

Updated Covid-19 Policy, August 2021

Staff and volunteers who are vaccinated are encouraged to follow company guidelines regarding masking, where they apply. Both staff and volunteers are asked to stay home if they've knowingly been exposed to a person with Covid-19. If a volunteer or staff member learns they've been exposed to, or test positive for, Covid-19 after they've been on the job site, they are asked to report these findings to the SCV Habitat for Humanity executive director as soon as they learn of their exposure or positive test result.

Positive Covid Exposure:

Staff who are fully vaccinated and have been in close contact with a person who has tested positive for Covid-19 (within 6 feet for a cumulative of 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period) are asked to stay home and get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms; and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test result is negative.

Unvaccinated staff who have been exposed to an individual who has tested positive for Covid-19 are asked to quarantine for 14 days after last exposure, returning after a negative test.

High touch areas on the job site, including hard hats, goggles, and gloves, will be cleaned and disinfected at the end of each work day.

SCV Habitat for Humanity will defer to guidelines updated by Habitat for Humanity International, and/or CDC as they are updated. A review of these guidelines will be made when work on the job site continues inside, wherein volunteers and staff may be asked to mask to maximize protection from, and to help prevent the spread of, the Delta variant.
