Building Tomorrow's Ontario: The Importance of Skilled Immigration in the **Construction Industry**

In the evolving landscape of Ontario's construction sector, where innovation meets infrastructure, the future is intricately tied to one vital resource: skilled immigrant workers. As the province navigates demographic shifts, technological advancements, and economic imperatives, the role of skilled immigration in shaping the future of Ontario's construction industry has never been more pronounced. With an eye towards progress and prosperity, Ontario must embrace skilled immigration as a cornerstone of its workforce strategy, unlocking new opportunities for growth, innovation, and sustainability. Ontario's government wants to build 1.5 million homes over the next decade, but says it will need 100,000 more workers to carry that out.

Ontario's construction industry stands at a crossroads, marked by a growing demand for specialized skills amidst a backdrop of demographic change. The retirement of seasoned craftsmen, coupled with a reluctance among younger generations to pursue careers in the trades, has created a looming shortage of skilled laborers. However, amidst this challenge lies a significant opportunity: skilled immigrant

Skilled immigrants bring a wealth of expertise, experience, and diversity to Ontario's construction industry, enriching the sector in various ways. Their technical proficiency, cultural insights, and global perspectives enhance productivity, stimulate innovation, and drive continuous improvement within construction teams. As Ontario looks to the future, it must recognize the invaluable contributions that skilled immigrants can make in addressing labour shortages, driving economic growth, and building a more resilient and inclusive construction industry.

My immigration firm specializes in construction based applications for companies seeking to hire skilled workers. The most popular application which is typically used to hire foreign workers is called the LMIA (Labour Market Impact Assessment). An LMIA, is a process of which a company wants to seek a temporary foreign worker through the labour market. This decision is issued by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) and it assesses the impact of hiring a foreign worker on the Canadian labour

market. The assessment ensures that hiring a foreign worker will not negatively affect Canadian workers and that there are no Canadians available to fill the job position.

However, issues still exist in this program designed to help fill a labour gap and Ontario's construction industry requires proactive measures and strategic initiatives. Ontario must streamline immigration processes, reduce barriers to entry, and provide comprehensive support services to facilitate the integration of skilled immigrants into the construction labour force. The federal and provincial governments must work together to ensure that demands are made for the future of skilled workers coming to the province of Ontario. Unfortunately, with the current political landscape, the Ontario government is not allocated enough of the skilled tradesmen via immigration streams to reduce processing times and volume of workers. By recognizing foreign credentials, offering language training, and promoting diversity initiatives, the province can create a welcoming and inclusive environment that attracts and retains top talent from around the world.


I have personally spoken in union town halls and held seminar sessions with construction workers on the pathway to legalize their status in Canada and the prospect of working for Canadian construction companies. The opportunities are endless for skilled workers to seek job opportunities in the trades sector in Ontario, and one quick glance on the national employment website jobbank.gc.ca would reveal the true depth of companies seeking true talent in the trades industry.

In conclusion, the future of Ontario's construction industry is intrinsically linked to skilled immigration. As the province strives to meet the challenges of a rapidly changing world, it must embrace skilled immigration as a strategic imperative, unlocking new opportunities for growth, innovation, and prosperity. Employers should really be informed for the legal processing of foreign workers into the labour force and unions should ensure that all union working members are legally authorized to work in Canada and promote strong ties to immigration and recruitment firms that specialize in seeking and legalizing skilled tradesmen. By harnessing the talents and contributions of skilled immigrant workers, Ontario can build a brighter, more inclusive future for all stakeholders involved in the construction industry.

- There were 588,000 people employed in the Ontario construction industry, comprising 7.6% of Ontario's workforce in 2022.
- The construction industry contributed \$57 billion (7.4%) to Ontario's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2022. Compared to the previous year, GDP increased by \$26 billion (3.6%).
- Ontario's construction industry is concentrated in the Toronto economic region (ER), which accounts for 41.3% of total provincial construction employment.

A Global Approach to Fighting Poverty: How Canada Can Lead the Charge

Every April, finance ministers, central bank governors, development experts, private sector executives, civil society representatives, parliamentarians and academics gather in Washington for the annual Spring Meetings of the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund. On the margins of this annual meeting is the Global Parliamentary Forum, hosted by the Parliamentary Network on the World Bank and IMF, which serves as a neutral platform for parliamentarians from member countries to enhance both accountability and transparency within development cooperation.

As the Chair of the Parliamentary Network's Canadian chapter, I had the privilege of traveling to Washington earlier this month to attend the two-day Forum and join hundreds of parliamentary colleagues from around the world, including my Canadian colleague Senator Rosa Galvez, a climate change expert.

Some of the important global issues we addressed during our meetings included properly regulating the risks and opportunities of artificial intelligence through a global lens, accelerating climate solutions in a fragile world, and leveraging gender strategies to advance gender equality.

At the request of the Network's chair, Liam Byrne, a British Member of Parliament, I had the honour of moderating a panel entitled "Debt and Growth: Investing in the International Development Association (IDA) and the Poverty Reduction and Growth Trust." We had a stellar lineup of speakers from both civil society and international legislatures, including the Speaker of the Senate of Burundi.

As the representative of a country that benefits from the IDA, the Speaker spoke highly of the Association and the need for global partners to increase investments and funding opportunities for lower-income countries so they may continue to invest in their future, improve the lives of their citizens, and create more prosperous communities in their respective nations.

Our panel generated much interest from the audience. Like Burundi, legislators from other African countries also urged wealthy countries to increase its international aid commitments. The IDA, thanks to its concessional loans and grants and its debt relief initiatives, is widely considered as the single largest source of donor funds for basic social services in many countries.

In fact, since its creation in 1960, the IDA has provided \$533 billion to 115 countries. More recently, annual commitments have increased steadily to about \$36 billion a year. If you want proof that the Association is accomplishing its objectives, look no further than the IDA's so-called graduation list. Three dozen countries, who have historically benefited

from the IDA, are no longer eligible because they have either successfully reduced its poverty rate, improved its ability to borrow credit, or are better equipped to manage its financial ressources.

During our panel, it was inspiring to hear how the money from international donor countries like Canada



is contributing to alleviating poverty around the world. We heard, loud and clear, the call to action to further expand our commitments to help encourage economic growth and build resilience in some of the world's most vulnerable countries. Today, a total of 75 countries are eligible to receive IDA resources.

Canada, as a wealthy nation and industrialized economy, is in a privileged position. The situation may not be perfect at home, but we are also uniquely positioned to invest in the prosperity of lower-income countries. It's the right and decent thing to do.

Just last week, in its spring budget, the federal government reiterated its commitment to making more money available to developing countries so that they can make the critical investments they need to support their people. In fact, in late 2023, Canada generously committed an additional \$1.3 billion to the IMF's Poverty Reduction and Growth Trust special drawing rights reserve.

I also think Canada has more to offer. Beyond foreign aid, loans and grants, Canadian entrepreneurs have the experience and know-how to help grow the economy of communities around the world and raise the standards of living for the most vulnerable and marginalized in our society.

I've always said that wealth is created by the entrepreneur. Canada must be more proactive in exporting our Canadian experts, entrepreneurs, and professionals to help local entrepreneurs acquire the necessary tools to start a business, create local jobs, and generate wealth and prosperity at the community level. Would-be entrepreneurs in developing countries and remote places need incentives, certainty, and resources to thrive. Canadian expertise is one such resource that could go a long way in alleviating poverty in some of the most troubled corners of the world.

Being in Washington last week reminded me of the impact and influence Canada continues to have in helping reduce poverty around the world. We are viewed as a generous country with its heart on its sleeve, whose contributions, both in terms of dollars and goods and services, are needed more than ever, and truly appreciate.

June Italian Heritage Month Did you Know?

Enrico Caruso used to sing Neapolitan songs to Italian newcomers at Ellis Island from 1918 until 1920. He sometimes was paid to perform at Ellis Island, yet he primarily did it as donations to his paisani, as usav trans

in culturale ITALIANO that's how much he truly cherished his Italian brothers and sisters. This

amazing operatic tenor was born

on February 25, 1873 in Napoli, Italia. He sang to great acclaim at the major opera houses of Europe and in the U.S. His padre was originally from Piedimonte d'Alife, which is now called Piedimonte Matese, in the Province of Caserta, located in Campania. Caruso was encouraged to pursue a career in music by his mother, who died in 1888. His mother was fully Neapolitan, from the city and province of Napoli. As a youngster, to raise money for his family, he found work as a street singer in Napoli and

performed at cafes. At the age of 18, he used the fees he had earned by singing at an Italian resort to buy his first pair of new shoes. On March 15, 1895, at the age of 22, Caruso made his professional stage debut at the Teatro Nuovo in Napoli in the now-forgotten opera, L'Amico Francesco, by the amateur composer Mario Morelli. In 1903, Caruso made his debut with the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. Al Capone saw Caruso perform a few times and always listened to his music. Despite the fact that Capone was a tough hoodlum, he often cried while watching him perform or hearing Caruso's powerful voice. When asked why he was crying, Capone would say that Caruso reminded him of his madre Teresina Capone, who tried to always stir Capone in the right direction. Caruso passed away on August 2, 1921. He was only 48.



Michelangelo Buonarotti was only 23 years old when he created the famous Pietà. A French cardinal commissioned the work and it took Michelangelo only two vears to complete (1498-1500). It was made from a single block of Carrara marble and it"s the only sculpture the artist ever signed.
