Russ Baker's Life Story by Catherine Walker and Susan Brockwell

Russ Baker was born May 20, 1902 to James and Mary Ellen Baker on a farm on the corner of the 6th Line and Hwy 91. He and his sister, Irene, attended school in Duntroon.

Russ was a prime example of a willing volunteer throughout his life. He continuously contributed to the growth of our town. He also had several business enterprises, which included: a chicken hatchery

located behind Jubilee Presbyterian Church, and Baker Canning Factory located south of the Co-op. He grew the tomatoes on the farm and employed 20 people. Russ decided he needed someone to share his life so he chose Gladys Millie from Creemore. She worked in Blackburns and Russ thought she was "pretty special". Gladys had a beautiful singing voice and her dad was the choir director and her mom, the organist, in the Anglican Church in Creemore. They were married on Dec. 27, 1931. Joan (deceased) was born in 1933, Catherine in 1934, and Susan in 1942.

In 1940, Russ joined the RCAF. While stationed in Ottawa in 1942, preparing to ship out, he received a

telegram from Dr. Ives Sr. saying "me and mommie are fine, love Susan" He was able to get leave to go home to his new daughter before shipping out.

Gladys kept the home fires burning with her Hairdressing Business.

After returning home from the War, Russ and Gladys started building the business, known as Kingsway Gardens in 1947. It started as a greenhouse and gardening business and later the florist business was added. Gladys took the Florists course in Guelph and Catherine took the same course 11 years later. Susan had her own hairdressing business on Main Street.

In 1976, after 30 years, Russ and Gladys sold Kingsway Gardens and retired to their home on Point Street. Gladys passed away in 1979. Russ carried on caring for the property and creating in his workshop clocks, curio cabinets, kayaks and coffee tables. Russ was very instrumental in forming "Flowers Canada"

> and became a Director. Russ used his gardening skills to care for town parks, cemetery and lawn-bowling greens.

> Russ was instrumental in numbering the homes in Stayner! He was a charter member of the Stayner Lions Club and Royal Canadian Legion. He managed the "Rockets", (Juvenile Hockey Team) as well as running the booth at the old arena for hockey and Teen Town dances.

Russ was instrumental in promoting artificial ice in the old arena and his efforts were commended when he was presented with the Bicentennial Award in Stayner from Ontario's Premier, Bill Davis for outstanding service to the community.

Russ also published 2 books. The first

was in 1988(at the age of 86) "Curling in Simcoe County". The next year, he published "Lawn Bowls Canada". He also wrote a column for the Stayner Sun, called "The Way I See It". The Editor, Dave Phillips, often commented on Russ' wide range of interests and humility.

He was a "doer - not a teller", whether it was organizing projects, sports, or any other field.

Russ was among the first to volunteer his help. He was proud of his community, and over the years, one of its finest ambassadors! The Town of Stayner was much richer for having Russ Baker as a resident!
