The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC), at its regular monthly meeting on April 25, 2024, reviewed the above-referenced application. Our review was based on the adopted plans and policies of the LVPC. We offer the following comments.

The purpose of the application is to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 1.5 million gallons per day wastewater treatment plant and related discharge. The average flow to the plant is 830,000 gallons per day. The plant serves Slatington Borough and Washington Township in Lehigh County and Lehigh Township and Walnutport Borough in Northampton County and is located to the west of the Lehigh River on Railroad Street. No expansion or modification of the treatment plant is proposed with this application.

The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC), at its regular monthly meeting on April 25, 2024, reviewed the above-referenced application. Our review was based on the adopted plans and policies of the LVPC. We offer the following comments.

The purpose of the application is to renew approval of the BlueTriton Brands, Inc./Green Waltz Water Company's existing groundwater withdrawal of up to 17.05 million gallons per month (mgm) from two existing borehole sources and approve a new borehole source to continue to supply their bottling facilities located in Upper Macungie Township, Lehigh County. The total combined groundwater allocation from all sources will remain at 17.05 mgm. The purpose of the new source is to provide operational flexibility for the Green Waltz facility. The applicant anticipates the current allocation of groundwater to meet its demands over the next ten years, therefore, no increase in allocation is proposed with this application. The applicant will continue to implement an on-going, long-term groundwater monitoring program and maintain a pass-by flow of 1.05 cubic feet/second in Greenwalk Creek.

The project aligns with the *FutureLV: The Regional Plan* action to 'protect the quality and quantity of surface water and groundwater" (of Policy 3.2). According to Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC) documentation, no substantial adverse impacts are anticipated with the continued withdrawal. In addition, DRBC may modify or suspend its approval or any permit condition to mitigate adverse impacts.
