- Old Business:
 - Re-cap last year's closing of books Amanda & Kerri
 - Last year's books closed on June 30, 2022 we expected to spend \$51K and bring in \$54K
 - Overage we ended up spending \$54k, but...
 - Brought in over \$80K in 2022-2023 because of Harlem Wizards event also had overage of about \$8K from 2021
 - Plan to spend overage <u>VOTE</u> <u>APPROVED</u> 15 YES; 0 NO
 - Outdoor classroom for about 25 kids \$17-\$20K for outdoor tables and benches for outdoor learning
 - Field trip support \$1K to each grade or \$7K for field trips
 - Recess cart approx \$2,500 for equipment to enhance recess sports and soccer balls, board games, hula hoops

- Other ideas for future funds air conditioning for 2nd floor (likely too expensive for PTA bc
 of rewiring), online STEM curriculum, member idea (Gretchen) "science in a box" toolkits
 to teach STEM
- Member question how do we ensure teachers will use outdoor space? Principal Brennan if you build it they will come, teachers and students will be excited about the new outdoor classroom and will want to use it

New Business:

- Kerri Chituk to briefly discuss all events, programs, fundraisers, etc (see calendar on website for things happening thru Dec 31) & Amanda Ayzenburg, Treasurer, to discuss budget for this school year
 - Tried to take everyone's feedback so families aren't overwhelmed; keep the spirit of fundraising going

Budget

- Operational Costs \$3K or 10% of budget- i.e. PO box, accountant fees, website maintenance
- Membership and Donations i.e. membership fees, dues to state PTA
- School-based initiatives i.e. book fair, holiday shop, kindergarten orientation
- 6th grade graduation
- Fundraisers projected to net \$21K
 - Charleston Wrap new company to keep things fresh, more variety and higher quality, can link siblings together to combine sales
 - Direct ask new idea for families who do not want to buy or sell merchandise
 - Raise-Craze new idea aligns with our culture, teaches children to be kind human beings students perform acts of kindness individually/as a class/school to raise money for the school; partner with newspaper to raise awareness, PTA keeps 90% of proceeds
 - Coin challenge Super Mario theme (tbc) PTA keeps 100% of funds bucket for each grade level and grade with most points win - pennies and dollars are positive points, silver coins are negative points; classes strategize how to earn points/win
 - Box Tops increasing communication about this ongoing program; all digitized through an app that scans receipts
 - Halloween Candy Buy Back Orthodontist in Riverhead pays \$1 per pound up to \$200

 Trunk or Treat - one of the most popular events; would like to keep it free of charge; potentially partner with a local organization to open up to community and secure funding

- 5th/6th Tuck Night Social charge to cover some expenses
- Family movie night at Peconic Bay Vineyards or Harbes free of charge
- o Family yoga/fitness day free of charge
- Apparel pre-ordered apparel that we already have stock in and squardlocker.com for online orders
- Community based events i.e. CAST winter clothing drive, WINGO 3 main events, free of charge
- Field Day Tshirts End of year gift for teachers and students
- Teacher Initiatives teacher mini grants for new materials, teacher appreciation, PTA end of year thank you
- Total \$34K expenses, \$36K fundraising profits conservative estimate and we usually raise
 more money <u>VOTE</u> <u>APPROVED 14 YES; 0 NO</u>

 - Parents night out
 - Craft night Home Depot can donate items and help run the event, 3 mo lead time
