In the last year, through Women Who Charge, LaSheita has led programs and events that amplify the trajectory of the EV industry. One notable accomplishment was the establishment of three Level 2 charging stations at her office building, located just 6 miles south of downtown Denver. Furthermore, her advocacy extended to legislative support of a house bill that clarified rules surrounding electric vehicle charging and parking requirements.

What motivates LaSheita throughout her unwavering commitment to sustainable energy is the profound desire to lessen the impacts of climate change while addressing the inequities in the clean energy transition, specifically regarding the state's public charging network and the lack of diversity within the energy sector.

In 2024, LaSheita's focus is on workplace charging, where she aims to encourage small businesses to adopt EV infrastructure. By improving access to charging stations, LaSheita hopes to normalize sustainable transportation options and spark widespread adoption.

For LaSheita, the Sisters in Energy Awards symbolize an opportunity to inspire the next generation of African American female leaders. Her mission is to cultivate a balanced and diverse energy sector that thrives on the collective strengths and abilities of all of its members.
