### From the Pastor – Pastor Kearstin (she/her)

Welcome to May, sweet friend! This month the Christian liturgical seasons will shift and we will move from Eastertide to ordinary time. About half of the calendar year is considered "ordinary" and it's a time when we focus on the stories of the people of God. For the other half of the year (advent, Christmastide, lent, Easter), we mostly focus on the story of God as incarnate in Jesus. This move from stories about God to stories about God's people is an important one, because these narratives hold incredible richness as we explore how people across the ages have understood and related to God.

As we move into ordinary time, we'll slowly and consistently explore how folks through space and time have been in relationship with God — and how that impacts how we understand God. In this vein I wanted to share with you one of my favorite poems. Kaylin Haught's vision of God is one I resonate with deeply; her words bring me comfort and freedom to imagine a new kind of God than the one our popular culture lifts up. As you read her words, think about your idea of God: What kinds of phrases does He use? What tone does She speak in? How do They make you feel? And if you feel particularly inspired, I would be honored to chat with you about your understanding of God and how it has been carefully crafted over a lifetime!

May is a busy month for the Board of Christian Education. First up on May 5 is our **Ladies and They-dies Tea** at Miss Molly's Tea Room in Medina. Approximately 30 people will gather for a luncheon tea. If you are attending and need directions to Miss Molly's, please see me.



On Saturday, May 18 we are sponsoring a "Junk in Your Trunk" event in the church parking lot. This is like a flea market and rummage sale all rolled into one. It will be from 9 am to 2 pm. 


be made available in church closer to the event.

#### <u>Deacons' Desk</u> – Linda Matis

The Deacons have been working on updating our church membership list. This task has not been done for several years and is really needed as there are many people on the list who have not attended and/or donated to the church in quite some time, have moved away, or may have passed away and we are not aware.

As our Constitution says, "Active members are expected to be faithful to all duties essential to the Christian life; to attend regularly the services of the church; to give systematically for its support and its benevolences; to share in its organized work; and to seek diligently the spiritual welfare of the church and the winning of others to Christ. Active members who, because of their own indifference or their nonresident status, have not fulfilled the obligations of active membership for a period of two years, in spite of kindly reminders, may be transferred to inactive or non-resident membership status by action of the Board of Deacons. If a member has been on the inactive or non-resident list for more than one year and repeated efforts of the church have failed to re-establish an active relationship, his/her membership may be terminated by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Deacons."

We will be reaching out to members in question regarding their membership status so that we can keep our records up to date.

#### <u> Trustees' Turn</u> – Roy Dreger

Several years ago, back when we were getting quotes on rehabilitating the front windows, one of the gentlemen also looked at the east and west side windows. His evaluation both pleased and surprised me. He said that for windows as old as they were, they were in good enough shape that he would recommend not doing anything with them. This is still good news; however, they need to be maintained in order to they stay that way. The trustees have given the go-ahead to a painting company to paint the wood framing (the painter is also going to repair the ceiling over the organ). If any wood does need to be repaired/replaced that will be an additional cost, but not getting the work done puts the entire window in jeopardy. The trustees decided not to place this item in the capital campaign, but to do it immediately since there is noticeable weathering.

Speaking of the capital campaign, for which we are still gathering cost estimates, the elevator came up during the conversation about installing a ramp. Jon Eaton wondered if we should put a higher priority on a new elevator, as it is constantly needing work. The debate will continue as it is certainly a valid concern. In 2019 we spent \$2,100.00 fixing it. In 2020 and 2021 it needed very few repairs, but these were pandemic years and it was used very little. We spent \$830.00 repairing it in 2022, but in 2023 it required over \$8,000.00 in repairs to keep it operating. Truly something to think about.

Also, while talking capital campaign, the need for replacing the roof over the Sunday school wing came up again. This, we believe, might be covered by insurance. Jack Fitts is working with two roofing companies on this, but they seem to be dragging their feet. Companies have proven to be somewhat reluctant to provide estimates, knowing that we are looking for an estimate on work that is not going to be done right away (any work included in a capital campaign) and it is not certain that they will get the job.

As we trustees attempt to "get our ducks in a row" in regards to the capital campaign, it is a blessing to know that the congregation continues their financial support. As always, thank you!
