to the rich winemaking tradition, climate, soil and geography, new vintners and winegrowers work alongside fift h-generation winegrowers creating a Livermore Valley wine renaissance. The region now has over 5,000 acres of vineyards and over 50 wineries, with more poised to open. Wineries vary in size from limited-release, 100-case labors of love to 400,000-case industry heavyweights, and grapes range from familiar Merlot and Chardonnay to Italian, Rhone and Spanish varieties. The award-winning wines of the Livermore Valley can be found around the globe.

The Livermore Valley Winegrowers Association invites Bay Area residents and visitors to experience the Livermore Valley Wine Country. In addition to a myriad of happenings at the individual wineries, the association hosts several major events each year showcasing the talent, energy and fine wine of the Livermore Valley American Viticulture Area.





BUSINESS


Livermore's world-class talent pool and amenities, as well as its proximity to major cities in the San Francisco Bay Area and the Central Valley make it an ideal location for starting and growing businesses. Innovative companies from small start-up entrepreneurs to large high-tech manufacturers and the national laboratories have made Livermore home. Industries that are growing in Livermore include high tech manufacturing, life sciences, construction, healthcare, retail, hospitality, tourism and advanced technology. The city also boasts a variety of commercial real estate offerings with more than 22 million square feet of retail, office flex research & development, and industrial buildings to meet the needs of a diverse business economy. TRANSPORTATION

The City of Livermore is located approximately 30 miles east of the San Francisco Bay in the Tri-Valley region of Alameda County, adjacent to the I-580 corridor at the junction of State Route 84/Isabel Avenue.

Public transit is plentiful in the Livermore Valley. Livermore owns and operates the 643-acre Livermore Municipal Airport located at 680 Terminal Circle. It is a general aviation airport serving private and corporate customers. The facility has two parallel runways, a 5,255-foot lighted main runway and a 2,700-foot training runway, along with 24 city-owned operations buildings.

In addition to the city's own airport, three international airports, Oakland, San Jose and San Francisco, are within an hour's drive.




