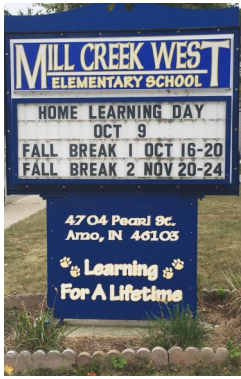

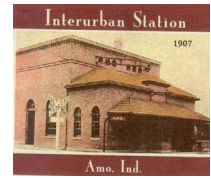

Amo's own local Food Pantry, The Storehouse, opened in October of 2017. The pantry opened in what was formerly known as the Amo Friends Meeting (aka The Trinity Center). The Friends congregation gifted their building to the Baptist folks for further use of the property to benefit of the Amo community.

To date, we have served approximately 190 people. The pantry operates on donations of volunteer service, food and monetary gifts. We welcome anyone with a heart to serve others and school groups who want to encourage community service. We provide supplemental food to help families make their food budget stretch to meet their needs. A Food Order consists of meat, canned vegetables, canned fruit, dried staples, cereal, eggs, milk, cheese, butter and some personal care items, just to name a few.

The Food Pantry DONATION DAY is the second Saturday of every month from 10 a.m. to Noon. We SERVE CLIENTS on the third Saturday of every month from 10 a.m. to Noon. was the night before Christmas, he lived all alone, in a one bedroom house made of plaster and stone. I had come down the chimney with presents to give, and to see just who in this home did live. I looked all about, a strange sight I did see, no tinsel, no presents, not even a tree.

No stocking by mantle, just boots filled with sand, and on the wall pictures of far distant lands. With medals and badges, awards of all kinds, a sobering thought came to my mind. For this house was different, so dark and so dreary, the home of a soldier, now I could see clearly.

The soldier lay sleeping, silent, alone, curled up on the floor in this one bedroom home. The face was so gentle, the room in such disorder, not how I pictured a United States soldier. Was this the hero of whom I'd just read? Curled up on a poncho, the floor for a bed?

I realized the families that I saw this night, owed their lives to these soldiers who were willing to fight. Soon round the world, the children would play, and grownups would celebrate a bright Christmas day. They all enjoyed freedom each month of the year, because of the soldiers, like the one lying here.

I couldn't help wonder how many lay alone, on a cold Christmas eve in a land far from home. The very thought brought a tear to my eye, I dropped to my knees and started to cry. The soldier awakened and I heard a rough voice, "Santa don't cry, this life is my choice;

I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more, my life is my God, my country, my corps." The soldier rolled over and soon drifted to sleep. I couldn't control it, I continued to weep. I kept watch for hours, so silent and still, and we both shivered from the cold evening's chill.

I didn't want to leave on that cold, dark, night, this guardian of honor so willing to fight. Then the soldier rolled over, with a voice soft and pure, whispered, "Carry on Santa, it's Christmas day, all is secure." One look at my watch, and I knew he was right. "Merry Christmas my friend, and to all a good night."

In the past few years we have lost most of our town senior "Icons" and role models. We think it appropriate to pay tribute to the most senior who are still blessing us!

Alice Pugh was born Alice Maurine Repp on May 28, 1923, in Reeves, Wisconsin on a dairy/grain farm to Harry & Merle Repp. Alice was the 2nd of five siblings—Norman, wife Mabel, both deceased; Larry, wife Maeona, who reside in Wisconsin; Arlene, husband Rev. Calvin Didier, who reside in Minnesota and Gene, wife Betty, who reside in Alabama.

Alice married Alton (Al) Pugh on November 14, 1942, in Inver Grove, Minnesota, while he was in WWII and on leave. Al & Alice's love produced four wonderful children: Maureen Jackson (Carl) of Amo, Darrell of California, Ginny Spillman (Tim) of Indianapolis and Suzy Robinson (Jerry is deceased) of Texas. There are 13 grandchildren, 24 great grandchildren and 14 great great grandchildren!!!

Al & Alice moved from Minnesota to Indiana in 1951 to be closer to Alice's parents who had already moved to Indiana. The family moved to Amo in 1953 because they were attending the First Baptist Church



of Amo. This picture was taken in 1955 and hangs on Alice's wall where she resides.

Alice has been a gifted piano player and piano teacher; she was age 90 when she taught her last student who was age 75!! She was also an accomplished accordionist until she was not able to hold the accordion. Alice's hobbies include MUSIC (no surprise here!), flowers, birds (watching and feeding). Her memberships included First Baptist Church of Amo, Faith Baptist, Coterie Club, Amo Volunteer Fire Department Wives' Association, VBS Piano Player for 40 years, Amo Centennial Bonnet Club.

Alice's husband, Al, was a member of the Amo Volunteer Fire Department for almost 50 years.

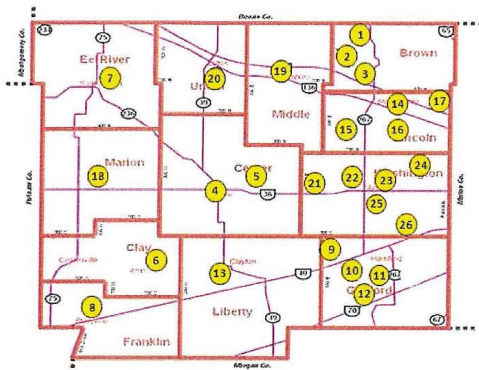
