### From the Bridge Minister

"The best way to show my gratitude is to accept everything, even my problems, with joy." ~ Mother Teresa

Mother Teresa, who wrote of her gratitude, was of Albanian descent and felt the call of God when she was 12 years old. She devoted herself to working among the poorest of the poor in the slums of Calcutta. Her primary task was to love and care for those persons nobody was prepared to look after. She had no funds and said she depended on Divine Providence. During her lifetime, Mother Teresa became the world's most recognizable symbol of selfless charity. # Christian Education Corner - Mary Karlovec

The season of Advent...a time of waiting yet a season that for many of us always seems to become a stressful time of the year! This year, I hope that you take the time each day to enjoy "the waiting." Again, this year, I will have 12 Advent bags available for the adults who would like to spend some time each day reflecting on the Advent season. There is a daily reflection journal, two Advent calendars with scriptures and one calendar for coloring each day, a prayer cube, an LED candle, and other supplies to help you along the journey. They will be available on December 3. If you would like one, there is a sign-up sheet outside the CE office. Families with children in grades 5 and younger will be receiving an Advent calendar with the traditional boxes to open to countdown the days until Christmas. Along with this is a sticker manger scene to add to each day. It is my hope that families take the time each day (even if it is only 5 minutes) to use the symbols and Bible verses to discuss as a family the Advent story.

On December 3 and 10 we will have regular Sunday School programming following young person's time in worship.

On **December 17** we invite those families who are interested to join us on a field trip to the **Botanical Gardens in Cleveland** for "FROST-An Ice Capped Garden Experience!" The cost for adults is \$26 and children 3-12 years is \$18 (if non-members of the Botanical Gardens) and \$12 adults and children \$9 (if member of the Gardens). Those under 3 are free! More information about this event can be found on the Botanical Garden website. We will leave the church at 11:30 am so bring a snack to eat as we travel to Cleveland. If your family is interested in going, reservations and fees must be turned in to me no later than December 10 so we can make our reservations. The gardens are open until 5 so you can explore as long as you want! Sunday School will be available that Sunday after young person's time as one group for those in grade 6 and below. There will be no Sunday School on December 24 or December 31.

Our youth will be painting two of the Sunday School rooms in January. If you have drop cloths, expertise in painting, rollers, paint brushes, or just want to help, the youth will be painting January 14 and January 28 during worship time. Just remember, many hands make light work!

THANK YOU to everyone who has supported the Clangy Change collection the first Sunday of each month. In 2023, the money collected has supported Community Care, the youth mission trip, the Colors+center, the Easter and Christmas homebound projects, back to school supplies for Community Care, birthday bags, youth painting project, and Lotts Creek Community School. A small monthly outreach project that has had a HUGE impact on so many lives!

Finally, as we close out 2023, I cannot THANK the CE Board enough for their hard work and support this year. They made my two months off for surgery so much easier, supported the work of Christian Education at First Congregational and continuously gave of their time and talents. A special thank you to Millie Gilly as she leaves the board this year; she truly is an asset we will miss!

#### **Advent Sundays**

The Deacons are reaching out to families to light the Advent candles this season. I thought it might be nice to refresh our memories of what the candles symbolize.

The four candles of Advent represent the Sundays of Advent, and they respectively symbolize hope, peace, joy and love. The fifth candle we light on Christmas Eve during the evening service represents the birth of Jesus; this candle, when added to the Advent wreath, is white and larger than the other candles and is placed in the center of the wreath.

Advent candle Sundays, names, and colors

- 1st Sunday of Advent: Dec. 3 Hope Prophecy Candle – purple
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent: Dec. 10 Peace –
   Bethlehem Candle purple
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent: Dec. 17 Joy Shepherd's Candle pink
- 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent: Dec. 24 Love A
   Angel's Candle purple
- Christmas Eve: Dec 24 Christ candle white

The wreath is to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us though Christ. The three purple candles represent penance, and the pink represents joy. Merry Christmas, everyone!
