### VANDALIA TRAIL — Please use the Trail!

Hendricks County Parks & Recreation has announced that eastern expansion of the Vandalia Trail will begin in 2023. With support from the Hendricks County American Rescue Plan Act selection committee, Hendricks County Commissioners, and the Hendricks County Council, and collaboration with the Town of Clayton, they will build an asphalt trail about 2 miles long going west from Clayton's Lambert Park. This phase will reach about half the distance to the Town of Amo. The goal is to begin construction next spring/summer.

In the meantime, Hendricks County Parks' maintenance crew is doing a great job keeping the existing Vandalia Trail in shape this summer, so we hope you'll have a chance to get out and enjoy it. If you would like to bike the trail with others, you are very welcome to join the Friends of the Vandalia Trail's bi-weekly rides listed below.



### LOOKING BACK IN TIME - JULY

## Amo Interurban Station Begins A New Life



The story began when a station opened in the Clay Township—village of Amo, where passengers could await the interurban, a new means of mass transportation. Then, in the 1940's it became the office for a grain elevator, where farmers waited around a table, swapping stories and eating peanuts out of a wooden barrel. Now, the brick building awaits another transformation, into a library and museum to tell the story of the town and of early 20th century transportation.

On Sunday, July 4, exactly 97 years to the day since the station officially opened, a groundbreaking took place to mark the beginning of the old interurban station's restoration. The project began in 1999 when the Amo Grain Elevator closed. After the owner searched unsuccessfully for a buyer who would preserve the station building, the Amo Town Council bought the building rather than see it torn down.

Interested citizens formed a group called R.A.I.L.S. (Restore the Amo Interurban into a Library Society). The goal of the group was to provide books, computers and office supplies for the completed project. For the physical restoration, a state grant was sought Tina Henderson, grant coordinator for the project, explained that it took two years to secure a grant from the Indiana Department of Commerce's Community Focus Fund. During that time, Henderson said that the little town of 400 "showed more will, drive and 'can't tell us no' attitude" than any other town she knew.

A crowd gathered around the east side of the building to witness the ceremony officially beginning the restoration. Postmaster Dennis Watson had arranged with the U.S. Post Office for a special commemorative cancellation to mark the occasion. Many people purchased postcards bearing the image of the station and had them stamped and postmarked.

Rich Moreland of Stocker Construction estimated that the renovation would take about 90 days. Mike Stevens, of Danville, will be the general superintendent of the project. Work will include a new roof, tuckpointing and cleaning the brick, repairing and restoring windows, a new deck for the front porch and new electrical and plumbing systems. Moreland said his company will donate some of their services to move the project along. They will also provide a time-line video, showing the progress of the work. Cameron Plumbing will donate \$8000 in services toward the project. Reid Haney has donated \$15,000 in time and labor in demolishing parts of the former grain elevator.

have brought the project to this point, members of the town board, the grant coordinator and a representative from the construction company donned hard hats and all turned a symbolic shovelful of dirt, ending the ceremony. Rich Moreland of Stocker Construction walked over to his young daughter, who said, "Daddy, are you finished now?" "No," he replied "We're just getting started." After 97 years, the Amo interurban station is not finished. It's just getting started as well.

After remarks about the history of the building and the efforts that
